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MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear friends,

It is an honor and privilege to serve as Wisconsin's Attorney General. I am humbled to be your partner in fighting the tough public safety challenges facing our great state and look forward to working side by side with you over the next four years. The Wisconsin Department of Justice will continue to be a strong ally and advocate for you and your law enforcement peers during my tenure.

Much of the success we've had in the Waukesha County District Attorney's office, where I served for 25 years, the last eight as the elected district attorney, is attributed to the strong relationships we've made with the men and women on the frontlines. The partnerships we formed between offices and across jurisdictions allowed us to be robust in our enforcement and efficient in our use of resources.

I promise the Wisconsin Department of Justice will operate the same way. We will use the resources we have to support your efforts of fighting to protect Wisconsin families. Heien v. North Carolina Decided by the United States Supreme Court 12/15/2014

Issue:

A mistake of fact does not automatically invalidate a stop, so long as the mistake was reasonable. Conversely, the law has always been that a mistake of law cannot be reasonable, and any stop it spawned would be illegal. This case changes the law; the United States Supreme Court held that a mistake of law is not fatal to a stop if the mistake was objectively reasonable. In other words the US Supreme Court treats mistake of law in the same manner it treats mistake of fact.

Facts:

The police observed a vehicle passing by and could observe that the vehicle's driver appeared stiff and very nervous. The police began to follow the vehicle and noticed that when the vehicle braked, only the left brake light came on as the right brake light had apparently burned out. The police feeling that both brake lights had to be in working order stopped the vehicle. Eventually the police found cocaine inside the vehicle. The police sincerely believed that the applicable law required both brake lights to be in working order; however, the statute only required that one light work, so long as it provided sufficient light, which was the case in this situation.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendants argued that the police improperly stopped his vehicle, since the

stop was based on a mistake of law, and all mistakes of law by the police are per se unreasonable.

The State's Argument:

The state argued that the applicable statute was ambiguous and that the police sincerely believed that both brake lights had to be working. The state reasoned that the police mistake of law was objectively reasonable and that there is no reason to treat a reasonable mistake of law differently than the way reasonable mistakes of fact are treated.

The United States Supreme Court Holding:

The Supreme Court agreed with the state and held that an objectively reasonable mistake of law should be treated similarly to the way a reasonable mistake of fact is treated. The high court reasoned that the touchstone of 4th amendment jurisprudence is reasonableness. The court stressed that the subjective knowledge of the police is irrelevant; in other words a police officer can sincerely make a mistake of law, but the mistake will be fatal unless it can be shown that the mistake was objectively reasonable. In this case the Supreme Court opined that the mistake of law about both brake lights being operational was an objectively reasonable one since the statute was ambiguous, and there was no case law suggesting that only one light was sufficient.

Cautionary Notes:

This case should not change the way police do business; it is always the police objective to make no mistakes, either of fact or of law. Moreover, most mistakes of law will be deemed objectively unreasonable, unless the statute is ambiguous and there is no existing case law contra to the officer's interpretation of the law. The police cannot seek to benefit from this new doctrine by deliberately keeping themselves ignorant of the law, as

the officer's subjective knowledge is irrelevant.

An interesting look at this change in the law is its application to a recent Wisconsin case where the court invalidated a stop because the officer mistakenly believed that "good working order" meant that that all taillights had to be in good working order. If this new law had been in effect then, it is likely the stop would have been endorsed because the statute was ambiguous and there was no case law clarifying the situation. However any such stop in the future would be an objectively unreasonable mistake of law, since the police should have known of the recent case which clarified what is meant by "good working order."



FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2014

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January 2014 through December 31, 2014.

51 law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2013, 27 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the 51 officers slain in 2014 are as follows: 10 were answering disturbance calls (1 domestic call), 9 were performing traffic pursuits or stops, 9 were ambushed, 8 were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, 4 were involved in tactical situations, 2 were performing investigative activities, 2 were handling person(s) with mental illness, 2 were drug-related matters, 1 was pursuing robbery suspect/responding to robbery in progress and 4 officers were attempting other arrests..

Seventeen of the 51 victim officers feloniously killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 14 in the West, 8 in the Midwest, 8 in the Northeast, and 4 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico.

46 of the 51 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (32 handguns, 9 rifles, 2 shotgun, and 3 firearm types not reported). 4 victim officers were intentionally killed by subjects using motor vehicles as other weapons. One victim officer was killed by subject using their personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.).

28 victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at time of incident, 6 were confirmed to not be wearing body armor, and body armor usage has not been reported for 17 victim officers. There have been 48 separate incidents in which these 51 victim officers have been slain. All 48 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

42 law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2013, 49 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 42 officers accidentally killed in 2014 are as follows: 27 were involved in automobile accidents, 6 were involved in motorcycle accidents, 5 victim officers were fatally struck by a vehicle, 2 were accidentally shot, 1 died from smoke inhalation and 1 officer drowned. 19 of the 42 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law

enforcement agencies in the South, 12 in the West, 7 in the Northeast and 4 in the Midwest.

Incident Summaries

Police of Puerto Rico

Veteran police officer, aged 36, with approximately 10 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 11/26/2014 at about 9:10 p.m. Officer was working off-duty security detail at pharmacy in Trujillo Alto and was seated outside stool at front of entrance to business. Subject arrived at location, exited vehicle, and engaged in hand-to-hand combat with officer. During this time, subject obtained officers .40 caliber service weapon and shot victim officer before getting back inside vehicle and departing. Subject who sustained injuries during altercation left on of his shoes at scene of incident. Victim officer succumbed to his injuries.

Two other subjects were involved. Driver of vehicle and another subject who armed and fled scene on foot. All three subjects have been apprehended and arrested for victim officers death.

Tarpon Springs Police Department, Florida

Veteran police officer, aged 45, with approximately 22 year law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 12/21/2014. At approximately 2 a.m., subject began knocking on multiple doors at residential complex looking for someone he said had “dimed him out” in reference to violation of probation. Neighbor asked subjects female companion who had remained in vehicle to lower music in vehicle. When music was not turned down, neighbor called 911 with noise complaint. Female companion subsequently began to back out of driveway.

Officer responded to noise complaint and exited vehicle. Subject walked towards officer and opened fire with .40 caliber handgun. Victim officer was able to return gunfire before falling to ground. Subject ordered female companion who had remained in vehicle to get out of vehicle. Subject then entered vehicle and ran over victim officer before fleeing scene. As this occurred, resident of complex opened fired on subject thinking subject was looking for him. Tarpon Springs officers engaged in brief vehicle pursuit of subject which ended when he crashed into pole. Subject exited vehicle and fled on foot but was apprehended after short foot pursuit. Subject admitted to felonious killing of victim officer and was subsequently charged with first degree murder.

Flagstaff Police Department, Arizona

Officer, Aged 24, with less than 1 year of law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 12/27/2014. At approximately 1:30 p.m., officer responded to domestic violence call. Upon arriving at scene, officer confronted subject. During confrontation,

subject drew .22 caliber six-shot revolver and shot officer multiple times at close range. Victim officer received one gunshot wound to body and four to head. Having expended all rounds, subject retrieved officer's service weapon, walked away from immediate area, and shot himself in head with victim officer's service weapon. Subject was pronounced dead at scene. Victim officer

was transported to medical center where he succumbed to his injuries short time later.
