MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague –

As you may be aware, the WI Department of Justice (DOJ) was awarded \$2 million from the District Attorney's Office of New York (DANY) to participate in the Sexual Assault Kit (SAK) Backlog Elimination Program. The funds from this grant will allow testing and tracking of previously unsubmitted sexual assault kits currently in the possession of law enforcement agencies around the state. Whether completed at the WI State Crime Lab (WSCL) or contracted out to a private, accredited forensic crime lab, the unsubmitted kits will undergo initial DNA testing as well as a technical review and any profiles identified will be uploaded to the FBI's Combined DNA Index System (CODIS).

*Before we can begin testing, we need to compile a certified inventory of the unsubmitted kits around the state. Your department recently received a request at the beginning of March to assist us in these efforts by completing an inventory of the kits with your department. **We know the inventory process took a significant amount of time and work for many individuals and agencies and we truly appreciate your efforts.** Once each inventory is collected, DOJ will be contacting you to coordinate the submission of any kits in your possession to the WSCL. If you have not received a request to complete an inventory or have additional questions on completing your inventory, please contact the Division of Criminal Investigations (DCI) agent listed below.*

- *In addition to the DANY grant, the DOJ was also awarded \$2 million in grant funds from the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) for the National Sexual Assault Kit Initiative (SAKI). The BJA's hope is that the grant funds will support: A reduction in the number of unsubmitted SAKs;*
- *A workgroup that can identify factors which lead to unsubmitted SAKs;*
- *Collaborative development of procedures and practices surrounding the successful investigation and prosecution of SAK cases;*
- *Development of victim notification protocols, particularly surrounding the testing of previously unsubmitted kits;*
- *Evaluation and enhancement of victim services.*

This grant is also funding a multidisciplinary team that will offer additional resources to jurisdictions around the state to ensure a thorough and timely follow-up for investigations that result from the testing of unsubmitted sexual assault kits. This team, the DOJ Sexual Assault Response Team (SART), is comprised of a Division of Criminal Investigation agent, an assistant attorney general, an assistant district attorney in the Milwaukee County DA's Office, a victim services specialist, and a data analyst.

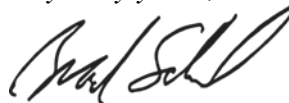
*The DOJ SART stands ready to assist law enforcement agencies and prosecutors with criminal investigations, victim notifications, prosecutions, or other processes that may come as a result of the testing of previously unsubmitted SAKs. **More information and updates will follow as we begin testing the kits, but please do not hesitate to reach out for assistance.***

In addition to the multidisciplinary work within DOJ, significant collaboration will be required at the local level. Now is the time to contact victim advocates, sexual assault nurse examiners, and prosecutors in your county to discuss your response strategy should one of the unsubmitted kits from your department return a DNA profile that will require follow-up. Work with victim advocates to create a victim notification protocol that will mutually benefit victims, your agency, and other critical partners. Any effort to reduce the potential re-traumatization to a victim is vital.

The DOJ is glad to be a part of this collaborative effort throughout the state to develop a comprehensive, statewide initiative to not only address the state's backlog of unsubmitted sexual assault kits, but also to improve the criminal justice response to sexual assault cases. State v. Mastella Jackson Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court-7/01/16

Issue:

This case involved the applicability of the inevitable discovery doctrine. In ruling for the state, the court made two important points: 1) It abandoned the three pronged test analysis in favor of a more totality of the circumstances look at the issue, recognizing that there can be occurrences when the doctrine would be applicable even though a separate ongoing investigatory activity had not been started prior to the constitutional violation. 2) The state does not have to show good faith on the part of the officers who violated a subject's constitutional rights to take advantage of the doctrine. Rather, it is sufficient if the state can show by a preponderance of the evidence that the evidence would have inevitably been discovered if the violation(s) had not transpired.

Facts:

The police were dispatched to the Road Star Inn as a male had been found in one of the hotel rooms lying face down and covered in blood. When the officers arrived at the hotel room they saw a lot of blood in the room area and were told that the male had been pronounced dead. The victim had suffered approximately twenty five stab wounds.

Subsequent investigation pointed to the deceased's wife, the defendant, as the possible perpetrator. The victim and defendant were known to have previous marital problems, and a person whose gender could not be determined because

the person was wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt that covered the head and face, had been seen entering the room, and shortly thereafter leave the hotel. The police also talked to a child the victim and defendant had in common, and the child advised that his mother had left him for a period of time and when she returned she took a shower, and told him not to tell anyone that she had ever left.

