## MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

*Dear Law Enforcement Official:*

*A powerful forensic evidence analysis system, available to Wisconsin law enforcement through the State Crime Lab - Milwaukee, continues its work as one of the Wisconsin Department of Justice's most successful crime-fighting tools. The NIBIN system has amassed more than 1500 hits since its inception in 1995.*

*NIBIN, National Integrated Ballistics Information Network, is an image generating and searching instrument that enables the laboratory to compare fired cartridge casings from different shooting incidents in order to determine if the same firearm was used in separate incidents. This method could potentially link different incidents from different law enforcement agencies, thus providing useful investigative information. Because the characteristics that are left on the cartridge casing are unique to a single weapon, it is not necessary to have the weapon to compare casings from different incidents. NIBIN can also be used to compare fired bullets. Seized weapons can be test fired at the laboratory and checked against the image database.*

*The NIBIN system is supported by the ATF and is part of the Safe Neighborhood Program. The Milwaukee laboratory has two input stations and generates images for law enforcement agencies from across the entire state. Images obtained can be searched against databases in any other state if an agency believes that a shooting incident is possibly related to crimes committed elsewhere.*

*NIBIN is most useful in high crime areas where there is serial use of a gun linking drug or gang related crimes or where investigation suggests that multiple crimes have been committed by one person or group. What items can be submitted?*

*Submit cartridge casings or bullets from any scene that your agency determines is appropriate. Damaged bullets may not be suitable for entry into the database. Guns should only be submitted when they can be associated with a person, or to further the investigation of a crime (i.e. a drug house or gangs). Weapons should not be test-fired before submitting. Some types and calibers of weapons are less likely to be of value than others. By their design, revolvers retain fired cartridges and are not considered good candidates for NIBIN entry. Pistols that generate low chamber pressure (i.e. 22 and 32 cal.) do not exert enough force to impart good markings and thus are not suitable for entry.*

**Georgia v. Randolph**  
**Decided by the United States Supreme Court-**  
**March 22, 2006**

**Introduction:**

This case deals with the issue of consent under circumstances where more than one owner is present and one is consenting to a police search and the other is objecting. This issue has been unresolved for a long time but in this case the United States Supreme Court definitively held that when there is dispute about consent between equal co-owners there is no consent and the police must find another lawful justification for the search.

**Facts:**

On the morning of July 6, 2001 Janet Randolph complained to the police that her husband had taken her son away after a dispute and when the police arrived at the marital home she told them that her husband was a cocaine user whose habit had caused financial troubles. Shortly after the police arrived Janet's husband Scott returned and explained that he had removed the child to a neighbor's house out of concern that his wife might take the boy out of the country. Scott denied any cocaine use and counter charged that his wife abused drugs and alcohol.

One officer accompanied Janet to reclaim the boy while the other officer stayed with Scott. When Janet, the boy, and the officer returned she renewed her complaints about her husband's drug use and also volunteered information that there were items of drug evidence in the house. One officer asked Scott for consent to search the home which he unequivocally refused and the other officer asked Janet for permission to search the home which she readily gave. Based on Janet's consent the police searched the home and in Scott's bedroom the police noticed a straw with a powdery residue that appeared to be cocaine. Based on this observation the police got a search warrant for the home and seized further evidence of drug use.

**Defendant's Position:**

The defendant argued that the evidence from the search warrant should be suppressed as it was based on an illegal consent search as he had expressly refused police consent to search the home.

**The State's Position:**

The state argued that the evidence was lawfully obtained as the consent search was valid as Janet, a co-owner of the home, had clearly consented to the police search.

**The Court's Holding:**

The United States Supreme Court agreed with the defendant and ruled that the police did not have valid consent to search the home and thus the search warrant was based on illegally observed evidence. The court reasoned that a co-owner wishing to open a door to a third party has no recognized authority in law or in common practice to prevail over a present and objecting co-owner. Accordingly the court held that a co-owner can not consent to a police entry into the home over the objection of a present co-owner. The court however took pains to explain that their decision should not impact police conduct during an ongoing domestic abuse situation. The court emphasized that the police should feel authorized to enter a residence to protect a resident from domestic violence but in such a circumstance they would be doing so in an emergency response mode and not on a consent theory.

It is also important to note that the court drew a distinction between situations where the objector is right there with the consentor as compared to situations when the other co-owner is not there or a distance away, even if still in the home. So long as there is no evidence that the police removed the potential objector for the sake of avoiding a possible objection, there is consent if the one co-owner consents and the other is not present or is only near by.

