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MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague-

The last eight years have gone extremely fast, yet much has been accomplished. These milestones would have been nearly impossible without the strong partnerships forged between all of you—our law enforcement partners—and the many dedicated criminal justice professionals at the Department of Justice (DOJ). As I prepare to leave the office of Attorney General, I am proud to share some of these more recent achievements with you.

Law enforcement training standards received a much needed boost with the passage of 2013 Wisconsin Act 214, which provided the Law Enforcement Standards Board (LESB) the ability to increase recruit training hours. This allowed for the inclusion of long overdue curricula in the areas of active shooter, crisis intervention, as well as officer fitness and wellness, to name a few. Domestic violence and sexual assault training was increased dramatically across the state. A command college was successfully implemented, bringing together law enforcement leaders across the state. To enhance competencies and safety, a firearms standard was established and field auditors were added to the training team.

Crime laboratory operations have become much more expedient while adding new technologies and advancements. DNA analysis turnaround times have improved dramatically. Consider this: back in 2007, the Lab had pending 2,000 cases with a 200-day turnaround time; today, the Lab has pending 500 cases and a 35-day turnaround time. At the same time, Wisconsin has added familial testing to its range of services. Only nine other states offer such technology, which has seen immediate success with the identification and arrest of a serial sexual assault suspect. Crime scene response capabilities were expanded across the state as well. Our crime laboratory system received international accreditation and is leading the field.

We're also leading by example with our state's efforts to better address the needs of crime victims. The Attorney General's Statewide Sexual Assault Response Team (AG's SART) has developed a consent form and procedure for victims of sexual assault to receive a medical forensic exam with the collection of evidence but to have the evidence stored at the State Crime Laboratory for up to six years while deciding whether to engage the services of law enforcement investigation. This new consent form allows victims time to determine how they wish to proceed while still allowing for the collection of evidence in a timely manner.

As you may know, the DOJ also added an Assistant Attorney General in the Training and Standards Bureau. Assistant Attorney General Miriam Falk -- the Violence Against Women Law Enforcement Trainer -- serves to help the DOJ educate law enforcement and to be a resource for you as your departments address domestic violence, sexual assault and other sensitive crimes in your communities. Throughout my tenure, the DOJ's mission has been to serve as an "exist to assist" agency; this is one more example of our ongoing commitment to all of you.

Looking forward, we have added a justice information and analysis function to the DOJ. This team will utilize scientific research processes to objectively evaluate and assess criminal justice programs, data, and grant awards. Further, both summary and incident-based crime reporting mechanisms are being improved to increase timeliness in reporting while providing pertinent analysis to our law enforcement partners.


In 2011, concealed carry licensing was implemented with precision by our crime information bureau personnel. Today, more than 240,000 Wisconsinites have concealed carry licenses. Information technology has been infused across our law enforcement record management systems resulting in greater functionality, such as driver's license photo access, real-time corrections data, automated license plate reader downloads, mugshot and photo entries, and automated transfer of mental health records. A large-scale enhancement of our statewide data center is nearing completion and will provide real-time redundancy across our law enforcement networks. Work continues with our partners as we strive to achieve statewide communications interoperability.

When I took office in January of 2007, the statewide ICAC Task Force had 23 affiliates. Today, we're a national leader in targeting child predators, and we continue to expand our reach with more than 215 affiliates. I thank you for your unwavering commitment to this most important mission of protecting our children.

And we continue to explore ways to protect the most vulnerable among us, whether it is providing training and resources to more effectively investigate and prosecute cases of human trafficking or developing new tools to protect our seniors, such as the recently introduced Silver Alert program. With our "Fly Effect" heroin prevention public awareness campaign, more Wisconsinites better understand how heroin is affecting our great state and how they can help fight this scourge. We still, however, face challenges ahead.

It has been a tremendous honor to serve as your Attorney General. I am proud of what we have accomplished together and leave office with satisfaction in knowing we have done our best to provide you with better training, equipment and support, while dramatically improving public safety for those we serve. Thank you, stay safe, and God Bless.

State v. Popp and Thomas
Decided by the Wisconsin Court of Appeals
10/29/14

Issue:

Whether or not the police made an unlawful trespass to a home, when they looked through the home windows after being denied consent to search the home.

