Illinois v. Caballes
Decided by the United States Supreme Court
on January 24, 2005

Issue:

In this case the United States Supreme Court dealt with the issue of the constitutionality of dog sniffs. Specifically the court held that the police do not need reasonable suspicion for a dog sniff conducted in a public area.

Facts:

An Illinois State Trooper stopped the defendant for speeding on an interstate highway. When the trooper radioed the police dispatcher to report the stop, a second trooper overheard the transmission and immediately headed to the scene with his narcotics-detection canine. While the stopping trooper was in the process of writing the defendant a warning ticket the other trooper arrived, canine in tow. The second trooper walked the canine around the defendant's vehicle and the dog alerted on the trunk. Based on that alert the officers searched the trunk and found marijuana and arrested the defendant. The entire contact took approximately ten minutes.

Defendant's Position:

The defendant argued that the marijuana evidence should be suppressed. The defendant reasoned that the police, at the minimum, need an articulable reasonable suspicion before employing a canine to sniff an automobile during a routine traffic stop.

The State's Position:

The state argued that the dog sniff was permissible because the defendant did not have an expectation of privacy in the exterior of his automobile.

The Court's Holding:

The United States Supreme Court agreed with the state and held that the marijuana was lawfully seized. The court reasoned that a well-trained narcotics-detection dog sniffing the exterior of an automobile does not implicate the 4th amendment. Specifically, a dog sniff conducted during a lawful traffic stop that reveals no information other than the location of a substance that no individual has any right to possess does not violate the 4th amendment. Accordingly the police do not need reasonable suspicion to employ a dog sniff of a vehicle in a public area.

Note:

It is important to remember that in this case the dog arrived quickly, before the original traffic stop had been completed. If however the dog is not readily available, waiting for the dog beyond the normal time frame for the traffic encounter is a 4th amendment event and would require either consent or a reasonable suspicion of drug activity to justify the detention of the subject and his vehicle until the canine can arrive.

Unified Tactical Instructor Update Training

Time is running out for Unified Tactical (UT) instructors to register for this year's update training. Nearly half of the remaining 30 sessions are already full. No makeup sessions will be offered.

All certified Firearms, DAAT, EVOC, Vehicle Contacts and Professional Communication instructors certified the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board are required to attend annual update training. Failure to attend an update session could jeopardize your status as an instructor. Keep in mind that if you are a UT instructor and did not attend the 2002 update, you will be decertified if you fail to attend the 2004-05 update. (The 2003 annual UT update was not offered due to budget constraints.)

This year's Unified Tactical (UT) update focuses on developing, conducting and evaluating teaching scenarios. While the update is not mandatory for instructors of non-UT subjects, the Law Enforcement Standards Board encourages all certified instructors to attend the training.

There is no cost to attend an update. The Training & Standards Bureau provides the instructors, all training materials and lunch.

WILENET – Your Choice for Law Enforcement Information

Are you looking for a listing of Unified Tactical Update Training sites? Do you need to know the latest information on HR 218? Are your Field Training Officers looking for training tools? Does your department need to update policies?

You can find answers to these questions and more on WILENET – Wisconsin's Law Enforcement website – www.wilenet.org. The Department of Justice and other agencies use WILENET as the means of sharing information with law enforcement officers throughout Wisconsin. More than 1700 officers access the site each day.

Here is a small sample of the information you can find on WILENET –

- WILENET is your resource for criminal justice training courses. More than 400 courses being offered by technical colleges and law enforcement agencies throughout Wisconsin are currently posted on WILENET. Course offerings can be searched by subject matter or location.
- The Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 – HR 281 – has generated considerable interest among active and retired law enforcement officers. WILENET provides the latest information on the state's implementation of this federal legislation.
- The Squad Room feature on WILENET provides more than 200 training scenarios. Tactics, ethics, legal issues and problem-oriented policing are just some topics covered in the Squad Room.
- WILENET provides the latest model policies from the International Association of Chiefs of Police. In a deal brokered by the Training & Standards Bureau of the Department of Justice, these policies and the accompanying concepts and issues papers are provided to Wisconsin agencies at no cost.
- The Department of Corrections uses WILENET to deliver two services to law enforcement – the Sex Offender Registry Database and an offender search program known as DOC Locator. Both sites include offender photos.
- The Department of Transportation also provides information to the law enforcement community via WILENET. A listing of current driving revocations and suspensions is posted to WILENET each month. Police agencies and district attorneys' office also use WILENET to request certified driving records from DOT.

