MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

In October 1992, the State of Wisconsin contracted for the purchase of an Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS), which allowed the Department of Justice to search electronically and store both tenprint arrest cards and unsolved latent fingerprints from crime scenes. AFIS, initiated as a Department of Justice system, has now developed into a Wisconsin statewide shared system. AFIS is now being used by 27 different law enforcement agencies throughout state.

Currently, there are nine remote Wisconsin AFIS sites that have access to a state tenprint database of more than 1,119,000 records, and an unsolved latent database of more than 10,000 latent lifts. Three of these AFIS sites (Racine Police Department, Sun Prairie Police Department and Green Bay Police Department) share their workstation with other Wisconsin law enforcement agencies. Sharing has allowed for agencies that could not afford the purchase of an AFIS workstation the capability to process their own latent searches on cases that normally would not have gone to the State Crime Laboratories for processing.

Continuing with this theme of sharing resources and data, an AFIS project is scheduled for later this year that will provide an interface between the DOJ AFIS and the Milwaukee Police Department's AFIS database. Additionally, the State of Minnesota has looked into a replacement of its current state AFIS. One of its requirements is to be able to interface with another state's AFIS, possibly with the State of Wisconsin.

DOJ is dedicated to providing the tools necessary to help Wisconsin law enforcement identify suspects and solve crimes. AFIS is one such vital tool in this ongoing partnership.

State v. Fischer **Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court-** **May 17, 2006 (2006-WI 44)**

Introduction:

This case deals with the issue of carrying a concealed weapon in a car. Earlier the Wisconsin Supreme Court had held in *State v. Hamdan*, 2003 WI 113 that the carrying a concealed weapon statute should not be applied to a Milwaukee store owner in a bad neighborhood who kept a loaded firearm in a drawer by the cash register for legitimate safety reasons. In *Fischer* the defendant argued that he should not be charged for CCW in light of *Hamdan*, because he was carrying a firearm in his vehicle for safety and self-protection reasons. The Wisconsin Supreme Court rejected Fischer's argument and held that the CCW statute could be constitutionally applied against Fischer.

Facts:

Fischer is the owner and operator of a tavern in Black River Falls. He often had large sums of money on hand at the end of a night's business and he often would take substantial amounts of cash home with him. Due to the unpredictable nature of his business Fischer was never sure whether on any given night he would be taking large amounts of cash home for deposit the next day and for that reason he always kept a loaded gun in his vehicle, even on those days he wasn't transporting cash. Fischer kept the loaded gun, with the safety on, in the vehicle's console and never brought the gun into the tavern.

Fischer felt justified in keeping the loaded gun in his car because he felt at risk because he was often transporting cash from his business. Fischer reported to the police that someone had stolen his vehicle outside his tavern after he had left it running to warm up in the cold at 2:45 am. When Fischer notified the police to report the theft he advised them that he kept a loaded gun in the car.

Trial Court:

Fischer was charged with carrying a concealed weapon. Fischer argued to the trial court that the charge should be dismissed under *Hamdan* because he was keeping the gun for legitimate safety reasons. The trial court agreed and dismissed the charge. The state appealed the dismissal to the Wisconsin Supreme Court.

The Wisconsin Supreme Court Opinion:

The Supreme Court agreed with the state and reversed the trial court dismissal. The court reasoned that Fischer's situation was different than Hamdan's and while the CCW statute was unfairly applied against Hamdan it was fairly applied against Fischer. The keys for the court were as follows:

- 1) A citizen's interest in their own security is greatest in their home or in their privately owned business and is not nearly as strong when the subject is not at either of those locations.
- 2) A citizen generally has no heightened interest in his or her right to bear arms for security while in a vehicle.
- 3) The state's interest in prohibiting concealed carry is great when the weapon is concealed in a vehicle and weak when concealed in a home or a place of business.
- 4) For a subject to avoid the CCW law when concealing a weapon in a vehicle they will have to show extraordinary circumstances.

Accordingly the court felt the CCW statute was applicable to Fischer since while he may have had more safety needs than the average citizen his needs were not so extraordinary so as to allow him to carry a concealed weapon in his vehicle.

Note: Under current court holdings a CCW charge is pretty unlikely to survive a challenge if the weapon is concealed in a home or business, but would seem to be enforceable when the weapon is concealed in a vehicle unless the subject can demonstrate extraordinary safety needs.



FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through April 2006: Ten law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2005, 15 officers were slain. Five deaths occurred in the west, three in the south, and two in the northeast. Of the ten officers slain, three were performing traffic stops, two were answering disturbance calls (one being domestic disturbance call), two were answering robbery call, two were involved in drug-related matters, and one officer was attempting other arrest. Firearms were used in all ten killings (nine handguns and one rifle). Six officers were wearing protective

vests. There have been ten separate incidents in which these ten officers have been slain. All of the ten incidents were cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Twenty-one law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2005, 13 officers were accidentally killed. Eight deaths occurred in the midwest, seven in the south, three in the west, two in the northeast, and one in Puerto Rico. Of the 21 officers killed, ten were killed in automobile accidents, five were struck by vehicles, two were killed in motorcycle accidents, two in aircraft accident, and two were accidentally shot.

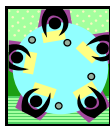
