MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

Deputy Attorney General Daniel Bach recently sent a letter to all Law Enforcement Agencies and District Attorneys providing an update on the management of the DNA evidence caseload at the Wisconsin Department of Justice Crime Laboratories. Included was information about how those requesting the services of the lab can accomplish this in the most efficient ways possible.

In Wisconsin and across the nation, the demand for processing of DNA evidence continues to grow. It is clear that the ability to examine microscopic samples of biological material is a tremendous crime solution tool. As such, the requests for DNA testing continue to increase. While we saw a slow but steady increase in DNA submissions from 1997 to 2004, a huge increase of almost 60 percent was seen in the submissions for 2005. This sudden increase in demand doesn't appear to be an anomaly. The rate of submissions in the first several months of this year indicates a predicted 18 percent increase for the year 2006.

In addition to the increase in referrals of cases overall, we are also seeing an increase in the number of pieces of evidence that are submitted with each case. Currently we are receiving cases with over 100 items to test, whereas prior to DNA testing, that same case ordinarily would include only 30 or so items.

The Department is taking steps to improve processing time. In the last state budget period I succeeded in receiving approval for another four DNA positions at the Crime Laboratories. Since the training requirements for a DNA analyst are significant and time intensive, the new hires are just beginning to work cases within the labs.

I also wanted to ensure that we were using existing staff as effectively and efficiently as possible, and to that end last fall we partnered with Fox Valley Technical Institute to hire an outside firm to conduct a reengineering study of the DNA operation. Quality Forensics of Minnesota completed the study and many of the recommendations either have been implemented or are planned for the next budget period.

We are also working to validate a robotics system at both the Madison and Milwaukee Labs, and this equipment should be operational by the fall of this year. Once operational, this system should increase the number of cases that we can work.

The volume of cases that we are receiving requires that we prioritize testing to provide the best service that we can with existing resources. We would like to work with you to ensure that the most important or probative evidence is worked on each case. By judiciously narrowing the number of samples that we work on a case, we will have more time and resources to work additional cases.

Also, we work those cases that have a scheduled trial date as a priority at the Lab. We would appreciate it if you would provide us notification as soon as a trial date is established. It is our intent to complete testing prior to that date to avoid rescheduling the case, and to that end we would prefer an eight week notice whenever possible. Equally important is notification that a case is resolved so that we can shift analyst resources to other critical areas.

Please contact the Lab when a trial date is established, or if the case is resolved and testing is not required, so that we are aware of the status of each case. Notification may be made by e-mail with the case information, your telephone number and the scheduled trial date to Director Jerry Geurts, Madison Laboratory (geurtsja@doj.state.wi.us) or Director Michael Camp, Milwaukee Laboratory (campmj@doj.state.wi.us).

United States v. Grubbs **Decided by the United States Supreme Court-** **3/21/06**

Introduction:

This case involved the constitutionality of anticipatory search warrants. These are warrants that are issued but can not be executed unless the events predicted in the affidavit supporting the warrant come to place. The United States Supreme Court held that these kinds of warrants are constitutional.

Facts:

An affidavit for a search warrant for the defendant's house explained that the warrant should not be executed until a parcel containing a videotape of child pornography, which the defendant had ordered from an undercover postal inspector, was received and physically taken into the residence. The affidavit also described the residence and the items to be seized.

After the package was delivered the warrant was executed and the defendant was given a copy of the warrant. The copy of the warrant given to the defendant did not have the supporting affidavit which specified the event which must occur for the warrant to be triggered. The defendant then admitted that he ordered the videotape and was consequently arrested.

Defendant's Argument:

The defendant moved to suppress the seized videotape evidence arguing that the warrant was invalid because it failed to list the triggering condition.

The State's Position:

The state argued that the warrant was sufficient even absent the supporting affidavit as the warrant must just show the place to be searched and probable cause that the items to be searched for are there. The state continued to argue that the particularity requirement for search warrants does not require the inclusion of the conditions precedent to execution of the warrant.

The Court Holding:

The Supreme Court of the United States agreed with the state and denied the defendant's motion to suppress the videotape evidence. First the Court reviewed the laws relevant to anticipatory search warrants and reaffirmed that such warrants are constitutional. The Court reasoned that when an anticipatory search warrant is issued, the fact that the contraband is not presently at the place described is immaterial, so long as there is probable cause to believe it will be there when the warrant is executed. Anticipatory warrants to be legal require, 1) that it is now probable that 2) contraband will be present on the described premises, 3) when the warrant is executed. The Court found that those conditions were met in this case. As to the issue of the warrant given to the defendant making no mention of the triggering event the Court held found that it was not fatal since the warrant specifically contained the probable cause that contraband would be found at a particular place.

Note: The bottom line of this case is the continued validation of anticipatory warrants. However, even though the court found that the copy of the warrant given to the defendant need not contain the affidavit describing the triggering event it is best practice to so include it so as to avoid any disputes down the line.

ARREST OF FOREIGN NATIONALS

Imagine you are in a foreign country and arrested. Would you know what your rights are under that country's laws? Will you be allowed to contact your family? Few people would know what to do in such a situation or know that you have the right to have our embassy notified of the fact of you have been arrested.

The same is true for foreign nationals arrested here in the United States. When you arrest a foreign national, you may be required to notify the government of that person's arrest whether the arrested person requests it or not. Some countries require you to notify the embassy/consul of an arrest. For others, notification is required if the arrested subject requests it.

Law enforcement should be aware of international law in this area, and contact the US Department of State or their legal counsel for detailed information on this subject. The State Department has made information about this topic available on their website, <http://travel.state.gov/law>, see the consular notification and access link on the menu. Training materials, including manual, video, and pocket cards for officers are also available from the State Department.



FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through June 2006: Twenty law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2005, 30 officers were slain. Ten deaths occurred in the south, five in the west, three in the northeast, and two in the midwest. Of the 20 officers slain, five were answering disturbance calls (three being domestic disturbance calls), four were answering robbery calls, three were performing traffic stops, three were attempting other arrests, two were ambushed, one was involved in drug-related matter, one was slain in tactical situation, and one officer was investigating suspicious persons or circumstances. Firearms were used in all 20 killings (14 handguns, four rifles, one shotgun, and one firearm type not reported). Nine officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 19 separate incidents in which these 20 officers have been slain. Eighteen of the 19 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Thirty law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2005, 22 officers were accidentally killed. Ten deaths occurred in the south, ten in the midwest, six in the west, three in the northeast, and one in Puerto Rico. Of the 30 officers, 17 were killed in automobile accidents, five were struck by vehicles, three were killed in motorcycle accidents, three were accidentally shot, and two were killed in aircraft accident.

Incident Summaries

Smith County Constable's Office, Tyler, Texas, Veteran Constable, aged 45, with over 20 years law enforcement experience was fatally shot on 06/07/2006. At approximately 11 a.m., Smith County Sheriff's Department received 911 domestic disturbance call. Caller advised she had been beaten by spouse and spouse was now threatening to kill her, himself, and any law enforcement responding to her 911 call. (Caller failed to advise 911 operator that she was calling from neighbor's residence and not her own.) Two Smith County Sheriff's deputies were dispatched to location. Upon arrival, deputies proceeded to neighbor's house, which they believed to be scene of domestic violence. After speaking with neighbor and realizing confusion, deputies decided to walk to subject's residence in attempt to speak with subject. As deputies were making their way to front of subject's residence and walking up one side of house, they turned corner to front of house when they observed barrel of rifle sticking out front window of residence. Rifle barrel was pointing down street as if it was targeting something. Deputies then noticed Smith County constable, who was responding to deputies call for backup, driving his marked vehicle toward residence. Constable stopped his car about 60 yards from subject residence, placing it in defensive position with engine block positioned for cover. While constable was departing vehicle, deputies began yelling for constable to take cover, that subject was targeting him. Hearing warning from deputies, constable retrieved M-4 rifle and, using engine as cover, fired

three rounds at front of residence where subject was armed with rifle. After firing, constable took cover and moved to rear of his vehicle. It was there that subject, using .30-06 rifle mounted with scope, fired one shot and fatally struck constable in head, killing him instantly. Shortly thereafter, third Smith County Sheriff's deputy responded to scene and, after exiting his vehicle in attempt to assist victim constable, was shot three times by subject. Despite injuries to his arm, leg, and ankle, victim deputy was able to gain cover until additional help arrived. Using department's armored personnel carrier, both victims were extracted from scene by Smith County Sheriff's SWAT team. Smith County Sheriff's SWAT team and Tyler Police SWAT team assumed positions around subject's residence; police negotiators began talking with subject. Approximately two hours later, subject exited residence holding rifle in offensive manner and approached officers. Subject was then shot and killed by police sniper. Injured victim deputy is recovering from injuries in local hospital and is expected to make complete recovery.

St. John the Baptist Parish Sheriff's Office (SJBPSO), Louisiana, Veteran Captain, aged 40, with 14 years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot at approximately 1:45 a.m. on 06/16/2006. Captain was responding to assist other officers after receiving notification that SJBPSO detective had been shot in leg during vehicle stop on Interstate in Laplace, Louisiana. Injured detective indicated two subjects fled scene and pursuit was initiated. Subject vehicle traveled to Manchac, Louisiana, and then reversed direction and returned to Laplace, Louisiana, where it was lost in residential neighborhood. Perimeter was set up and responding units attempted to locate subject vehicle. Captain was en route when call was received regarding suspicious vehicle in adjoining neighborhood. It is believed captain exited his patrol vehicle armed with AR-15 rifle, possibly lured out by one subject. Captain was shot from behind three times with 9-millimeter handgun, which had been reported stolen from Harris County, Texas. Victim captain was fatally shot once in shoulder, once in hip, and once in abdomen. Shortly thereafter, witness

called to report someone dragging body in area where victim captain was found. Subjects then stole victim captain's vehicle along with his rifle. Subjects traveled to Kenner, Louisiana, where they dumped vehicle, committed home invasion, and obtained another vehicle. This vehicle was pursued to River Ridge, Louisiana, where it crashed. One subject was arrested nearby crash site and other subject broke into nearby residence and held occupant hostage. Hostage was released several hours later and subject surrendered after negotiations began. One subject has been charged with three counts of second degree kidnapping, two counts of armed robbery, and five counts of possession of weapon by convicted felon. Other subject has been charged with three counts of second degree kidnapping and two counts of armed robbery. It is believed both subjects will be charged with one count of murder and one count of attempted murder.

Dekalb County Police Department, Georgia, Veteran Patrol Officer, aged 33, with over 12 years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 06/29/2006 while assigned to high profile enforcement duty. At approximately 7 p.m., officer observed two suspicious vehicles possibly conducting drug transaction. Officer attempted to stop one vehicle but driver refused to pull over. Car eventually stopped in apartment complex where driver jumped out of vehicle and ran. Subject stopped behind one apartment building and waited on police officers. As they approached, subject, armed with 9-millimeter and 38 Taurus handguns, began firing. Victim officer engaged in gunfire with subject and was struck twice; one bullet lodged in upper chest of Level III soft body armor and fatal shot, delivered by 9-millimeter, entered left shoulder and exited out right side of victim officer's neck. Second officer returned gunfire and killed subject.

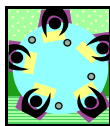