In addition to providing useful, timely information for the criminal justice community, WILENET has allowed the Department of Justice to utilize its staff more efficiently. WILENET has also reduced printing and mailing costs which are necessary given the state's current budget situation.

**WISCONSIN
DAYLIGHT SAVINGS LAW
RULED AGAINST**

The facts of the case are not disputed. April 6, 2003 was the date on which Daylight Savings took effect. Wis. Stat. § 175.095(2) provides that DST begins at 1:00 a.m. Thus, according to the statute, at 1:00 a.m., April 6, 2003, it became 2:00 a.m., April 6, 2003.

On April 6, 2003, Bull-Feathers, a Madison bar located on State Street, apparently did not advance its clocks at 1:00 a.m. At 1:55, Bull-Feathers' time, patrons continued to be inside the bar. Madison police, operating under the assumption that the time was now 2:55 due to the time change, cited Bull-Feathers for a violation of Madison General Ordinance § 38.06(7)(b), prohibiting bars from being open between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.¹

The review of the case [*City of Madison v. Bull-Feathers, Inc.*, Dane Co., Wis. Cir. Ct. (Branch 5) case no. 04-CV-1279] is based on the narrow legal question regarding whether the WI statute falls within the exemption provided in the federal law.

(Wis. Stat. § 175.095(2) which reads): From 1 a.m. on the first Sunday in April until 2 a.m. on the last Sunday in October of each year, the standard of time in this state shall be one hour in advance of that prescribed in s. 175.09(1).

(15 W.S.C. § 260a(a). [H]owever, (1) any state that lies entirely within one time zone may by law exempt itself from the provisions of this subsection providing the advancement of time, but only if that law provides that the entire State (including all

political subdivisions thereof) shall observe the standard time otherwise applicable during that period,

Judge Nicks determined the WI statute does NOT fall within the federal exemption because the exemption provides that states can either follow daylight savings time or continue with Standard time not create a new starting time or date. The court concludes that since the WI statute does **not** fall within the federal exemption the police entered Bullfeathers at 1:55 and not 2:55. Bullfeathers then did not violate Madison's city ordinance.

All of this is based on the Uniform Time Act of 1966 which provides:

During the period commencing at 2 o'clock at 2 o'clock antemeridian on the first Sunday in April of each year and ending at 2 o'clock antemeridian on the last Sunday in October of each year, the standard time of each zone . . . shall be advanced one hour.

¹ "No premises for which a Retail Class B license shall be issued shall be permitted to remain open between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on weekdays and between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on Saturdays and Sundays, except that on January 1 the premises are not required to close." Madison General Ordinance § 38.06(7)(b)

FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January 2005: Four law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2004, four officers were slain. In 2005, two officers were slain in the midwest, one in the south, and one in the west. Of the four officers slain, one was answering robbery call, one was attempting other arrests, one was investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, and one was performing traffic stop. Firearms were used in all of the killings (three handguns, one rifle). One officer was wearing protective vest. There have been four separate incidents in which these four officers have been slain. Three of the four incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Two law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2004, four officers were accidentally killed. In 2005, both officers were killed in automobile accidents in the midwest.

Incident Summaries

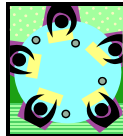
Pendergrass Police Department, Georgia, Police Officer, aged 45, with less than one year law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 12/29/2004. At approximately 8:15 p.m., Officer was pursuing vehicle containing two subjects when fleeing vehicle crashed. Victim Officer, not being involved in crash, exited patrol vehicle. While Victim Officer was approaching crashed vehicle, subject, using handgun, fatally shot Victim Officer in head. Both subjects were apprehended and arrested.