Facts:

The police received a voicemail message from an anonymous caller stating that he was watching a person in front of the person's trailer wearing a full body sterile suit and moving big blue Tupperware bins containing mushrooms from the inside to the outside of the trailer. The caller was looking for consideration in another case but would not identify himself.

The police responded to the trailer in question, Trailer 22. Upon further investigation the police discovered that the same trailer had been the subject of a call in 2009 regarding a possible meth lab involving Popp and co-defendant Thomas. The officers saw Thomas standing outside the trailer and approached him. The officer told Thomas that police thought drugs were being manufactured in the trailer and asked Thomas for consent to search the trailer. Thomas refused consent.

Despite being refused consent, the officers started looking around the trailer and walked up the steps to the back door and flashed a flashlight into the window on the door. From this perspective the police saw an oxygen

tank on the floor and glass beakers. One police officer then took a step onto the grass and looked through another window. There the officer saw tinfoil with a circular indentation and a surgical mask. Based on all the information the police procured a search warrant, and upon executing the warrant found a lab for creating mushrooms and various growing mushrooms. The state charged Popp and Thomas with two counts of manufacturing a controlled substance.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendants argued that the police unlawfully approached their home and looked through the windows, after consent to search the home had been specifically denied. According the defendant argued that the search warrant was unlawful since it was primarily based on illegally obtained evidence.

The State's Argument:

The state argued that though the look through the trailer windows might have been unlawful, the police conduct after this action was proper and the evidence generated by the warrant should be saved by the attenuation doctrine.

The Court of Appeals Holding:

The Wisconsin Court of Appeals agreed with the defendant's and suppressed the evidence. The court reasoned that the police going on the trailer property, after being denied consent, was an unlawful trespass and therefore constituted a fourth amendment violation. The court reasoned that whether or not the defendants had an expectation of privacy in the ground area from which the police looked through the window, it was a trespass. Therefore the court held that the search warrant had to be excised of the information generated from the window snooping, and once that was done there was not enough probable cause to justify the issuance of the search warrant.

Cautionary Note;

There are two ways a citizen can launch a fourth amendment challenge; 1) a search in an area for which the defendant has a reasonable expectation of privacy, or 2) a trespass into a privacy zone. The bottom line is that the home is jealously guarded by the courts and therefore when the police are denied consent to search the home, any attempt to continue to explore around the home will be deemed an unlawful trespass. The result might be different if the police come to the front door, ring the bell, hear nothing, and then look through a front window as this conduct might not be viewed as a trespass.



FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2014

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January 2014 through December 1, 2014.

47 law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2013, 23 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the 47 officers slain in 2014 are as follows: 9 were making traffic pursuits or stops, 8 were answering disturbance calls, 8 were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, 7 were ambushed, 4 were involved in tactical situations, 2 were performing investigative activities, 2 were handling person(s) with mental illness, 2 were drug-related matters, 1 was pursuing robbery suspect/responding to robbery in progress and 4 officers were attempting other arrests,.

Sixteen of the 47 victim officers feloniously killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 13 in the West, 8 in the Midwest, 6 in the Northeast, and 4 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico.

42 of the 47 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms(28 handguns, 9 rifles, 2 shotgun, and 3 firearm types not reported). 4 victim officers were intentionally killed by subjects using motor vehicles as other weapons. One victim officer was killed by subject using their personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.).

27 victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at time of incident, 6 were confirmed to not be wearing body armor, and body armor usage has not been reported for 14 victim officers. There have been 45 separate incidents in which these 47 victim officers have been slain. All 45 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

37 law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2013, 43 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 37 officers accidentally killed in 2014 are as follows: 24 were involved in automobile accidents, 5 were involved in motorcycle accidents, 4 victim officers were fatally struck by a vehicle, 2 were accidentally shot, 1 died from smoke inhalation and 1 officer drowned. 17 of the 37 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law

enforcement agencies in the South, 12 in the West, 5 in the Northeast and 3 in the Midwest.

Incident Summaries

Midland County Sheriff's Office, Texas

Veteran Sergeant, Aged 46, with over 13 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 10/09/2014. At approximately 2p.m., sergeant was serving arrest warrant on subject at subjects residence. During execution of arrest warrant, subject fatally shot sergeant with .45-caliber handgun. After brief standoff, subject surrendered and was taken into custody without incident.

