MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague –

We wanted to once again provide you with a few key updates on the Wisconsin Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, which is part of the Department of Justice (DOJ) Bureau of Justice Information and Analysis (BJIA) in the Division of Law Enforcement Services.

The UCR program has established a working group of law enforcement professionals from around the state to assess and make a recommendation regarding law enforcement data collection on use-of-force incidents and arrest-related deaths. Our goal is to collect information that will meet federal reporting requirements, while providing useful information to local law enforcement agencies that will support training and prevention initiatives.

The FBI recently received approval to launch their use-of-force data collection program. Your agency will likely be receiving communication from the FBI regarding your potential participation in the program soon. All agencies are certainly welcome to take part in this federal data collection effort by reporting to the FBI directly. However, we wanted you to be aware that Wisconsin DOJ is moving forward with the workgroup on making a recommendation and starting the development of a Wisconsin program to be launched in 2019. This program would collect the data for both use-of-force and arrest-related deaths and send the information on to the FBI and the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) as appropriate to meet both reporting needs. You will receive additional communication from DOJ in the upcoming months as the workgroup finalizes the initial recommendations and starts the development work.

The workgroup recently conducted a survey of law enforcement agencies statewide to gain an understanding of current data collection and reporting practices and the results of the survey are being shared with all law enforcement agencies. The group is also evaluating the data currently being collected as part of the FBI's Use-of-Force Pilot Project, and what will be required under the Death In Custody Reporting Act (DCRA) for arrest-related deaths. The recommendation from the group will be brought back to various law enforcement organizations in Wisconsin and ultimately to all local agencies, prior to implementation. The collection of this data is part of our effort to provide quality data, research, and analysis to support law enforcement and criminal justice decision making in Wisconsin and to specifically support the training and information needs of local law enforcement agencies.

One of the other major changes for both the state UCR program and for local agencies is the pending statewide transition to the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). The FBI has targeted to sunset summary-based reporting by January 2021, which has set the timeline for law enforcement agencies and the state program to move fully to NIBRS. We have identified grant funding to assist agencies in the transition and will be sending that information to agencies in the coming weeks. If your agency or a group of agencies is interested in making the transition within the next year, you may want to start thinking about gaps in your current funding to prepare your agency and determine the level of effort involved with your Records Management System (RMS) vendor. We will also specifically be reaching out to sheriff's departments on their transition process as they are often the lead in any local consortiums with shared record management systems.

The UCR program is also continuing to work with sample agencies under the National Crime Statistics Exchange (NCS-X) initiative to make the transition to NIBRS, as well as to improve the state incident-based reporting (IBR) program to be more efficient and effective in the management and processing of IBR data. The system improvements are part of the preparation to assist law enforcement agencies in making the transition to IBR by 2021. We will communicate any opportunities for funding and training with local agencies when they become available. If your agency is ready to move to IBR, please contact the BJIA at statsanalysis@doj.state.wi.us or 608-266-0605.

When you Lose One of Your Own

Would you know where to turn if your agency were to ever experience the loss of an officer whether it be a line-of-duty death, suicide or medical emergency off duty? In the state of Wisconsin the Law Enforcement Death Response (LEDR) Team is a great resource available to all agencies. The LEDR Team is trained to assist with all details of a death of a law enforcement officer regardless of the circumstances. This includes:

- Death Notification
- Critical Incident Debriefings
- Peer Counseling
- Funeral Service Preparations
- PSOB – Public Safety Officer Death Benefits
- Family Support
- Media Coordination
- Agency logistics

Even when an officer dies off duty, within 24 hours of the end of a shift, there may be benefits and services that the LEDR team can assist with. The death of an officer off duty, which can be tied to their employment, is sometimes covered under the Hometown Heroes Survivors Act. If your agency ever experiences a circumstance like this please reach out to the team to see if the officer might qualify for these benefits.

