State v. Lord **2006 WI 122 (decided 12/9/06)**

Introduction:

This case involves the issue of whether a display of a temporary license plate is a sufficient basis upon which to stop a car. The court of appeals ruled it was but the Supreme Court reversed and held that this fact alone is not a basis for a traffic stop.

Facts:

The police stopped a vehicle because it had a temporary license plate. Subsequent to the stop the police found evidence against the defendant Lord.

The Trial Court:

The trial court rejected Lord's motion to dismiss and found that the police were justified in stopping a vehicle because of a temporary license plate. The court felt that the police were entitled to investigate the matter to determine whether the vehicle was properly registered.

The Court of Appeals:

The Court of Appeals affirmed the trial court. In effect the Court of Appeals ruling enabled law enforcement to stop any vehicle to verify the registration solely because the vehicle is displaying temporary license plates.

The Wisconsin Supreme Court

The Wisconsin Supreme Court held that both the trial court and the Court of Appeals had misstated the law and consequently both were wrong. The court referenced the United States Supreme Court case of *Delaware v. Prouse*, 440 U.S. 648 (1979) which held that law enforcement can not stop a vehicle to determine whether it is properly registered unless the officers have reasonable suspicion or probable cause to believe that either the automobile is being driven contrary to the laws governing its operation or that any occupant is subject to seizure in connection with the violation of an applicable law. Since in this case there was no reasonable suspicion that Lord was unlicensed or the vehicle improperly registered other than a temporary plate the court found the traffic stop improper and thus unlawful.

The Court held that a law enforcement officer can not infer wrongful conduct based solely on the display of a temporary license plate.

Note: This opinion does not change the existing Wisconsin law that a "license applied for" placard is a sufficient basis upon which to make a traffic stop. The "license applied for placard" arouses a justifiable suspicion about the registration and ownership of the vehicle and thus law enforcement has the right to investigate.

Conversely, temporary plates are lawful enough on their face to be insufficient, without other suspicious factors, to be the basis for a traffic stop.

COLLECTION & PRESERVATION OF KHAT

Khat is a flowering shrub native to northeast Africa and the Arabian Peninsula. Individuals chew khat leaves because of the stimulant effects, which are similar to but less intense than those caused by abusing cocaine or methamphetamine. When fresh, khat leaves are glossy and crimson-brown in color, resembling withered basil. Khat is usually packaged in plastic bags or wrapped in banana leaves or newspaper to retain its moistness and freshness. It is often sprinkled with water during transport to keep the leaves moist. The use of khat is accepted within the Somali, Ethiopian and Yemeni cultures. In the United States khat use is most prevalent among immigrants from those countries.

The active ingredient in khat is cathinone which is a Schedule I Controlled Substance. When the khat leaves are no longer fresh or are allowed to dry out, the cathinone will rapidly decompose to form cathine which is a Schedule IV Controlled Substance. Cathinone is about ten times more potent than cathine and is only present in fresh leaves. Therefore, if you should confiscate plant material suspected to be khat, you should preserve it by **freezing the plant as soon as possible**. It should remain frozen even while transporting it to the Crime Laboratory for analysis.

A recent court trial for the possession with intent to deliver approximately thirty-five pounds of khat served as a reminder of the necessity of freezing khat as soon as possible. The submitting agency froze the khat in their coroner's freezer shortly after recovering the plant material. After submission to the crime laboratory, it remained frozen until it was analyzed and then placed back into a freezer after analysis. One of the issues addressed in the trial was that khat rapidly decomposes and therefore, little or no cathinone would be present. Both the officers involved and the crime laboratory analyst were questioned extensively about the collection, preservation and possible decomposition of the plant material. However, since the khat was properly stored by freezing, little or no additional decomposition occurred and cathinone was identified.

Should you have plant material suspected to be khat, be sure to freeze it as soon as possible and keep it frozen even while transporting it to the crime laboratory for analysis. All plant material suspected to be khat should be submitted to the crime laboratory as soon as possible. If you have any questions about the collection and preservation of khat, feel free to call the crime laboratory in your service area for advice.



FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through November 2006: Forty-one law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2005, 52 officers were slain. Twenty deaths occurred in the south, seven in the west, seven in the northeast, six in the midwest, and one in Puerto Rico. Circumstances involving the 41 slain officers are as follows: eight were performing traffic stops, seven were ambushed, six were answering disturbance calls (three being domestic disturbance calls), six were answering robbery calls, five were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, three were attempting other arrests, two were involved in drug-

related matters, two were slain in tactical situations, one was handling mentally deranged person, and one officer was handling prisoner. Firearms were used in 39 killings (30 handguns, six rifles, two shotguns, and one firearm types not reported) and vehicles in two. Eighteen officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 40 separate incidents in which these 41 officers have been slain. Thirty-five of the 40 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Sixty law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2005, 60 officers were accidentally killed. Twenty-two deaths occurred in the south, 19 in the west, 13 in the midwest, five in the northeast, and one in Puerto Rico. Circumstances involving the 60 deaths are as follows: 34 were killed in automobile accidents, twelve were struck by vehicles, seven were killed in motorcycle accidents, four were accidentally shot, and three were killed in aircraft accidents.

Incident Summaries

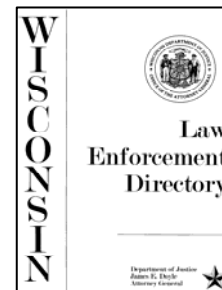
Broward County Sheriff's Office (BCSO), Florida, Veteran Deputy Sheriff with six years law enforcement experience was fatally shot on 11/11/2006. At approximately 11 p.m., while working special detail, deputy conducted routine traffic stop. Deputy called for backup, which is common practice. When backup deputy arrived, both deputies were fired upon. Neither deputy had chance to return fire. Victim deputies were rushed to local medical center where victim deputy was pronounced dead. Backup deputy, with three years law enforcement experience, is in stable condition and is expected to make full recovery. Following incident, BCSO requested assistance of FBI in locating primary subject, as well as another subject who was identified as accomplice. On 11/12/2006, FBI Miami's SWAT Team, as well as FBI Miami's Violent Crime Fugitive

Task Force, responded. Investigation led agents to local inn where at approximately 4:30 p.m., after fugitive car stop, primary subject was taken into custody. Subject was in possession of .40-caliber Block handgun with extended magazine and additional magazine. Subject informed arresting officers that two other individuals were barricaded in room of inn. Negotiators attempted to resolve standoff, but eventually gas was used to encourage individuals to exit room. At about 5:45 p.m., individuals were taken into custody without further incident.

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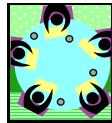

OVERVIEW: This is an advanced level course intended for experienced criminal investigators who would be assigned to conduct death investigations. Topics relate to all types of violent deaths, including homicides, suicides, accidents and suspicious/ sudden/ unexpected deaths. The course is intended to equip the criminal investigator with the skills and knowledge necessary to conduct a professional death investigation. Included in the agenda are presentations on how to detect and recover buried bodies, how to identify human remains, and how to "interrogate" victims to determine how, when and where they died, and who, if anyone, was responsible for their deaths. All commonly encountered means of death are discussed, including firearms, poison, sharp and blunt force, asphyxiation, and fire/explosions. In the second week, students are exposed to a variety of formal and informal investigative techniques used to identify and develop suspects.

EXPENSES: **DO NOT SEND PAYMENT UNTIL NOTIFIED IF SELECTED TO ATTEND.** Cost is \$929.00, which includes lodging, meals and registration. If commuting, cost is \$409.00. The total cost must either be deducted from the agency's reimbursement allotment through Training and Standards or paid directly by check to the Department of Justice prior to May 7, 2007.

SPECIAL NOTES: Only certified officers from Wisconsin law enforcement agencies are eligible to attend. Enrollment is limited to 40 participants.
