MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

As part of the Wisconsin Department of Justice's Elder Financial Abuse Initiative, DOJ staff is working with other nonprofit organizations, state agencies, and other professionals to combat the growing problem of elder financial exploitation. The Department of Justice has undertaken a number of projects to assist Wisconsin law enforcement officers in identifying and investigating these crimes.

In April, DOJ is sponsoring day-long sessions for law enforcement officers training in Eau Claire and Milwaukee to combat elder financial exploitation. Details regarding this training will be forthcoming on WILENET. In addition, the Department's Office of Crime Victim Services has created a website to assist officers and citizens in identifying elder abuse: <http://www.doj.state.wi.us/cvs/elderissues>. The website also provides information identifying common types of scams perpetrated against the elderly, as well as contacts to various nonprofit organizations and state and federal agencies that assist elders and law enforcement in dealing with circumstances of material exploitation. And on the legislative front, the Department of Justice is strongly encouraging the Legislature to pass 2005 A.B. 539, which includes a variety of provisions to enhance adult protective services and combat the financial abuse of senior citizens.

This abuse can take many forms. Such abuse often occurs in circumstances involving "undue influence." "Undue influence" may occur when a relative, a friend, or a professional utilizes his or her relationship to manipulate an elderly victim for the purpose of stealing the elderly victim's property. For example, "undue influence" may result in financial exploitation when a person in a fiduciary position exercises control over an elderly victim's assets in a manner inconsistent with the elderly victim's interest and to another person's benefit. For example, an unscrupulous banker with power of attorney over a widow's accounts might disburse funds from a widow's accounts to himself.

Alternatively, "undue influence" may arise when a person has an opportunity to exercise control over a susceptible elderly victim. The person must have a disposition to procure an improper favor for someone other than the elderly victim and must obtain a coveted result. For example, an unscrupulous nurse's aide might manipulate his or her relationship with an elderly victim with the express result that the elderly victim "gifts" the aide assets from the victim's estate. In such cases, the offenders will often isolate an elderly victim from relatives and others who have an interest in protecting the elderly victim from undue influence.

Wisconsin law enforcement officers have always demonstrated strength and professionalism in responding to new law enforcement challenges. Vigorously investigating and prosecuting those who prey upon Wisconsin's rapidly growing elderly population is a critical endeavor. As Attorney General, I look forward to working with you as we develop the appropriate tools, through DOJ resources and legislation, that will assist you in combating crimes committed against Wisconsin's elders.

State v. Ziedonis
2005 WI APP 249- decided by the Court of Appeals-November 30, 2005

Introduction:

This case deals with the community caretaker exception to the warrant requirement. The case involves a good discussion of the test for evaluating the propriety of a community caretaker intrusion into a privacy area.

Facts:

The police were dispatched to a loose animal complaint. When the police arrived at the scene they observed two aggravated Rottweiler dogs that were running loose and chasing people around. The police tried for approximately an hour and a half to corral the dogs but opted not to shoot them unless absolutely necessary as the dogs appeared to be someone's pets. In investigating the matter the police learned that the dogs belonged to a person who lived in the back portion of a house on 2621 South 6th Street in Milwaukee.

While still trying to corral the dogs a few other police officers set out to find the dog's owner. The officers arrived at 2621 South 6th street and saw a light on and the police were also told that a man, believed to be the lawful occupant was inside. The officer then made numerous attempts to contact the occupant. These attempts included having the sirens and air horns on, and using a loud speaker to identify themselves as Milwaukee police and to request the occupant's help with the dogs. Despite these efforts the police did not receive a response from the occupant. The officers were unable to knock on the door or ring the bell because they feared if they did the dogs would attack.

The back portion of the residence had a back door that could be seen from the alley behind the house. The back door consisted of a see-through glass storm door and an interior door. The interior door was slightly ajar. Upon seeing the ajar door the police became concerned that there might be something wrong with the person inside. Eventually one police officer made his way to the back door without the dogs noticing. The officer then opened the unlocked storm door and closed the door behind him to prevent

the dogs from getting in. Standing by the door the officer yelled as loud as he could for approximately two minutes as to who he was, about the dogs, and if anyone needed help but the officer received no response.

