MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

On January 13, 2006, the Wisconsin Department of Justice commitment to protecting Wisconsin's children is commemorated by officially recognizing Amber Alert Awareness Day. January 13th will mark the tenth anniversary of the abduction of Amber Hagerman, for whom the Amber Alert system was named. In addition to coordinating the Wisconsin's state of the art Amber Alert program, the Wisconsin Clearinghouse for Missing and Exploited Children is working hard every day with local law enforcement to find runaways and other kids in trouble.

Nearly 95% of Wisconsin's missing children are runaways. In evaluating state and national information, we can clearly identify a trend of children who are tricked into running away by sex offenders they first meet on-line. The Wisconsin Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force addresses this issue head on. The Wisconsin ICAC program actively protects children who use the Internet by proactively investigating the on-line sexual exploitation of children by predators. Last year alone, our agents in partnership with federal and local law enforcement recorded over 115 arrests related to computer facilitated child sexual exploitation cases. This figure exceeds the number of arrests reported in past years by any other national ICAC task force programs.

As your Attorney General, I understand that arrests alone can not resolve the problem of on-line victimization. I am dedicated to training law enforcement and educating parents and youth about potential dangers on-line and offering safety tips and tools to protect Wisconsin's children. This month the Department of Justice is formalizing a relationship with NetSmartz, an Internet safety program of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. We invite your participation in bringing this free resource into your community, and to every community in Wisconsin.

Computer and Internet investigations defy conventional law enforcement concepts regarding jurisdiction, making coordinated response efforts critical. We must actively investigate Internet sex offenders in our communities in order to locate and provide critical victim services to the children who are victimized by predators. I look forward to sharing more information with you and offering the expert assistance of our trained agents and dedicated staff.

State v. Earnest Alexander
2005 WI APP 231- decided by
the Court of Appeals-September 20, 2005

Introduction:

This case deals with the propriety of a “Terry” styled investigatory detention. The court of appeals held that under the totality of the circumstances there was insufficient reasonable suspicion upon which to base a Terry stop.

Facts:

At approximately 11:30 pm on March 20, 2004, a man was shot. An officer arrived at the scene and took a description of the assailant. The victim said the shooter was a black male wearing a thigh-length coat with fur around the hood and carrying an unknown gun type. Later, at the hospital, the victim provided further details, adding that the coat was black and that the shooter was wearing a black stocking cap and dark pants.

About 26 hours after the shooting an officer noticed the defendant walking about ten blocks east of the crime scene. The defendant, a black man, was wearing a black skull cap, black waist length jacket and black pants. When approached, the defendant paused for a couple of seconds, avoided eye contact but did not flee or change direction. The officer stopped the defendant, frisked him for weapons and found cocaine. The defendant was arrested and charged with possession of cocaine with the intent to deliver but was never questioned about the shooting.

Defendant’s Position

The defendant argued that the stop was unreasonable because the police did not have the requisite reasonable suspicion. The defendant reasoned that meeting a vague description with nothing more did not justify the stop, particularly since the stop occurred ten blocks from the crime scene and over a day after the crime had taken place.

The State’s Position:

The state argued that the defendant’s relative proximity to the crime scene, his clothing matching the description of the assailant, and his avoiding eye contact with the police combined to form the necessary reasonable suspicion upon which to make a Terry stop.

The Court’s Holding

The court of appeals sided with the defendant and held that the stop was unreasonable and thus the seized cocaine should be suppressed as evidence as it was fruit of the poisonous tree. In reaching this decision the court examined the six factors which typically are looked at to determine the propriety of a stop. These factors are: 1) the particularity of the description of the offender, 2) the size of the area in which the offender might be found, 3) the number of persons about in the area, 4) the known or probable direction of the defender’s flight, 5) the observed activity by the particular person stopped, and 6) knowledge or suspicion that the person or vehicle stopped has been involved in other criminality of the type presently under investigation. The court found that the only factor really present was the description and that was even vague as it could apply to many individuals in the area. Moreover the court was concerned that the defendant was 10 blocks away, and was approached more than a day after the alleged crime.

Note:

This case reaffirms that the evaluation of reasonable suspicion for a stop is dependent on the totality of the circumstances test. A substantial length of time between the alleged crime and the stop is a problem unless other facts are powerful enough on their own to give rise to reasonable suspicion. Another problem with this case is that the police never questioned the defendant on the subject which was the alleged basis for the stop.



FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through November 2005: Forty-nine law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2004, 54 officers were slain. In 2005, 25 officers were slain in the south, ten in the midwest, ten in the west, three in the northeast, and one in Puerto Rico. Of the 49 officers slain, 14 were performing traffic stops, six were ambushed, six were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, six were answering robbery calls, four were involved in investigative activities, three were answering disturbance calls (two being domestic disturbance calls), three were attempting other arrests, two were involved in tactical situations, two were handling mentally deranged persons, two were involved in drug-related circumstances, and one was handling prisoner(s). Firearms were used in 44 of the killings (36 handguns, five shotguns, and three rifles) and five vehicles. Twenty-six officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 48 separate incidents in which these 49 officers have been slain. Of the 48 incidents, 47 have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Fifty-six law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2004, 78 officers were accidentally killed. In 2005, 31 officers were killed in automobile accidents, ten were struck by vehicles, four officers were killed in motorcycle accidents, three were accidentally shot, three were fatally injured due to falls, two were killed in aircraft accidents, two officers drowned, and one was killed in jet ski accident. Twenty-five deaths occurred in the south, 13 in the midwest, 11 in the west, five in the northeast, and two in Puerto Rico.

