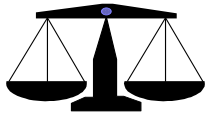

Maryland v. Pringle
Decided by the United States Supreme Court,
December 2003

Legal Issue:

When contraband, evidence, or drugs are found in the passenger compartment of an automobile and none of the occupants claim ownership, whom may the police arrest. The United States Supreme Court held that in such a circumstance the police have sufficient probable cause to arrest all the vehicle occupants.

Facts:

The police made a valid traffic stop. During the course of the traffic stop the police discovered drugs in the passenger compartment of the vehicle. The police confronted the driver and the passengers with their discovery of the criminal evidence and all denied any knowledge of the drugs or had any information as to how the drugs ended up in the vehicle. Ultimately the police arrested the driver and the passengers.

The defendant's argument:

The defendant Pringle who was a passenger sought dismissal of the charges against him because the police did not have sufficient probable cause to arrest him. The defendant reasoned that his mere presence in a vehicle was not a sufficient basis for believing he had any connection to the drugs, particularly when he denied ownership and none of the other occupants claimed that he, Pringle, had any knowledge of or ownership interest in the drugs.

The state's argument:

The state argued that the police had sufficient probable cause to arrest Pringle. The state reasoned that the close proximity of the drugs to Pringle made it logical to conclude that Pringle had a criminal connection to the drugs.

The court's holding:

The United States Supreme Court held that the arrest of Pringle was valid. The court held that when drugs are found in the passenger compartment of a vehicle there is probable cause to believe that the driver and any or all of the passengers have a criminal connection to the illegal drugs. Consequently the court held that when the police are faced with a situation where drugs or other contraband are found in the passenger compartment and where there is no evidence specifically linking the criminal evidence to one person it is fair for the police to conclude that they have sufficient probable cause to arrest all the occupants. This United States Supreme Court case reaffirms the earlier Wisconsin case of State v. Riddle where the Wisconsin appellate court held similarly that evidence in the passenger compartment is a sufficient basis upon which to arrest all the vehicle occupants.

Note:

It should be noted that it is likely the decision would be different if the drugs had been found in the vehicle's trunk. In such a scenario the police would likely be allowed to only arrest the owner and or the driver as the passengers absent other evidence would be too remote to the trunk for a finding of probable cause that they were connected to the illegal drugs. Also when the police arrest all the occupants ala Pringle it is likely that as the case develops the prosecutor may ultimately determine not to charge all the people that were arrested although all the arrests were legally valid.



Crime Laboratory Kits

Effective March 1, 2004, Crime Laboratory Evidence Collection kits to include The Sexual Assault Collection kit for Victims, The Sexual Assault Collection kit for Suspects and the Biological Stain collection kit (addressed for the Madison or Milwaukee Laboratories) will no longer be available at the laboratories themselves.

They will now be available through the Wisconsin Department of Administration's Document Sales Unit. Kits may be ordered over the telephone with the use of a credit card, or picked up at the Document Sales counter with payment by credit card or check. Document Sales does not bill agencies, therefore **prepayment is required**.

Mushrooms or Cacti?

The controlled substances Psilocin and Psilocybin are found in the Psilocybe mushrooms. Psilocybe mushrooms are readily distinguishable from other more common mushrooms.

Recently the Crime Laboratories received submissions of material believed to be Psilocybe mushrooms. However, the appearance of this material is quite different from that of Psilocybe mushrooms. The physical appearance is that of sliced and dried cucumbers. These materials are not mushrooms but do contain the controlled substance Mescaline.



Mescaline is a hallucinogenic drug typically found in Peyote cactus. The Peyote cactus can be found in the desert regions of the southern United States and northern Mexico. When the Peyote cactus is processed, it looks like a dried button having a cotton ball in its middle.

The material recently submitted as Psilocybe mushrooms is believed to be either the Peruvian Torch or San Pedro cacti from South America. These are tubular-type cacti. When processed, the spines are removed, then sliced and dried giving them the appearance of dried cucumbers with green edges. The Peruvian Torch and San Pedro cacti contain Mescaline. Mescaline has a traditional use among Native American tribes and has similar effects to LSD or Psilocybe mushrooms leading to a dream-like trance state.

State Crime Laboratory in Madison is Moving March 22

The State Crime Laboratory located in Madison will be moving to its new laboratory facility during the week of March 22. We are asking for law enforcement's help to make this move as smooth as possible.

Until the move is completed, we are asking that no more weapons for destruction be transported to the Madison laboratory. Please hold these weapons at your facility until after the move. In addition, from March 16th through the 29th, please do not transport any evidence to the laboratory that is not of the highest priority. We hope to make this a smooth transition and hope to be working at full capacity shortly after the move. If emergencies arise, we will facilitate getting your analyses completed at one of the other laboratories. Your help and cooperation in this effort is greatly appreciated.

TO ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL:

Wisconsin Division of Motor Vehicles changes Instruction Permits for persons age 18 and over.

Beginning March 1, 2004, Instruction Permits issued to persons age 18 and over will contain a photograph. Instruction Permits (IP) issued to person under the age of 18 will not be affected by this change. Under age 18 IPs will display the "Valid without Photo" verbiage in the photo area on the card.

Instruction Permits issued prior to March 1, 2004, to persons age 18 and over that do not contain a photograph are still valid to the expiration date listed on the IP unless cancelled, suspended, or revoked for other reasons.