The officer then proceeded into the residence and began to look for someone in need of help. Once in the home the officer noticed several weapons and ammunition and he then, along with other officers, went into the second story bedroom where they found the defendant lying awake in his bed as well as illegal drugs and drug paraphernalia.

Defendant's Position:

The defendant argued that drug and weapon evidence should have been suppressed as they were the product of an illegal entry into his home by the police.

The State's Position:

The state argued that the police entry into the home was legitimate under the community caretaker exception to the warrant requirement.

The Court's Holding:

The court of appeals agreed with the state and held that the police intrusion in this case was justifiable under the community caretaker doctrine. The court reiterated the principle that the community caretaker exception is only applicable when the actions of the police are totally divorced from the detection, investigation, or acquisition of evidence of criminal activity. In evaluating the propriety of a community caretaker intrusion the court looks at first whether the activity was a bona fide caretaker activity and then as to whether the public need for the intrusion outweighs the intrusion into a person's privacy.

Applying this test the court easily found that the police under the circumstances were engaged in a bona fide caretaker activity. So next they looked at whether the public's interest in the intrusion outweighed the defendant's privacy rights. The court held that since the police had made every effort to contact the defendant without the intrusion, and since they had every reason to believe someone was inside, and since the activity took place in the early morning hours in a high crime area, and since potentially dangerous dogs were running around loose, the public's interest in the intrusion to make sure everything was OK inside the home outweighed the defendant's privacy interest in the home. Consequently the court endorsed the police conduct and held that the evidence against the defendant was lawfully found in plain view.

Note: *It is important to remember that if the police wish to engage in a lawful community caretaker entry into a home they must not have a crime investigatory agenda but must be solely motivated by the desire to render help or assistance.*



FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through December 2005: Fifty-three law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2004, 57 officers were slain. In 2005, 28 officers were slain in the south, ten in the midwest, ten in the west, four in the northeast, and one in Puerto Rico. Of the 53 officers slain, 15 were performing traffic stops, six were ambushed, six were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, six were answering robbery calls, five were answering disturbance calls (four being domestic disturbance calls), four were involved in investigative activities, four were attempting other arrests, two were involved in tactical situations, two were handling mentally deranged persons, two were involved in drug-related circumstances, and one was handling prisoner(s). Firearms were used in 48 of the killings (40 handguns, five shotguns, and three rifles) and vehicles five. Twenty-nine officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 51 separate incidents in which these 53 officers have been slain. Of the 51 incidents, 50 have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Sixty law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2004, 82 officers were accidentally killed. Twenty-seven deaths occurred in the south, 13 in the midwest, 13 in the west, five in the northeast, and two in Puerto Rico. Of the 60 officers, 33 were killed in automobile accidents, 11 were struck by vehicles, four officers were killed in motorcycle accidents, four were accidentally shot, three were fatally injured due to falls, two were killed in aircraft accidents, two officers drowned, and one was killed in jet ski accident.

Incident Summaries

Fort Worth Police Department (FWPD), Texas, 39-year-old Veteran Police Officer with over 13 years law enforcement experience with agency was shot on 11/29/2005 and died from critical injury on 12/01/2005. At approximately 2 p.m. on 11/29/2005, officers assigned to Northside Crime Response Team FWPD were attempting to locate and arrest subject wanted for State of Texas parole violation. Attempting to execute warrant at trailer, officers entered bedroom. Upon entry, subject fired 9-millimeter handgun, striking officer once over left eye. Officers returned fire and removed wounded officer from trailer, who was transported by helicopter to local hospital. Subject exited window of trailer and fled to nearby house where he forced

his way inside and took occupant hostage. FWPD SWAT officers surrounded house to negotiate with subject. Hostage subsequently released unharmed. Subject later surrendered and taken to FWPD headquarters for questioning. On 12/05/2005, subject was charged with capital murder and aggravated kidnapping.

