MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague –

New Crime Laboratory Bureau Director Update

On October 2, 2017, I appointed Nikki Roehm to lead the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory Bureau (WSCLB). Nikki has worked at the WSCLB for the past ten years. She started her career in forensic science as a DNA Analyst in the Milwaukee Crime Laboratory before being appointed DNA Supervisor at the Milwaukee Crime Laboratory, and eventually Crime Laboratory Bureau Deputy Director.

Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory Bureau Update

The mission of the WSCLB is to promote excellence in analysis, training, and service to the community and our organization with integrity and uncompromising quality. The wonderful staff of the WSCLB exemplify the mission on a daily basis. Over the past year, the WSCLB has seen an increase in the number of requests for the Crime Scene Response Team and the number of cases submitted for analysis, especially for the DNA and Controlled Substance Units. It is a result of the increased demand for services that the WSCLB is bringing on additional part time positions for the Crime Scene Response Team and DNA/Forensic Biology Units.

Crime Laboratory Bureau Submission Guidelines for Controlled Substances Update

In an effort to prioritize cases, please submit controlled substance items to the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory Bureau (WSCL) after the case has been reviewed and felony charges have been filed by the district attorney's office. This will assist the WSCL in prioritizing cases by the dates needed for trial.

A few reminders on the current controlled substance submission guidelines:

- The laboratories will analyze items up to highest statutory limits based on drug type.*
- Residues, paraphernalia, and syringes will not be analyzed when a weighable quantity of a drug was found. Please do not submit these items unless they are the only item in the case.*
- Misdemeanor plant material cases will only be accepted when a trial date has been set.*
- Non-controlled pharmaceuticals should not be submitted.*

Agencies can field test on the scene or contact the laboratories to perform field testing in the fume hoods. The laboratories cannot accept large volumes of cases for charging purposes. All cases should be submitted at least 30 days prior to trial, however 60 days is preferred based on the current caseloads.

State of Wisconsin v. Damien Marketh Divone Scott Decided by the Wisconsin Court of Appeals- October 10, 2017

Issue:

The court looked at whether a vehicle can be stopped in the absence of reasonable suspicion. The court of appeals held that such a stop is permissible if it falls under the special needs doctrine.

Facts:

In the early morning hours an officer was waived down by a female outside of a bar. The female explained that she had just been the victim of an armed robbery. The victim advised that she was the owner of the bar and after closing it for the night she agreed to give two people a ride home. The two people were a patron of the bar and another person who was later named as a co-defendant of the armed robbery.

The female bar owner had an animal print purse and a bank bag with the night's proceeds from the bar. She advised the police that as soon as she got into the car with the two people she was giving a lift to, they were approached by a black male brandishing a hand gun. The black male was wearing a dark sweatshirt, with a white design on the front, and had a bandana over his face.

The robber ordered the bar owner to give him both the bank bag, as well as her purse. And the passenger who was later charged handed over two cell phones. Then the robber fled on foot, running east on Greenfield Avenue before turning into an alley between 64th and 65th street.

Other police officers became involved, and they testified that the routine procedure for such a case is to set up a perimeter around the crime scene to contain the area. Thus, because the crime had been freshly committed, an officer took up a position a block from the scene. She positioned her squad car in a way that effectively blocked the intersection and she activated her squad lights. While setting up this form of temporary roadblock she encountered three vehicles. The first was filled with people wearing work uniforms, consistent with working in a nearby factory and they were quickly released. The second vehicle had two black males, who appeared very nervous, and the passenger's sweatshirt, though worn inside out, had a design on it. Other officers responded and the vehicle occupants were ordered out of the vehicle at which time they resisted the officers. After gaining control of the two subjects and arresting them, the car was searched whereupon a pistol, a bank bag, and an animal print purse were found. The cell phones were searched confirming that one of the two who had been given the lift by the bar owner had set up the robbery with Scott. The third vehicle was allowed to pass by as

the police were already deep into investigating the second vehicle.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued that the stop of his vehicle was made without reasonable suspicion and was the product of an unlawful roadblock.

The State's Argument

The state agreed with Scott that the police did not have reasonable suspicion to stop his vehicle as all they had was that his vehicle was driving near a crime scene. But the state argued that the temporary roadblock was constitutional under the special needs exception.

The Court of Appeals Holding:

The Court of Appeals agreed with the State that the stop was justified under the special needs doctrine. The court noted that the United States Supreme Court has recognized that there are limited circumstances where the usual rule banning suspicionless stops does not apply. This is when the seizure is designed to protect special needs, beyond the normal needs for law enforcement. The type of special needs include an appropriately tailored roadblock set up to thwart an imminent terrorist attack, or to catch a dangerous criminal who is likely to flee by a particular route. On the other hands roadblocks designed to uncover ordinary criminal wrongdoing are constitutionally suspect.