LEDR also works in collaboration with Wisconsin Concerns of Police Survivors, Wisconsin Law Enforcement Memorial Board, Wisconsin Honor Guard Association, and others. LEDR is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. To reach the LEDR team during the time of an officer death call Wisconsin Department of Justice TSCC 608-266-7633. The best thing you can do for you and your agency is be prepared and hope that this is a resource you will never need to use. If the unimaginable happens please reach out to see if there is anything LEDR can do to assist your agency.





FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2018

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during 01/01/2018 through 09/28/2018:

Forty-four law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During same time period in 2017, 32 officers were slain. Circumstances encountered by the 44 victim officers upon their arrivals at the scenes of incidents are as follows:

18 investigative/enforcement (6 tactical situations, 6 investigative activity, 3 wanted persons, 1 investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, 1 handling persons with mental illness, and 1 traffic violation stop); 9 were ambushed (entrapment/premeditation); 4 were involved in pursuits (2 foot and 2 vehicular); 2 were on administrative assignments; 3 were responding to crime in progress (1 person with firearm/no shots fired, 1 robbery, and 1 burglary); 2 encountered arrest situations (attempted to restrain/control handcuffed offender); 2 encountered disorder/disturbance (1 domestic violence and 1 disturbance call); 1 was assisting another law enforcement officer (foot pursuit); 1 was assisting motorist; 1 was performing traffic control; and 1 unprovoked attack. Eighteen of the 44 victim officers were employed by law enforcement agencies in the south, 11 in the midwest, 9 in the west, 5 in the northeast, and 1 in the U.S. territory of Puerto Rico. Forty-one of the 44 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (27 handguns, 7 rifles 2 shotguns, and types of firearms

have not been reported for 5 incidents). Three victim officers were killed by the offender(s) using a vehicle as a weapon. Twenty-nine of the 44

victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at the times of the incidents. There have been 41 separate incidents in which these 44 victim officers have been slain. To date, 40 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

Thirty-two law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed in the line of duty. During same time period in 2017, 43 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 32 officers accidentally killed in 2018 are as follows: 21 were fatally injured in motor vehicle crashes while operating cars, trucks, or suvs (7 while on patrol, 3 during pursuit, 2 during training, 2 while assisting other law enforcement officers, 1 performing traffic control, 1 performing traffic enforcement, 1 during investigative/enforcement, 1 during rescue/recovery, 1 while responding to crime in progress, and 1 during other type of circumstance); 7 were pedestrian officers struck by vehicles (2 while assisting citizen(s), 1 while performing traffic enforcement, 1 while performing traffic control, 1 while in pursuit, 1 while assisting another law enforcement officer, and 1 handling disorder/disturbance); 2 were fatally injured in motorcycle crashes (1 during patrol and 1 performing traffic control); and 2 victim officers drowned while on patrol. Eighteen of the 32 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the south, 6 in the Midwest, 4 in the northeast, 3 in the west, and 1 in the U.S. territory of Puerto Rico. There have been 32 separate incidents in which these 32 victim

officers have been accidentally killed.

Incident Summaries

Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office, Kansas

Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office, Kansas, advised veteran deputy sheriff, aged 41, with over 12 years of Law Enforcement experience, was shot. On 09/16/2018, deputy was responding to call for suspicious character and received gunshot wound to neck. Deputy was able to return fire and subject died at scene. Deputy succumbed to his injuries.

Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, California

Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, California, advised deputy sheriff, aged 27, with over 4 years of law enforcement experience, was shot. On 09/17/2018, two deputies were responding to disturbance call at approximately 1:44 p.m. at business in Rancho Cordova. Shooting spanned two locations, into nearby

parking lot. Deputies, bystander, and subject were taken to area hospitals with gunshot wounds. Victim deputy was fatally shot during incident. No other fatalities; however, other deputy is stable from gunshot wound.

Bystander is stable and recovering, and subject is in custody.