Columbus Division of Police, Ohio, Veteran Police Officer, aged 33, with eight years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 01/06/2005 at approximately 11 a.m. Officer was working as "Special Deputy" security guard at local bank. Officer was standing behind teller counter when unknown subject entered with intention of robbing bank. Subject ordered three employees to floor and announced robbery. Gun battle ensued between Officer and subject. Victim Officer was wounded from gunshot wound to upper torso area, just above his ballistic vest. Total of 14 shots were fired, seven from Victim Officer and seven from subject. Victim Officer was transported to area medical center where he succumbed to injuries shortly after arrival. Subject received injury but was able to flee scene. Subject remains unknown and investigation continues.

Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department, North Carolina, Veteran Patrol Officer, aged 36, with six years law enforcement experience was fatally shot on 01/18/2005 at approximately 1 a.m. Officer stopped vehicle after it was seen swerving. Officer approached vehicle and determined that driver of vehicle did not have driver's license. Subject first provided officer with fictitious name. Passenger in vehicle told subject to provide Officer with his true name. After subject provided officer with correct name, it was discovered that subject was wanted for probation violation in another county in North Carolina. Struggle ensued when Officer attempted to make arrest with subject obtaining Officer's .40 caliber Glock pistol. Witnesses advised that Officer was lying on ground with subject standing over top of Officer pointing pistol towards him. Officer was heard to say just prior to being shot for subject not to shoot. Subject fired two rounds into Victim Officer's head and one into his shoulder. Subject fled scene and was involved in car chase and shootout with three other police officers. Subject surrendered after firing at officers.

Greenwood County Sheriff's Office, Kansas, Veteran Sheriff, aged 42, with over 18 years law enforcement experience (Sheriff since 2000) was fatally shot on 01/19/2005 at approximately 9:50 a.m. Sheriff, along with two deputies, traveled to subject's residence to serve state warrant for parole violation. Occupants of residence advised subject was not there. When Sheriff was allowed entry into residence, subject, who was hiding, shot Sheriff. It took deputies five to ten minutes to extricate Sheriff. Sheriff was transported to area hospital where he was later pronounced dead. Subject barricaded himself within residence. Other occupants fled but were apprehended by law enforcement. At approximately 5:30 p.m., after numerous attempts to negotiate with subject, Kansas Highway Patrol Special Response Team made entry into residence and took subject into custody without further incident.

Media Relations Management Training

The Training and Standards Bureau will be funding six regional sessions for Law Enforcement Executives in media relations management during 2005. These 1.5 day sessions will provide the opportunity to examine a number of media relations issues and provide hands on experience for Executives, Command officers, and PIO's to improve their skills in public communication. There will be also an opportunity to prepare press releases and participate in videotaped exercises.

The sessions will be taught by Dr. Jim Haney. Haney is an associate professor of communication at the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point, where he teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in public relations and media. He is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Ripon College and earned his master's degree and Ph.D. at the University of Iowa. Haney served for nearly ten years as the Director of Research and Information for the Wisconsin Department of Justice. In that post, he managed all communication activities for the 600-person agency, supervised all media contacts and served as the press secretary/chief spokesman for the Attorney General. He has coordinated media relations on many sensitive law enforcement cases including the investigation of the Milwaukee Police Department's handling of the Jeffrey Dahmer case, numerous homicide cases and investigations into other serious crimes. For six months, he also served as acting communication director for the National Association of Attorneys General in Washington, D.C. and assisted attorneys general around the country on high profile lawsuits against the major tobacco companies and Microsoft Corporation. He has provided media relations training for law enforcement officers, prosecutors and public information officers. Haney's previous experience includes work as a radio news reporter and news director. He has been a consultant for a number of businesses, public officials and political candidates. He has won the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point's "Excellence in Teaching Award" and "Mentor Award" for outstanding student advising. In 1998, Haney was the first non-lawyer in the country to ever win the National Association of Attorneys General "Marvin Award" for being an outstanding staff member in the office of a state attorney general.

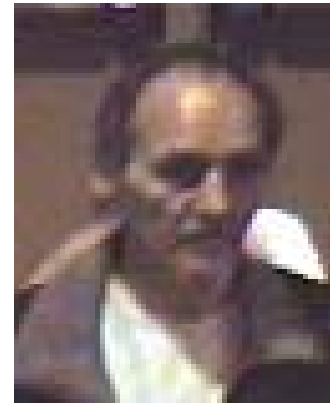