Instruction Permits to operate a Class D vehicle are valid for 12 months.

Instruction Permits to operate a commercial vehicle, motorcycle, or special designed vehicle are valid for 6 months.

WILENET Access to Driver Records

In late December of 2002, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, along with the Department of Justice, implemented a secure application on the DOJ's WILENET web site that easily enables law enforcement, courts and district attorneys to request certified copies of driver records.

From January through December of 2003, over 11,500 certified driver records were requested through this secure web site. We anticipate even more growth over the coming year.

If you are not currently using WILENET to request your certified driver records, please visit www.wilenet.org. Click on Register and view the Access Policy to obtain approval to access this site.

The WILENET web site should be used to request certified records, however if you need a certified record for a court date that is less than two weeks in the future you may fax the request to (608) 267-1873.

The teletype mnemonic DRNS is no longer operational. You no longer have the ability to teletype a request for a certified driver record.

FBI OFFICERS KILLED



Incident Summaries

Athens Police Department, Alabama, Veteran Officer, aged 40, with over 15 years law enforcement experience with agency and Sergeant, aged 42, with over 19 years law enforcement experience with agency were fatally shot on 01/02/2004. At approximately 12:45 p.m., subject called agency's 911 emergency number and stated he had problem and needed dispatcher to send FBI Agent. 911 operator advised they are emergency number and could not dispatch FBI, he would have to call FBI directly to speak with them. Few minutes later, subject call 911 emergency number back and told them if they could not send FBI, he needed police officer to come to his residence as soon as possible. Officer was dispatched to residence and sergeant was sent as back-up for officer. At approximately 12:50 p.m., officer arrived at subject's residence. Before he could get out of his patrol vehicle, numerous gunshots were fired by subject using SKS 7.62 rifle. Victim officer was shot three times in chest, through his ballistic vest, and also in neck and head. It is believed at least 11 shots were fired at his vehicle, most of them going through his windshield. Sergeant arrived less than minute behind victim officer and was getting out of his patrol vehicle when he was fired upon. Victim sergeant, while wearing ballistic vest, was shot several times. Shortly after shots were fired, subject exited residence while holding rifle. He placed firearm on ground and began walking around house with hands up. Individual exited neighboring house and told subject to lay down on ground with his hands out. Subject remained on ground until additional law enforcement officers arrived. Victim officer's seatbelt was still partially buckled and his vehicle was not in park when fatally shot by subject, he subsequently died at scene of incident. Victim sergeant succumbed to his injuries prior to arriving at nearby hospital. Subject has been charged with one count for killing each law enforcement officer, one count each for shooting into occupied vehicle, and one count each for killing more than one person at time. Subject is believed to be paranoid schizophrenic who had been involuntarily committed to mental hospital this past summer and has abused drugs and alcohol. He was under influence of alcohol at time of incident.

Orleans Parish Criminal Sheriff's Office (OPCSO), Louisiana, Veteran Deputy, aged 50, with over 10 years law enforcement experience with agency was feloniously shot on 01/08/2004. At approximately 11:40 a.m., three individuals entered local bank wearing masks and brandishing handguns. Subject #1 confronted deputy, working off-duty as security for bank. Deputy was at bank lobby table signing register book when subject #1 placed handgun to deputy's neck and disarmed him of his 9-millimeter handgun. Subject #2, wearing OPCSJ jacket, confronted bank manager. Subject #3, with handgun and umbrella, took control of lobby. Unbeknownst to subjects, deputy had arrived to replace OPCSJ captain, who was in small alcove on right side front of bank, where he was not seen. Gun battle ensued between subjects #1 and #3, and two off-duty law enforcement officers. Deputy was fatally struck in upper-right chest area; captain was wounded in right foot. Subject #1 received wounds to left hand and left thigh area, and subject #3 was hit in left rear thigh. Gun battle lasted approximately one minute and afterwards three subjects left bank. Subjects #1 and #2 were captured by responding law enforcement personnel in vicinity of getaway car, and subject #3 was apprehended in bank parking lot. Victim officers were transported to local hospital. Victim deputy was pronounced dead, and victim captain is in stable condition. Each subject was charged with bank robbery resulting in death.

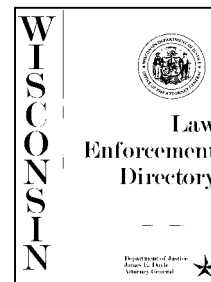
St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department (SLMPD), Missouri, Officer, aged 24, with three years law enforcement experience with agency was feloniously shot on 01/30/2004. Officer and his partner were assigned to "Weed and Seed" program of SLMPD. Information from confidential informant was received regarding drug transaction. While on patrol, officers observed subject parked at liquor store. Officers saw what they believed to be end of drug transaction between subject and unknown subject. Before officers arrived at scene, unknown subject departed. Officers confronted subject in car and ordered him from car. While being searched, subject resisted and struggle ensued. Subject obtained officer's service weapon and fatally shot victim officer in chest, narrowly missing ballistic vest. Victim officer's partner fired several rounds at subject, striking him in upper torso. Subject's gunfire wounded officer in lower abdomen, left hip, and left shoulder. Subject attempted to flee scene but was found fatally wounded approximately 100 yards away between two parked vehicles. Wounded officer was transported to hospital and is expected to recover.

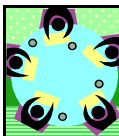