Sacramento County Sheriff's Department (SCSD), California

Veteran Deputy Sheriff, Aged 47, with 15 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 10/24/2014. In addition, Placer County Sheriff's Department (PCSD), California, advised veteran Detective, Aged 42, with 18 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on same date by same subject.

At approximately 10:30 a.m., SCSD deputy and partner responded to call of suspicious vehicle in parking lot of local motel. In motel parking lot, deputy and partner identified suspicious vehicle which was occupied by two individuals, subject and his wife. As deputy and partner approached suspicious vehicle, subject fired gunshots at deputies. Victim deputy was immediately struck by gunfire and died at scene of incident. Deputy's partner returned gunfire at both individuals (subject and his wife) as they fled.

Thereafter, subject and his wife attempted to carjack vehicle but failed; however, driver of vehicle suffered gunshot wound during altercation. Immediately after failed carjacking attempt, subject and his wife successfully carjacked pickup truck and fled approximately 32 miles away to Auburn, California. Federal, State and Local law enforcement agencies responded to Auburn.

In Auburn, while attempting to pull over pickup truck occupied by subject and his wife, PCSD detective and PCSD deputy were engaged by AR-15 gunfire from subject. Victim detective was shot several times and died at scene of incident. PCSD deputy also received gunshot wound during exchange of gunfire and has, thus far, survived his wound. Law enforcement authorities captured subject at scene of incident; however, subject escaped and fled.

Subsequently, law enforcement authorities tracked subject to residence in Auburn. At about 3:50p.m., subject surrendered and was taken into custody.

Pomona Police Department (PPD), California

Veteran Officer, Aged 45, with approximately 16 years law enforcement experience, was shot during early morning hours of 10/28/2014. PPD SWAT officer was serving search warrant at residence while assisting state and federal agencies in multi-agency, multi-location operation targeting motorcycle gang activity. Upon entry of residence, during service of search warrant, subject from within residence opened fire with shotgun striking victim officer in upper torso area. Victim officer was transported to hospital where he succumbed to his injuries on 10/29/2014. Subject was arrested at scene without further incident.

Cedar County Sheriff's Office (CCSO), Missouri

Deputy Sheriff, Aged 25, with over 1 year law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 11/02/2014. Shortly after midnight, deputy, along with CCSO dispatcher who was participating in ride-a-long, observed vehicle that had light not working. Deputy attempted to stop vehicle which was occupied by two individuals. After short pursuit, driver stopped vehicle and passenger exited vehicle and ran from traffic stop. Fleeing subject initially fell; however, deputy pursued subject on foot into nearby yard. Scuffle ensued as deputy tried to subdue subject. Witness who observed deputy and subject wrestling thought deputy had subject under control and returned into their home. Short time later, witness heard several gunshots. Subject fired .45-caliber handgun and fatally shot victim deputy in neck. Firearm round traveled downward from neck, striking victim deputy's lung and heart. During exchange of gunfire, victim deputy fatally shot subject.

Akron Police Department (APD), Ohio

Veteran Police Officer, Aged 32, with over 7 years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 11/16/2014. At approximately 2 a.m., off-duty officer was at local restaurant when subject entered and brandished firearm. Subject had previously been asked by employees to leave restaurant based upon his behavior. Subject went to his vehicle and returned with firearm. After brandishing firearm, citizens and employees immediately asked officer to intervene, knowing he was APD officer. Officer stood and addressed subject. During scuffle to remove subject from restaurant, victim officer was shot twice in torso. Four other individuals were also shot by subject during incident. Victim officer succumbed to gunshot injuries short time later. Subject was later apprehended in nearby field.

Leon County Sheriff's Office, Florida

Veteran Deputy Sheriff, Aged 47, with approximately 25 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 11/22/2014. At about 10:30 a.m., deputy responded to scene of house fire in regards to 911 call. Upon arrival, deputy was fatally shot by subject using handgun. Subject then took victim deputy's service weapon and shot at other responding law enforcement officers (one of whom was shot and non-fatally wounded) and Tallahassee Fire Department personnel. Subject was eventually fatally shot by responding Tallahassee Police Department officer.
