MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

The recent decision by the Supreme Court requiring electronic recording of juveniles and the Criminal Justice Reforms act mandating recording of adults by January 1, 2007 has presented significant challenges for law enforcement agencies. In an effort to help agencies meet these requirements I asked the Training and Standards Bureau to analyze best practices for electronic recording and provide training.

In December, four introductory seminars conducted by the Department of Justice enrolled nearly 800 participants. In February and March, three "strategies for taped interviews" seminars drew nearly 350 enrollments. An additional seminar will be conducted at the West Allis Police Department.

Information in support of the seminars is available on WILENET at www.wilenet.org. Click on the links DOJ, Training and Standards, and Electronic Recording Best Practices. There you will find a model policy draft; recommendations for electronic recording of custodial interviewing; PowerPoint aids; admissibility and preservation issues for digital audio files; and a compendium of electronic recording current practices and recommendations.

DOJ is urging law enforcement to follow closely developments of best practices in the improvement of investigation techniques, and to employ resources that are readily available on WILENET. The Department of Justice is committed to prompt, statewide dissemination of best practice information for your review, and to supporting the employment of best practices with comprehensive training and information.

Please feel free to contact me or my staff at DOJ whenever we can be of assistance in this, or any other, law enforcement matter.

CHANGES IN THE DOMESTIC ABUSE LAW

Recently the legislature enacted 2005 ACT 104, which became effective on April 1, 2006. This act makes some important changes in the domestic abuse statute- 968.075 Wis Stats. The key changes are as follows:

- 1) Arrest in a domestic abuse incident is mandatory if an officer has probable cause that a person has violated one of the following:
 - A) a domestic abuse restraining order or injunction
 - B) a child abuse restraining order or injunction
 - C) A harassment restraining order or injunction
 - D) a foreign protection order, OR
 - E) the officer has a reasonable basis for believing that continued domestic abuse against the alleged victim is likely and/or there is evidence of physical injury to the alleged victim. **NOTE:** This last mandatory arrest situation is fairly broad and therefore absent some really compelling circumstances to the contrary an officer would be prudent to view every incident for which he has probable cause of a violation in a domestic abuse context as a mandatory arrest situation.
- 2) The term "primary physical aggressor" has been changed to "predominant aggressor". This change means that the predominant aggressor is

the most significant and not necessarily the first aggressor in a domestic abuse incident. In determining who is the predominant aggressor the law enforcement officer should consider the history of domestic abuse between the parties, any statements made by witnesses, the relative degree of injury inflicted on the parties, the extent to which each person present appears to fear any party, whether any party is threatening or has threatened causing future harm, and whether either person acted in self-defense or in defense of any other person.

- 3) The release of the arrested predominant aggressor is *not* permitted until the person posts bail or appears before a judge or commissioner for an initial appearance.
- 4) The issuance of a misdemeanor citation for a domestic abuse crime meeting the requirements for a mandatory arrest is prohibited.
- 5) Officers are strongly discouraged but not absolutely prohibited from arresting more than one party in a domestic abuse incident.
- 6) All law enforcement agencies must have policies which reflect these changes as well as other information specifically described in the new legislation.

Bottom Line:

Remember you need probable cause before you can arrest anybody. When you have a situation where it appears that more than one party are involved in the abuse then arrest the one you determine to be the predominant aggressor using the new factors to consider in that analysis. Only when it is an absolute even deal should you consider arresting both parties. When you do make an arrest do not issue a citation but rather take the subject into custody and they should not be released until they post bail and of course sign a no contact form. Naturally you should check with your District Attorney's office to get their perspective as to the changes in the domestic abuse statute.

WPPA TO HOST LAW ENFORCEMENT WEEK BREAKFAST

The Wisconsin Professional Police Association (WPPA) will host a pancake and sausage breakfast on Friday, May 19, during National Police Week, to recognize all active and retired law enforcement officers. National Police Week is May 14-20, and is a prelude to the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Memorial Ceremony, which will be held Friday, May 19, at the State Capitol.

The breakfast will be at the Olin Park Pavilion before the vehicle procession to the State Capitol to honor Wisconsin's fallen officers. We will begin serving at 7:00 a.m., and we invite everyone to attend.

A TOOL TO SOLVE ARSON CASES

The Wisconsin Arson Hotline is a tool for law enforcement and fire service investigators to use when they encounter suspicious fires. The Hotline is funded by the Wisconsin Arson Insurance Council (WAIC). WAIC is a group of insurance agency, fire department, and police department personnel who have a common interest in solving arson crimes. The Arson Hotline is staffed by the Wisconsin Division of Criminal Investigation's Arson Bureau, and available 24/7. Callers can remain anonymous, and are eligible for awards of up to \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest of a suspect.

Using the Hotline is simple: if your agency is investigating a suspicious fire, you may publicize the Arson Hotline number, and any information received by DCI will be promptly forwarded to your agency. If you decide the information was worthy of an award, you simply let WAIC know using a short form, and ask that they give the caller money.

WAIC has printed large eye-catching signs in English and Spanish which are free for the asking. These signs are for posting at the fire scene, such as on the side of the house which was damaged. If you would like a supply of these free signs, simply email: kellycs@doj.state.wi.us and they will be shipped to you or dropped off by one of the state fire marshals.

FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through February 2006: Five law enforcement officers were reported feloniously killed. During the same time period in 2005, nine officers were slain. Four deaths occurred in the west and one in the south. Two officers were killed performing traffic stops, two were answering disturbance calls (one being domestic disturbance call), and one officer was attempting other arrests. Firearms were used in all five killings (four handguns and one rifle). There have been five separate incidents in which these five officers have been slain. All incidents were cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Nine law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2005, five officers were accidentally killed. Five deaths occurred in the Midwest, three in the south, and one in Puerto Rico. Of the nine officers killed, seven were killed in automobile accidents and two were struck by vehicles.

Incident Summaries

Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVPD), Nevada, Veteran Sergeant, aged 37, with approximately 15 years law enforcement experience was fatally shot on 02/01/2006. At about 1 p.m., LVPD officers responded to numerous 911 calls regarding violent domestic disturbance in southwest region of Las Vegas valley. Responding uniformed officers initially encountered victim and victim's mother in front of residence. Victim had been allegedly beaten with stick by subject in front yard of residence and subject had since retreated inside residence. As Sergeant and other officers approached front door to residence, subject immediately opened fire on officers with 7.62 millimeter (MAC-90) rifle. Sergeant was first officer to enter residence and was struck in chest and fell back out of residence. Subject continued to fire at LVPD officers, pinning them down. Also, subject proceeded to intentionally shoot incapacitated victim Sergeant in head, fatally injuring him. When additional officer responded to "officer needs assistance" call, he too was fired upon by subject. During altercation with subject, officer received gunshot wound to leg. Eventually subject was fatally shot by officers returning fire.

Gassville Police Department, Arkansas, Veteran Patrol Officer, aged 63, with over 27 years law enforcement experience was fatally shot on 02/04/2006. At approximately 2:30 p.m., Patrol Officer conducted traffic stop in parking lot of local motel. As Officer approached driver's door of

subject vehicle, driver fired three shots from handgun. Two rounds struck Victim Officer in head, fatally wounding him. Incident was observed by one witness, who immediately called 911. Witness provided descriptions of vehicle, occupants of vehicle, and license plate. Short time after incident, Baxter County Sheriff's deputies located subject vehicle and began pursuit. After 16-mile pursuit, spike strip was deployed causing two flat tires on subject vehicle. Subject lost control of vehicle and came to stop. Subject turned and shot his passenger and then began firing towards law enforcement officers. Officers returned fire, wounding subject in head. Subject was transported to hospital where he succumbed to injuries on 02/05/2006.

California Highway Patrol, California, Veteran Patrol Officer, with nearly five years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 02/17/2006. At approximately 4:40 a.m., Patrol Officer effected traffic stop. Witness driving by traffic stop observed flash and saw Victim Officer fall to ground. Witness returned to scene and reported incident to law enforcement. Victim Officer was found dead from gunshot wound to head with vehicle registration slip clutched in hand. Registered owner of subject vehicle, and her brother, both surrendered to Stockton Police Department but denied involvement in shooting. Follow-up investigation and evidence identified brother as person who shot and killed Victim Officer. He has been arrested and indicted for murder.

Colorado Springs Police Department (CSPD), Colorado, Detective, with over three years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 02/22/2006. CSPD received tip that fugitive wanted for attempting to murder his sister in December 2005 was at residence. At approximately 10:40 a.m., Detective, conducting surveillance regarding tip, radioed CSPD believing he had located subject and requested backup. At about 10:44 a.m., CSPD dispatch received several calls reporting shooting in area. Detective's backup arrived at approximately 10:46 a.m., finding Victim Detective laying on street with handcuffs in his hand. Victim was transported to hospital but attempts to resuscitate Detective failed. Local, county, state, and federal authorities began manhunt for subject covering a one-mile radius. Agents from FBI and ATF located subject in cabin of abandoned campground. Subject was arrested without incident and charged with murder, attempted first degree murder regarding his sister, and parole violation. Subject had previous felony convictions for trespassing and attempted robbery, which also made him felon in possession of firearm. Subsequent execution of search warrant of cabin resulted in recovery of Ruger Redhawk .44 magnum revolver, believed to be weapon used to murder Victim Detective, with two spent casings and

four live rounds in cylinder. Further investigation indicated Detective attempted to arrest subject who was sitting on bus stop bench. Detective apparently approached subject, identified himself, and placed subject in arm-bar hold. While Detective was standing subject up, subject retrieved revolver from waist line, reached around and shot Victim Detective in head.

New Hartford Police Department (NHPD), New York, Veteran Patrol Officer, with six years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 02/27/2006. At approximately 8:17 p.m., silent alarm was triggered at County 911 Center from local jewelry store. Officers from NHPD responded and car chase ensued leading officers to nearby town. Subject vehicle crashed into gas pumps located in front of small market and two individuals exited. One subject was subdued by officers with other

subject fleeing towards adjacent wooded area. Upon reaching tree line, subject turned and fired .40-caliber handgun at pursuing officer. Officer was fatally struck in upper chest. Victim Officer was transported to hospital where he was pronounced dead. Fleeing subject entered wooded area, carjacked tow truck, and forced driver of tow truck to drive to Pennsylvania where subject was dropped off. On 02/28/2006, subject was fatally shot by members of Philadelphia U.S. Marshals Fugitive Task Force.