Fort Worth Police Department, Texas

Fort Worth Police Department, Texas, advised veteran officer, aged 41, with over 17 years of law enforcement experience, was shot. During late night hours of 09/13/2018, and continuing through early morning hours of 09/14/2018, officers were conducting surveillance of three robbery subjects in vehicle. These individuals were believed to be involved in string of recent robberies targeting area Latino bars.

During the course of a pursuit, one of subjects, subsequently fired upon officers, striking victim officer in head. Other officers returned fire, killing subject. Victim officer was rushed to local medical facility, where he succumbed to his injuries. Officers searched area and located evidence of crime as well as other two subjects. Officers interviewed both subjects and they admitted to their participation in robbery.

Brookhaven Police Department, Mississippi

Brookhaven Police Department (Brookhaven PD), Mississippi, advised patrol officer, aged 35, with 4 months of law enforcement experience with agency and Corporal, aged 31, with over 3 years of law enforcement experience with agency were shot. On 09/29/2018, at approximately 4:48 a.m., Brookhaven PD received call in reference to shots fired at residence. Both officer and corporal were dispatched and responded to scene around 4:52 a.m. officer and corporal found a vehicle parked near residence that appeared to be abandoned and was damaged by what was believed to be bullet holes. They attempted to search area for driver or victim of vehicle and went to an out-building at residence. While checking outbuilding, subject began to fire weapon at both Officer and Corporal. Officer was struck in head by round. Corporal attempted to take subject into custody when subject presented weapon and fired at corporal striking him in neck.

After back-up officers arrived on scene, subject was taken into custody and later transported to medical facility. It appeared subject was struck seven times with rounds. Subject was found in possession of 9 mm handgun with one live cartridge. Both victim Officer and victim Corporal were transported to medical facility and pronounced deceased after all life-saving efforts were exhausted.

State v. Radder **Decided by the Court of Appeals** **May 16, 2018**

Issue:

Whether the trial court properly denied a defendant's suppression motion without a hearing. In an opinion recommended for publication the court of appeals held that the trial court's action was proper because the defendant's motion failed to even remotely show why he would he would have a chance to prevail at a hearing.

Facts:

Radder was pulled over because of expired registration. The officer noticed a strong smell of alcohol in the car and a case of beer as well as two open bottles in the vehicle. The officer also learned that Radder had previously been arrested for OWI. Radder then failed his field sobriety tests. Radder admitted to drinking two Jack and cokes and one shot. A PBT was performed with a reading of .082. Radder was arrested for OWI.

The Defendant's Argument:

Radder filed a motion to suppress evidence because the officer did not have reasonable suspicion for the stop and no probable cause for the arrest. Radder argued that these were valid arguments worthy of a hearing because both the stop and the arrest were without a warrant and thus presumptively unlawful.

The State's Argument

The state argued that both motions did not deserve a hearing because the claims were generic and without any alleged factual basis. And the State pointed out that warrantless stops and arrests are the norm in vehicular contact cases.

The Courts Holding:

The court of appeals reaffirmed that a defendant is not entitled to an evidentiary hearing every time he or she makes a pretrial motion. A hearing is necessary only if a party raises a significant, disputed factual issue. The court of appeals further held that the *Velez* test for motions is applicable in 4th amendment suppression motions. *State v. Velez*, 224 Wis.2d 1, 589 N.W.2d 9 (1999) The moving party must allege some facts, which if true, would entitle the defendant to relief, but if the defendant fails to raise a question of fact or presents only conclusory allegations, then the circuit court has the discretion to deny the motion without a hearing. The court did acknowledge that in the pretrial context it can be difficult to develop the necessary facts, but the motion must at least show that there is a reasonable probability that the defendant will establish a factual basis for his claim at a hearing. The court held that Radder could not do that, and thus the trial court properly denied his motion without a hearing.

Bottom Line:

When confronted with boiler plate motions replete with conclusory allegations and no real factual dispute, or the potential for one, your prosecutor can seek a denial of the motion without a hearing. That can potentially save you from time consuming but pointless motion hearings.