Incident Summaries

Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, Special Agent, age 38, with over five years law enforcement experience with agency was injured on 11/11/2005. Special agent performed traffic stop on suspicious vehicle. While attempting to subdue combative driver, agent was dragged and run over by subject's vehicle. Subject, attempting to flee scene, was shot by victim special agent. Suffering severe head injury, victim agent succumbed to injury on 11/18/2005. Subject, who had lengthy criminal record ranging from concealing stolen property to methamphetamine manufacturing, is currently in hospital.

Dallas Police Department, Texas, Officer, age 28, with over three years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 11/13/2005. At approximately 2:40 a.m., officers responded to

disturbance call. Several officers chased subject through alleys and residences. Subject fired .357 caliber handgun at officers. Round struck victim officer under arm. Wounded officer was transported to medical center where he was pronounced dead. Subject was arrested and charged with capital murder.

California Highway Patrol (CHP), Sacramento, California, Veteran Officer, age 37, with 13 years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 11/17/2005. At approximately 2:30 p.m., officer was patrolling unincorporated area where he initiated traffic stop on county road. Upon approaching subject vehicle, officer was immediately shot with .357 magnum revolver. Bullet pierced below victim officer's right eye and exited his back skull. Subject fled scene of incident in his vehicle. Several witnesses called for help by using victim officer's radio. Within 30 minutes of incident, hundreds of law enforcement officers responded and established perimeter and command post. Under command of Yolo County Sheriff's Department, teams of officers and agents were dispatched to conduct door-to-door search of surrounding rural neighborhood while parole and probation queried databases for potential suspects. At about 5 p.m., subject's name was brought to command post officer's attention and subject matched description provided by witnesses. At approximately 11:30 p.m., subject's girlfriend contacted officers at command post and stated she believed her boyfriend was involved in shooting. Subject's girlfriend supplied officers with subject's cell phone number and address. Officers were able to locate subject at motel in Rocklin, California, by tracking activity through subject's cell phone. On 11/18/2005 at 3:05 a.m., CHP and Rocklin Police Department SWAT teams were staging in parking lot when subject and another individual were observed leaving motel room. They were both taken into custody and transported to Rocklin Police Department.

Wiggins Police Department (WPD), Mississippi, Two Veteran Officers, one with 20 years law enforcement experience, age 48, and one with five years law enforcement experience, age 23, were fatally shot on 11/27/2005. At approximately 8 p.m., WPD received 911 call from individual who had been victim of domestic abuse. Officers responded to residence and attempted to place subject (caller's husband) under arrest. During struggle, subject obtained officer's service weapon, .40 caliber Glock semiautomatic pistol and fired several shots. One officer struck in chest and right side. Second officer able to use pepper spray, but struck by subject's gunfire in back and upper thigh, which traveled to torso area. Neither officer was wearing body armor. After fatally wounding both officers, subject fled scene but later turned himself into officers from Stone County Sheriff's Office and Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol. Subject charged with two counts of capital murder.

New York City Police Department, New York, Veteran Police Officer, age 35, with five years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 11/28/2005. At approximately 2:50 a.m., officer and partner were on patrol and observed subject vehicle run red light. As officers pulled alongside subject vehicle in attempt to pull it over, at least five shots were fired from passenger window. Bullet from 9-millimeter semiautomatic handgun entered left side of officer's body under his armpit between ballistic vest panels, hitting his heart. Victim officer, driving unmarked police vehicle, did not initially realize he was struck and continued pursuit until subject vehicle drove down apartment building

garage ramp and metal garage door closed. Victim officer was immediately rushed to local hospital and, after several hours of surgery, succumbed to his injuries. Subject was located later that morning at his girlfriend's apartment, and weapon was recovered in courtyard next to apartment's window. Subject has been detained, but not yet formally charged.

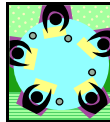

OVERVIEW: This is an advanced level course intended for experienced criminal investigators who would be assigned to conduct death investigations. Topics relate to all types of violent deaths, including homicides, suicides, accidents and suspicious/sudden/unexpected deaths. The course is intended to equip the criminal investigator with the skills and knowledge necessary to conduct a professional death investigation. Included in the agenda are presentations on how to detect and recover buried bodies, how to identify human remains, and how to "interrogate" victims to determine how, when and where they died, and who, if anyone, was responsible for their deaths. All commonly encountered means of death are discussed, including firearms, poison, sharp and blunt force, asphyxiation, and fire/explosives. In the second week, students are exposed to a variety of formal and informal investigative techniques used to identify and develop suspects.

EXPENSES: Instructional costs for 2006 are not yet finalized. The total cost must either be deducted from the agency's reimbursement allotment through Training and Standards or paid directly by check to the Department of Justice.

SPECIAL NOTES: Only certified officers from Wisconsin law enforcement agencies are eligible to attend. Enrollment is limited to 40 participants. In order to allow as many departments as possible to attend, only one officer per year will be accepted from each department. **No waiting list is carried forward;** any interested agency should submit a new application for 2006. **All applications must be received by February 25, 2006.**