New York Police Department (NYPD), New York, 28-year-old Police Officer with over three years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 12/10/2005. At approximately 5:20 a.m., officer was awakened by sound of breaking glass coming from neighbor's house. Officer put on coat, hung police shield around neck, took cell phone and eight-shot KHR semiautomatic off-duty weapon. After noticing next door's basement window was broken, officer called 911 for backup. As two individuals emerged from residence, officer identified himself as police officer and gave verbal command for subjects to stop. Subject, using .357 Smith & Wesson revolver, fired round striking victim officer in left chest near heart. Victim officer was able to return fire, striking one subject twice in chest and striking other subject four times in abdomen, chest, right leg, and groin. Victim officer was transported to medical facility where he was pronounced dead at 6:09 a.m. Both subjects were arrested by officers from NYPD near scene of shooting. Both subjects had prior criminal history.

Pennsylvania State Police, Pittsburgh, 45-year-old Veteran Corporal, with over 21 years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 12/12/2005 during traffic stop. Just after 2 a.m., corporal radioed he was making traffic stop of speeding vehicle occupied by three individuals. Approximately 10 minutes later, victim corporal's body was found by another officer on routine patrol duty. Subsequent investigation revealed corporal ordered subject out of vehicle. Subject then attacked victim corporal. Passengers of vehicle fled on foot as subject fought with corporal. Corporal was overpowered and subject gained control of .40 caliber service weapon, firing twice. Victim corporal wounded in neck and fatally wounded when gunshot entered between body armor at side and exited on other side of victim officer's body. Corporal's service weapon was taken, but another gun believed to be that of subject's was found at scene. After vehicle trace, subject and girlfriend were arrested. On 12/14/2005, subject was charged with criminal homicide, theft by taking, resisting arrest, attempting to elude police, and firearms violations.

OVERVIEW: This is an advanced level course intended for experienced criminal investigators who would be assigned to conduct death investigations. Topics relate to all types of violent deaths, including homicides, suicides, accidents and suspicious/sudden/unexpected deaths. The course is intended to equip the criminal investigator with the skills and knowledge necessary to conduct a professional death investigation. Included in the agenda are presentations on how to detect and recover buried bodies, how to identify human remains, and how to "interrogate" victims to determine how, when and where they died, and who, if anyone, was responsible for their deaths. All commonly encountered means of death are discussed, including firearms, poison, sharp and blunt force, asphyxiation, and fire/explosives. In the second week, students are exposed to a variety of formal and informal investigative techniques used to identify and develop suspects.

EXPENSES: Instructional costs for 2006 are not yet finalized. The total cost must either be deducted from the agency's reimbursement allotment through Training and Standards or paid directly by check to the Department of Justice.

SPECIAL NOTES: Only certified officers from Wisconsin law enforcement agencies are eligible to attend. Enrollment is limited to 40 participants. In order to allow as many departments as possible to attend, only one officer per year will be accepted from each department. **No waiting list is carried forward;** any interested agency should submit a new application for 2006. **All applications must be received by February 25, 2006.**

Canadian National Railway has experienced a high number of thefts of track materials in recent weeks. **ALL RAILROAD IRON CAN BE CONSIDERED STOLEN!!!**

Railroads do not release property to private individuals. These materials are removed and recycled by contracted salvage companies only.

Officers should be alert for subjects in possession of large amounts of railroad iron as pictured. Suspects in recent cases in western Wisconsin have generally been methamphetamine users/distributors, or known associates.



If subjects encountered during law enforcement contacts are in possession of similar items:

- Note complete vehicle description and subject information. If possible, photograph the items.
- Demand proof of a written release from the railroad. (very unlikely subject will have a release.)
- **CONTACT CN POLICE IMMEDIATELY.** Your communications center has been provided with this contact information. A railroad police investigator will get in touch with you immediately and can provide further assistance/information.