In determining the reasonableness of a particular checkpoint the court should look at the 1) gravity of the public concerns served by the seizure, 2) the degree to which the seizure serves that public interest, and 3) the severity of the interference with individual liberty. In using this test here, the court of appeals looked at the tenth circuit case of *United States v. Paetsch*, where the police barricaded twenty cars on a street after learning that one of the cars had a GPS tracker that had been concealed with money stolen in a bank robbery minutes later. The police removed the occupants of all the vehicles and found the bank robber. The tenth circuit found the police activity lawful. The court applied the special needs exception and found that the public's interest in catching the bank robber, and the efficiency of the seizure, outweighed the liberty interference.

Using that logic in this case, our court of appeals found the police conduct lawful, as the checkpoint was sensibly placed right after an armed robbery and in the approximate location where a fleeing vehicle would travel. The public has a strong interest in catching an armed robber and the checkpoint was efficiently set up as revealed that the second car passing through was the proper target. And the liberty intrusion was minimal.

Caution:

This special needs doctrine is rarely applicable and must have compelling facts, both of the severity of the situation, and the possibility that the seizure will prove effective. This case does not change Wisconsin's prohibitions as to OWI and drug checkpoints, which are designed to curtail ordinary criminal activity.



FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2017

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017.

Thirty-eight law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions.

During same time period in 2016, 50 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the 38 officers slain in 2017 are as follows: 8 were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances; 6 were answering disturbance calls (3 being domestic-related); 6 were performing traffic pursuits or stops; 4 were killed in unprovoked attacks; 4 were involved in tactical situations; 3 were performing investigative activities; 2 were handling, transporting, or maintaining custody of prisoners; 1 was answering robbery call or pursuing robbery suspect(s); 1 was ambushed (entrapment/premeditation); and 3 were attempting other arrests.

Twenty-one of 38 victim officers feloniously killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 8 in the Midwest, 5 in the West, 2 in the Northeast, and 2 in the U.S. territory of Puerto Rico.

Thirty-six of 38 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (24 handguns, 8 rifles, 1 shotgun, and 3 with firearm types not reported).

One victim officer was killed by subject using a knife, and 1 succumbed to injuries received from subject using a vehicle as a weapon. Twenty-two victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at the times of the incidents, 6 were confirmed to not be wearing body armor, and body armor usage has not been reported for 10 victim officers. There have been 37 separate incidents in which these 38 victim officers have been slain. All 37 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

Forty-six law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed in the line of duty. During same time period in 2016, 45 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 46 officers accidentally killed in 2017 are as follows: 26 were fatally injured in automobile accidents, 6 were fatally struck by vehicles, 5 were fatally injured in motorcycle accidents, 5 victim officers drowned, 2 were fatally injured in aircraft accident, 1 was fatally injured in boating accident, and 1 victim officer died from asphyxiation. Twenty-five of the 46 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law enforcement

agencies in the South, 9 in the Midwest, 5 in the Northeast, 5 in the west, and 2 in the U.S. territory of Puerto Rico.

Incident Summaries

Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD), Nevada,

Police Officer, aged 34, with over 11 years of law enforcement experience, was fatally Shot on 10/01/2017. At approximately 10 p.m., shots were fired on crowd of about 2,200 spectators who were attending country music festival. Subject who was firing upon crowd had taken position in local hotel room on thirty-second floor to obtain vantage point of event. Among crowd was off-duty LVMPD officer who took action to rescue citizens. In doing so, victim officer was fatally shot, along with 58 individuals who also succumbed to injuries. In addition, over 500 other individuals were wounded during incident. Barricaded subject committed suicide as members of swat team made entry into his room.

Additional details regarding this incident are not available at this time.

Texas Tech University Police Department (TTPD), Texas,

Officer, aged 48, was fatally shot. On 10/09/2017 at approximately 8:30 p.m., subject was arrested by two TTPD officers for on-view drug law violation. Officers conducted search of subject, with negative results, handcuffed subject, and escorted him from his dorm room to one officers patrol vehicle. Officer drove subject to TTPD for processing. Upon arrival, subject was un-cuffed and placed in close proximity to officer as he was completing post-arrest paperwork. Second officer left room and subsequently heard gunshot. Subject had produced .45-caliber handgun and fatally shot victim officer in head. Subject then removed body camera from victim officer and left scene of incident.