The police made contact with the defendant and drove her to the police department to be interviewed. In the interview room the police told the defendant that she was not under arrest and was free to go whenever she wanted. They did not read her the Miranda warning. Then the police began to question her. During the interview the defendant complained of not feeling well, of being exhausted, of having pain, and wanting a cigarette. The defendant asked the police if they could do the interview another time, and complained that she could not continue with the interview because of stomach pain. Finally the defendant told the police that she wanted to go home and didn't want to talk. Nevertheless the questioning continued and after getting the defendant food, she eventually made many incriminating statements as to her interaction with her husband.

Based in part on the defendant's incriminating statements, the police obtained a search warrant for the defendant's home and then took the defendant to her home during the search. At the home the defendant took the police to a garbage can in the garage, where they found the knife and the clothing she wore when she went to the hotel to confront her husband.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued that her constitutional rights were violated by the

police continuing to question her without Miranda and after she had complained of not feeling well, of wanting to go home, and of not wanting to talk anymore. The defendant argued that her statements were wrongfully obtained and that the search warrant was thus invalid and the subsequent discovery of the knife was a byproduct of illegally obtained statements. The defendant further argued, that the state should not be allowed to take advantage of the inevitable discovery doctrine in cases where the police intentionally engaged in wrongful contact.

The State's Argument:

The state conceded that the defendant's admissions were invalid since the police were not sensitive to her complaints and to her wishes. But, the state argued that they would have gotten the search warrant without her statements, and would have found the knife without her assistance, and so the evidence should be admissible under inevitable discovery even though the defendant's statements were properly suppressed.

The Court's Holding

The Wisconsin Supreme Court held that the defendant's statements were properly suppressed by the trial court since the police should have read Miranda as they acted as though she was not free to go, and should have been sensitive to her expressed wish to end the interview and to go home. But, the court also held that even after removing the defendant's wrongfully obtained statements from the affidavit for the search warrant, there was still probable cause for a search warrant for the defendant's home. The court also held that even though the defendant should not have been in a position to show the police where the knife was, the police would have found it without her help since it was secreted in a place where the police had every intention of looking. Thus the inevitable discovery doctrine was applicable and the knife and clothing should be admissible at trial.

The Court fleshed out the inevitable discovery doctrine, holding that the old three pronged test should be abandoned, and instead the state needed to show that even without the wrongfully obtained statements or other evidence, they would have inevitably discovered the evidence they now sought to admit. In other words, the fruit of the poisoned tree doctrine does not apply if the evidence would have been discovered anyway, without any reliance on the police violation. The court rejected the notion that the state must show that there was an ongoing investigative activity prior to the violation (one of the old three prongs), and further rejected the contention that the state must show good faith on the part of the police as a precondition for the application of the inevitable discovery doctrine.

Cautionary Note:

While this case makes it a bit easier to argue the inevitable discovery doctrine, it is still not an easy argument to make. Naturally, as always, the police should seek to make this doctrine unnecessary by not committing any constitutional violations. And the police should be mindful that if they do not wish to read Miranda and seek to make the contact non-custodial they should act in conformity with that intent. A refusal to properly respond to a subject's expressed wish to go home and wish to have an interview end, will render the contact custodial and also has voluntariness implications.



FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2016

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January 1, 2016 through September 1, 2016.

40 law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions.

During same time period in 2015, 26 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the 40 officers slain in 2016 are as follows: ; 10 were ambushed by entrapment or premeditation; 6 were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances; 6 were answering disturbance calls (4 being domestic-related); 4 were killed in unprovoked attacks; 3 were involved in tactical situations; 3 were performing investigative activities; 3 were performing traffic pursuits or stops; 2 were involved in drug-related matters; 1 was answering burglary calls or pursuing burglary suspects; 1 was answering robbery call or pursuing robbery suspect(s); and 1 was attempting other arrest.

24 of the 40 victim officers feloniously killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 7 in the Midwest, 7 in the West, 1 in the Northeast, and 1 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico.

Thirty-Seven of the 40 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (20 handguns, 13 rifles, and 4 firearm types not reported). Three victim officers were intentionally killed by subjects using vehicles as weapons.

Thirteen victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at time of incidents, 3 were confirmed to not be wearing body armor, and body armor usage has not been reported for 24 victim officers. There have been 33 separate incidents in which these 40 victim officers have been slain. Thirty-Two of the 33 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

Twenty-Eight law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During same time period in 2015, 31 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 28 officers accidentally killed in 2016 are as follows: 15 were fatally injured in automobile accidents, 5 were fatally struck by vehicles, 5 were fatally injured in motorcycle accidents, 1 was fatally injured in aircraft accident, 1 victim officer drowned, and 1 victim officer was thrown from horse resulting in fatal injuries. Fourteen of the 28 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 7 in the Midwest, 5 in the West, and 2 in the Northeast.

