## MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

*Dear Law Enforcement Official:*

*The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) is hard at work designing the TIME System of the future. The new TIME System will provide more tools for Wisconsin law enforcement and will offer the opportunity to share local information, further enhancing officer safety, investigative capabilities and Wisconsin's reputation as a technology leader. The new server-to-server version of the TIME System is scheduled to be operational in December of this year. This new version brings XML and Web services technology found on today's Internet to the TIME System.*

*By changing to XML, images such as fingerprints, mug shots, and photos of missing persons or property may be attached to transactions, aiding in the identification process. By using XML, driver and criminal history records from all states can be displayed in a common format. The XML responses received from the new TIME System will be used to populate agency records management systems. The same agency records management systems will also be able to generate TIME System inquiries by properly formatting in XML.*

*The use of Web services will allow organizations to communicate data without intimate knowledge of each other's IT systems. Using Web services, local agencies could web-enable data in their local systems and make that information available to agencies statewide.*

*The new TIME System will also incorporate the concept of directory services. By using this type of user identification and authentication, access to the TIME System will be able to be strictly controlled based on the agency, user and level of TIME System certification. Each user will be able to access only those TIME System transactions for which they have been trained and certified.*

*We are working with the current vendor of the existing Enforcer 4.0 software in the development of a new product to interface with the new TIME System. The current TIME System will be maintained and agencies may cut over to the new system when they are ready for the conversion. eTIME will continue to add new transactions and be available for those criminal justice employees without access through BadgerNet. In conjunction with the TIME System project are a BadgerNet upgrade and a re-write of the Wisconsin hot files.*

*This ongoing advancement in technology will benefit every community, improving safety for our citizens and Wisconsin law enforcement officers. The TIME System of the future will be an exciting and cutting edge new way to share information in the State of Wisconsin - and will enhance local and state law enforcement effectiveness statewide for years to come.*

**State v. Sigarroa**  
**Decided by the Wisconsin Court of Appeals,**  
**2004- WI App 16**

**Legal Issue:**

This recent court of appeals case explored the issue of whether or not an individual maintains a reasonable expectation of privacy in garbage he places in a communal dumpster located on private property. The appellate court determined that under the circumstances of this case the defendant did not have an expectation of privacy in the garbage and consequently the police did not violate the 4<sup>th</sup> amendment when they made a warrantless seizure of the garbage.

**Facts:**

A police officer went to an apartment complex, acting on the basis of several anonymous tips that the defendant who lived in one of the apartments at the complex had been involved in recent drug dealings. The officer planned to engage in a garbage search because as of yet he did not have enough information to procure a search warrant for the defendant's residence. The officer drove to the apartment complex parking lot and then walked over to the dumpster, which was visible from the road and located approximately 170 feet from the public street approximately 53 feet from the apartment building. The officer continued to drive his car down the driveway past the apartment building on which a "Private Property" sign was posted. The officer did not seek or obtain permission from the owner or any of the apartment residents to enter the property or to search the contents of the dumpster. The officer got out of his car and walked to the dumpster and in doing so he did not have to walk through any barrier or gates and the dumpster lid was open. The officer reached into the dumpster and removed three or four black plastic garbage bags, which were knotted at the top. The officer searched the garbage bags and found marijuana seeds and stems and some other materials suggesting drug activity. Based on the evidence discovered in the garbage bags as well as the earlier

received anonymous tips the police received a search warrant for the defendant's apartment and the consequent search resulted in the discovery of crack cocaine and drug paraphernalia.

**The defendant's argument:**

The defendant argued that the evidence seized pursuant to the search warrant should be suppressed because the warrant was based on evidence illegally seized by the warrantless entry in the garbage dumpster.

**The state's argument:**

The state argued that the warrantless seizure of the garbage was lawful and did not violate the 4<sup>th</sup> amendment because the defendant did not have an expectation of privacy in garbage he placed in a communal dumpster.

**The court's holding:**

The court ruled that the seizure was lawful, as the defendant did not have an expectation of privacy in the garbage. The court decided this issue through the use of a two-prong test. The first prong is to determine whether the defendant has exhibited a subjective expectation of privacy and the second prong is whether that expectation is one which society would recognize as reasonable, an objective test. Using this approach the appellate court reasoned that the defendant did not exhibit a subjective expectation of privacy as he voluntarily placed the garbage in the dumpster with the knowledge and the expectation that it would be picked up for disposal by the garbage collection service. The court continued that while the property was surrounded on three sides by a fence, the fence did not impede access to the property or to the dumpster. Although the property had a "Private Property" sign the sign did not bar observation of the dumpster or impede access to the dumpster. The dumpster was located in an area totally disassociated with notions of privacy. The court therefore determined that the defendant did not have a subjective expectation of privacy in the garbage and even if he did it would not be a privacy interest that society would find to be reasonable. Accordingly the court ruled the police seizure of the garbage did not constitute a search or seizure within the meaning of the 4<sup>th</sup> amendment.

**Note:**

It is important to realize that typically defendant's do not have an expectation of privacy in garbage. The key however is where the garbage is located. If the garbage had been found in a private zone the result could have been different.

## Department of Revenue's Video Gambling Audit and Enforcement Policy

In July 2003, the video gambling statutes were amended by the Wisconsin Legislature to provide that only a special agent from the Department of Revenue, who is certified as a law enforcement officer, may investigate or enforce video gambling violations on Class B alcohol beverage licensed premises if the Class B premises has no more than five video gambling machines.