Lubbock Police and Texas Tech University law enforcement officers formed perimeter, which was supported by Texas Department of Public Safety aircraft. After locating subject, short foot pursuit occurred. Subject was arrested and has been charged with capital murder. Weapon used in incident and broken body camera were located at separate locations in close proximity to where subject was arrested.

Subsequent investigation revealed subject was primary suspect of stolen .45-caliber firearm from individual in Lubbock, Texas. In addition, review of in-car video from victim officer's vehicle revealed, while en-route to TTPD, subject appeared to have moved something (believed to be .45-caliber handgun) around waist area of his pants.

Additional details regarding this incident are not available at this time.

Grafton Police Department, Grafton WI

It is with deep sadness that the Grafton Police Department announces the death of retired Lieutenant Fredrick Fred W. Goetz, on Tuesday, October 17, 2017, at home surrounded by his family, at the age of 77.

Lieutenant Fredrick Goetz, was an employee of the Grafton Police Department for 43 years. He began his career with the department in 1962 as a patrol officer, and quickly rose through the ranks to the position sergeant, and then lieutenant, which he held until retiring in 2005. Fred was an integral part of the department during his tenure, and he will be greatly missed.

Lieutenant Goetz is survived by his wife, and three adult children, as well as grandchildren and other family.

Wisconsin State Patrol (SPFD)

It is with deep sadness that the Wisconsin State Patrol announces the passing of retired Master Trooper Mark E. Lewis on Tuesday October 17, 2017, surrounded by his family at the age of 56.

Trooper Lewis was an employee of the Wisconsin State Patrol for 32 years. He began his career with the department in 1985 in State Patrol District 1-Deforest post. He later transferred to State Patrol District 3-Fond du Lac post until he retired in 2017. Trooper Lewis was an integral part of the organization during his tenure and he will be greatly missed.

Trooper Lewis is survived by his wife; his daughter; grandchildren, his father, brothers, sisters, as well as other family.

Girard Police Department, Ohio

Veteran officer, aged 31, was shot. On 10/21/2017, at approximately 10:15 p.m., officers responded to domestic gunfire call. Female caller reported that her boyfriend had purposely discharged firearm within residence. She also advised she was leaving residence out of safety concerns. Upon arrival at residence, subject met officers at residence doorway. With door open, both officers had brief conversation with subject. During conversation, without warning, subject pulled .40 caliber pistol from his back and fired single shot into upper torso of victim officer. Assisting officer immediately returned fire, hitting subject with three rounds. Subject was pronounced dead at scene. Victim officer succumbed to his injuries. Investigation continues.

NOVEMBER TOP COPs



Top Cops from Marquette University Police Department were keeping a watchful eye on the campus during a routine, afternoon patrol when Officer Paul Zientek saw an unresponsive woman, and quickly jumped into action. Read about the incident, submitted by Marquette University Police Chief Paul Mascari:

On Monday, August 28, 2017 at 2:38PM, PO Paul Zientek was on routine patrol in the 700 block of N. 24th St. when he observed a lone female seated in a parked vehicle. She was seated but appeared to be having a difficult time remaining conscious. PO Zientek circled the block to check on her welfare. When he returned to the vehicle he found the female was now slumped over onto the passenger side of the auto. A check revealed she was barely breathing and had a faint pulse. PO Zientek observed physical signs of intravenous drug use and also observed drug paraphernalia on the front seat. PO Zientek immediately assessed the victim had overdosed and called for our Narcan and EMS response. PO Jesse Nelson and PO Brian Larson responded to his call and assisted in removing the victim from the vehicle. The officers then administered two doses of Narcan which brought about a mild response from the victim. The Milwaukee Fire Department also responded and administered additional doses of Narcan which brought about further recovery of the victim. The victim was then transported to Aurora Sinai Medical Center where she is expected to make a full recovery.

Had it not been for the keen observation skills of PO Zientek and the quick response of PO Larson and PO Nelson, another life would surely have been lost to heroin.

“Officer Zientek’s proactive patrol and keen observation skills, along with the quick response of Officers Larson and Nelson, undoubtedly saved this woman’s life,” said Chief Paul Mascari, who nominated the officers for the Attorney General’s Top Cop award.

I couldn’t agree more, Chief. The quick action from Officers Zientek, Nelson, and Larson prevented what could have been another casualty in the fight against the opioid epidemic. Local law enforcement have been our state’s frontline of defense from the opioid epidemic – in [small towns](#), [big cities](#), and college campuses like Marquette University.

Law enforcement is also working to stop drug abuse through education and prevention efforts. On October 28, law enforcement agencies across the state will be hosting Drug Take Back Days, a national effort to collect unused and unwanted medications, in an effort to curb the diversion of prescription painkillers and to prevent medicine from ending up in our water supply.