**Note:** It would seem that for an objector to prevail over a consentor the objector must have at least an equal possessory interest. Consequently it would seem logical that a co-owner would trump an overnight guest or a non-owner relative living in the home. However comparing the interests should not be based on real estate titles or leases but more from a common practices perspective. So, a cohabitation arrangement would make both parties co-owners for consent purposes regardless if only one name is on the title. Also, while the opinion is limited to consent searches of homes the prudent course for the police would be to follow this rule for consent searches of any property area.

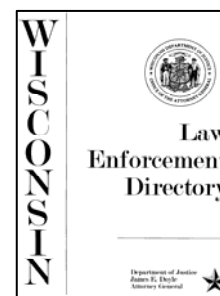
## WPPA TO HOST LAW ENFORCEMENT WEEK BREAKFAST

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## FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through March 2006: Ten law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2005, 15 officers were slain. Five deaths occurred in the west, three in the south, and two in the northeast. Of the ten officers slain, three were performing traffic stops, two were answering disturbance calls (one being domestic disturbance call), two were answering robbery call, one was involved in drug-related matter, one was involved in tactical situation, and one officer was attempting other arrest. Firearms were used in all ten killings (nine handguns and one rifle). Three officers were wearing protective vests. There have been ten separate incidents in which these ten officers have been slain. Nine of the ten incidents were cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Thirteen law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2005, 11 officers were accidentally killed. Six deaths occurred in the south, five in the Midwest, one in the west, and one in Puerto Rico. Of the 13 officers killed, seven were killed in automobile accidents, five were struck by vehicles, and one was accidentally shot.

### Incident Summaries

**New York State Police, Horseheads, New York,** Veteran Trooper, with over nine years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 03/01/2006. At approximately 12:15 p.m., bank was robbed by unknown subject who produced robbery note. After leaving bank with about \$1900 cash, subject was observed leaving scene in pickup truck driven by another unknown subject. Approximately 90 minutes later, Trooper located subject vehicle and two subjects. Shots were exchanged between Trooper and subjects. Wearing protective vest, Trooper received fatal wound to torso area from .357 magnum handgun, which was later recovered. Wounded subjects fled scene of incident. One subject was arrested without incident at local motel and other subject was arrested at local hospital while seeking medical attention, claiming he had been carjacked. Both subjects were hospitalized and have been charged with first-degree murder.

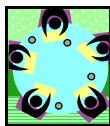
**Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office, Louisiana,** Veteran Sergeant, aged 31, with eight years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 03/01/2006. At approximately 8:30 p.m., while working with narcotics task force, Sergeant was trying to arrest subject for dealing drugs. During

arrest attempt, Sergeant was fatally shot by subject using Glock 23, .40 caliber handgun. Subject was arrested and charged with first-degree murder of police officer, aggravated flight from officer, and possession with intent to distribute crack cocaine.

**Bernalillo County Sheriff's Office, New Mexico,** Deputy Sheriff, aged 38, with over three years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 03/22/2006. At approximately 12:44 a.m., Deputy Sheriff called in traffic stop on vehicle with two occupants and supplied license plate number of subject vehicle. At 12:49 a.m., 911 call came in from local resident who reported hearing two gunshots and seeing truck speed away from traffic stop. Shortly after, another Bernalillo County deputy sheriff arrived at scene and observed Victim Deputy, who had suffered two gunshot wounds to face from 10-millimeter firearm, lying on ground. Responding deputy attempted to resuscitate Victim Deputy but was unable to do so. Investigation determined subject vehicle was recently repossessed by title loan company and sold to subject. Subject remains at large and is also wanted by Albuquerque Police Department for earlier killing.

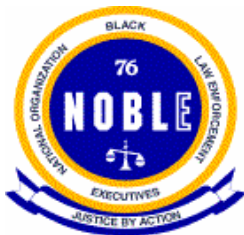
**Bibb County Sheriff's Office, Georgia,** Veteran Deputy Sheriff, with nine years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally shot on 03/23/2006. Deputy Sheriff was member of SWAT team and assigned to drug squad. At approximately 1:30 a.m., Bibb County drug squad was serving warrant to conduct drug search when gunfire broke out. One shot hit Deputy Sheriff in hand and another shot hit him in face. Victim Deputy Sheriff was taken to area medical center where he was pronounced dead shortly after 2 a.m. Five individuals have been arrested and two have been charged as actual shooters.