This law did not legalize video gambling machines. The penalties for having five or fewer video gambling machines include seizure of the machines, seizure of money in the machines and a penalty of \$500 per machine. Municipalities may also enact ordinances prohibiting these machines.

It is a felony for a Class B establishment to have more than five video gambling machines on their premises. In these instances, the licensee may face arrest by either a special agent of the Department of Revenue or a law enforcement officer in the jurisdiction where the violation occurs.

The Department will audit and enforce video gambling laws in a manner that allows us to use our resources most effectively. We will focus on those cases where substantial tax loss may be occurring. The gross receipts from the machines are subject to Wisconsin sales tax, the net income is subject to Wisconsin income or franchise tax and the purchase of the machines is subject to Wisconsin sales and use tax.

Department auditors will conduct audits of machine operators and Class B establishments. In addition to auditing for the proper reporting of income from liquor and beer sales, auditors will investigate the

proper reporting of income from video gambling, as well as, any other gambling activities, such as pull tabs, pools, raffles, etc. Auditors will request assistance from special agents when video gambling violations are identified.

If a special agent determines that video gambling violations have occurred on a Class B premises, the agent will render the machines inoperable by unplugging the illegal machines, securing them with evidence tape and obstructing any opening through which money may be passed using evidence tape, wax or other suitable material. Agents will order the owner of the establishment to remove the illegal machines within a set period of time and will issue a "Removal Order" to the licensee. Agents will also affix stickers to the illegal machines declaring them CONTRABAND, with removal orders clearly listed. If agents return to the premises and illegal machines are still present, agents will open the machines and destroy the "mother board", rendering the machines broken, and they may cut the power cord to disable the machines.

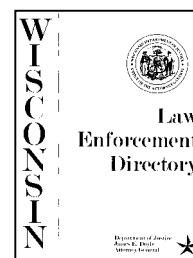
## FBI OFFICERS KILLED

The following statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through May 2004: Twenty law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2003, 25 officers were slain. In 2004, seven officers were slain in the south, four in the northeast, four in the Midwest, four in the west, and one in the U.S. Virgin Islands. Of the 20 officers slain, five were ambushed, three were answering robbery calls, three were attempting other arrests, three were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, three were performing traffic stops, two were answering disturbance calls, and one was handling prisoner(s). Firearms were used in all of the killings (12 handguns, four rifles, and four shotguns). Nine officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 17 separate incidents in which these 20 officers have been slain. Fifteen incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Twenty-five law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2003, 25 officers were accidentally killed. In 2004, 18 officers were killed in automobile accidents, three were struck by vehicles, two were killed in motorcycle accidents, and one was accidentally shot during training session. Thirteen deaths occurred in the south, four in the northeast, four in the midwest, and four in the west.

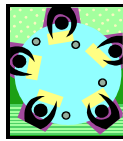

### # 7580 – BANK ROBBERY – Lake Mills Police Department, WI

On 04-28-2004 at 9:36 a.m., a lone white male entered the Associated Bank at 300 E. Lake St. in Lake Mills.

The man is described as 5'06" -5'08" 170-190 lbs. He was wearing a Greenbay Packer hat, sunglasses, a navy blue short sleeve shirt, with a long sleeve navy undershirt. He displayed a small automatic pistol in his right hand and demanded money. The bulky /stocky appearance of robber may be due to multiple layers of clothing or a bullet resistant vest.

He received less than \$5,000 and had to carry it out in his hands as he forgot a bag. It appeared that the robber used a small piece of cloth in his hand to open the front door to avoid leaving prints. He spoke good English. He did not have any noticeable scars marks or tattoos. However, only his hands and part of face were exposed.



He left on foot, and walked out of view of the bank toward the police department. It is unknown if a get-away car was waiting around the corner, or if there were any accomplices waiting. Police were on scene in approximately one minute. K-9 was unable to get a track on subject so it is believed the subject left in a car.

*FOR INFORMATION ONLY***# 7581 – SHOW CATTLE CALM - DOJ, Division of Criminal Investigation, WI**

The owner of an animal feed store in Ohio recently contacted police regarding a product called “Show Cattle Calm”. This product is sold in the feed store as a calming “drug” to calm down cattle before shows so they are easier to handle. He also sells a similar product for horses. The product is packaged in plastic plungers that allow the product to be squirted into the mouths of cows and horses. Recently, the storeowner has noticed that a number of the plungers on his shelf have been found empty. He contacted the authorities because he feels that young drug abusers are squirting the substance into a small substitute container right in the store and stealing it to use later. The storeowner did not have any knowledge about what affect the drug would have on humans.

This product has the potential to effectively commit drug-facilitated sexual assault. Show Cattle Calm is in liquid form, which is always preferred in drug, facilitated sexual assaults because it is easier to dispense and does not produce residue or grit. The product is 32 ml. in which there are 4 grams of L-Tryptophan. In sleep studies, 1-3 grams of L-Tryptophan was effective in dramatically reducing sleep latency.

This will be almost impossible to detect in the body since it’s a naturally occurring amino acid. The product also contains Valerian Root which is the number one herbal product in Europe to induce sleep, is difficult to identify, and is used in the United States in many OTC herbal sleeping products; Passion Flower which is an herb used to relax, but combined with the others will have an addictive effect and is impossible to detect; and Hops, the sedative in beer.

Several feed stores were contacted here locally and advised they do not sell “Show Cattle Calm,” but a similar product called “At Ease”. This product comes in a paste or granules, and according to the feed stores, would be easy to identify when mixed in drinks. The local feed stores also mentioned that so far they have no reason to be suspicious of the subjects purchasing the product “At Ease”.