Incident Summaries

San Diego Police Department (SDPD), California

Veteran Police Officer, with over 15 years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 07/28/2016. At approximately 10:55 am., officer and his partner contacted two pedestrians. Victims' partner, who was also an officer with SDPD, exited passenger side of patrol vehicle and approached both subjects. One subject was armed with handgun and fired multiple shots at victims' partner, striking him in upper body. Shooting subject then approached patrol vehicle and fired multiple shots at victim officer, striking him in neck. Victim officer returned fire, striking shooting subject in torso.

Both subjects fled scene on foot. Victim officers radioed in providing direction of travel for fleeing subjects. Victim partner was transported to local hospital and is expected to recover from his injuries. Victim officer was transported by fellow officers to local hospital, but succumbed to his injuries.

Wounded subject was located and arrested short distance from scene of incident. At time of his arrest, he was wearing holster and handgun was found concealed in close proximity. Second subject was located and arrested following day at his residence after having stand-off with SDPD SWAT.

Tennessee Bureau of Investigation

Special Agent, Aged 35, with 6 months law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 08/09/2016 at approximately 2pm. Agent, who was acting in undercover capacity, was seated in front of vehicle with confidential human source (CHS) and was attempting to conduct controlled buy with subject. Subject, who was seated in back seat of vehicle, attempted to rob undercover agent and CHS. During robbery attempt, subject fired one round and fatally shot victim agent in back of neck. Subject then fled, but was apprehended less than half mile from scene of incident. Victim agent was transported to local hospital where he was pronounced deceased. Subject has been arrested and charged with first degree murder.

Sebastian County Sheriff's Office (Sebastian County SO), Arkansas

Veteran Deputy Sheriff, Aged 66, with over 15 years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 08/10/2016. At approximately 7:00 am., several deputies from Sebastian County SO and officers from Hackett Police Department (Hackett PD) were responding to domestic issue. Upon arriving on scene, they observed subject on porch of residence with rifle and possibly wearing ballistic vest.

Subject pointed rifle at arriving officers and they took cover along perimeter of property. Subject began firing at officers, injuring two. Injured officers were extracted from scene and transported to local hospital. Victim deputy succumbed to injuries later that day from neck

wound, where round fired by subject, entered above his ballistic vest. Chief of Police of Hackett PD was treated for his wound(s) and released. Subject surrendered to authorities later that morning.

Hatch Police Department, New Mexico

Patrol Officer, Aged 33, with two years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 08/12/2016. At approximately 3:30 pm., officer notified dispatch he was conducting routine traffic stop and requested backup unit to scene.

Within minutes, assistance arrived and observed shot fired at officer, which struck him in neck. Backup officer fired three rounds at vehicle as it sped away from scene. Backup officer stayed with victim officer, requested medical assistance, and provided description of three subjects in vehicle.

Two of three subjects were later located and arrested without incident. Numerous deputies from Dona Ana County Sheriff's Office participated in manhunt and pursuit of third subject, who had abandoned his vehicle and carjacked another vehicle, shooting and wounding driver. Subject was stopped after deployment of tire deflation device and surrendered without further incident.

Victim officer was flown to medical facility in another state. After numerous surgeries, victim officer succumbed to his injuries later that night.

Eastman Police Department, Georgia

Police Officer, Aged 31, was fatally shot on 08/13/2016. At approximately 9:30pm., officer was dispatched to citizens 911 complaint concerning person in roadway with weapon. Upon arrival, officer observed subject.

Officer was shot while exiting patrol car and ordered subject to move towards area with better lighting.

Victim officer was able to identify subject before subject fled area. Victim officer was transported to local medical facility, but succumbed to his injuries during early morning hours on 08/14/2016. Subject was arrested during traffic stop in Florida on 08/15/2016.

Maryville Police Department, Tennessee

Veteran Officer, Aged 32, with over nine years of law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot 08/25/2016. At approximately 4pm., officer heard call while working on unrelated matter with deputy from Blount County Sheriff's Office and both voluntarily responded to domestic dispute, where subject threatened to kill his father with .45 caliber handgun.

Officer and deputy positioned vehicle approximately 70 yards away from residence. Unknown to subject, his father had escaped residence. Officer and deputy contacted father, at which point subject fired multiple rounds from makeshift bunker inside opened garage of residence with .45 caliber handgun. Officer and deputy took cover with father behind engine block and front wheel of vehicle; however, officer was shot in neck by subject.

Victim officer was transported to medical center where he succumbed to his injuries. Subject was taken into custody after exchange of gunfire with officers at scene. Subject was charged with criminal homicide and four counts of aggravated assault.
