MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

The Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Law Enforcement Services provides assistance daily to the men and women of Wisconsin law enforcement. From WILENET to the state Crime Labs to the Time System to Fast ID, this critical support structure is in place to help you protect and serve our citizens.

A key component to this effort is the Training & Standards Bureau. I'm very pleased to share with you that I have appointed an experienced and accomplished Wisconsin law enforcement officer, Neil Strobel, to be the Director of this Bureau. Neil will begin his duties on May 14, 2007.

The Training & Standards Bureau serves as the staff of the Law Enforcement Standards Board. The Bureau administers the programs of the Board for certification of law enforcement, jail and secure detention officers, instructors and academies. It also implements statutes, administrative rules and Law Enforcement Standards Board policies for the certifications of schools and instructors, and maintains WILENET, the Wisconsin law enforcement Website.

In addition, the Bureau administers reimbursement of training expenses for participants in Standards Board programs and in DOJ training programs. It also serves as the staff of the Standard Board's curriculum advisory committee and other advisory groups that assist the Board. Finally, it coordinates and supports statewide training provided by DOJ to the Wisconsin law enforcement community.

Neil Strobel served as the Chief of the Merrill Police Department in Merrill, Wisconsin, from 1996 to the present. Prior to his work with the Merrill Police Department, he worked for the Waukesha Police Department as a Sergeant from 1987 to 1996; as a Detective from 1983 to 1987; and as a Police Officer from 1977 to 1983.

He has also served as an Adjunct Faculty member at North Central Technical College in Wausau from 1996 to the present; Cardinal Stritch University in Milwaukee from 2003 to the present; Upper Iowa University in Wausau from 2003 to the present; and at the National Institute of Ethics in Gulfport, Mississippi, from 2003 to the present.

Neil earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Wisconsin - Platteville and a Masters of Science degree in Management from Cardinal Stritch University. He is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy.

I know that Neil will be a great asset to DOJ and assist us as we serve you and the citizens we are entrusted to protect.

State v. Gary A. Johnson **Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court 3/21/07**

Introduction:

This case involves the propriety of a frisk subsequent to a traffic stop. The court held in this case that one furtive movement by the defendant was not enough reasonable suspicion to justify a frisk since it came within the context of a minor traffic stop. However, the court did also hold that one factor, if sufficiently compelling, can under the right circumstances justify a frisk.

Facts:

Officers stopped a 1989 black Cadillac and eventually discovered that the car's registration had been suspended for an emissions violation. They did not cite the driver for the emissions violation since the driver was not the registered owner.

A few days later in the late afternoon the officers again observed the 1989 black Cadillac and this time they observed the vehicle fail to signal for a turn and the vehicle was stopped. The area where the stop occurred was dark but was illuminated by street lamps. The officers observed two people in the stopped car and then they observed the driver, the defendant, lean forward and appear to be reaching underneath his front seat. While the officer did not see the defendant's hands they did see his head and shoulders briefly disappear from view. The officer's at the time felt that the furtive movement they observed was consistent with an attempt to conceal contraband or weapons.

The officers approached the car and advised the defendant that he was being stopped for an emissions violation plus a failure to signal for a turn. The defendant showed proof that the emissions problem had been corrected. The officer then asked the defendant to get out of the car because of the movements he had observed consequent to the stop. The defendant got out of the car and was patted down for weapons and during the pat down the defendant collapsed to the ground. Once the defendant got back to his feet the officers did a protective frisk of the vehicle looking for weapons and found illegal drugs.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued that the frisk of his person and his vehicle was unlawful since the police did not have the requisite reasonable suspicion that he was armed and/or dangerous. Consequently the defendant argued that the evidence found pursuant to the frisk should be suppressed.

The State's Argument:

The state argued that there was a sufficient basis to do a pat-down since the police had observed a clear furtive movement during the stop and also because the defendant seemed to fall down during the frisk of his person.

The Court's Holding:

The Wisconsin Supreme Court agreed with the defendant and found the frisk to be unlawful. The key for the Court is that the defendant was stopped for an extremely minor traffic infraction and also the defendant quickly provided proof that the emissions problem had been corrected. At the time the defendant proved the emission problem was OK there really was no reason to get him out of the car to frisk him other than one furtive movement. The Court also held that since the defendant should not have been frisked in the first place, his falling down during the frisk should not be considered in the analysis. However the Court did agree with the state that one factor, such as a furtive movement, could be the basis for a frisk under different circumstances, such as an investigation of drug activity.

Analysis:

The key to the decision of this case is the nature of the underlying offenses; in this case an emission problem that had been corrected and the very minor infraction of failing to signal before a turn. With such minor infractions the court held it unreasonable that one observed furtive movement meant the defendant was concealing a weapon. However, if the nature of the offense being investigated has a known nexus with weapons, such as drugs, then it is likely that the same furtive movement would have been enough to justify the frisk.

Note:

When in doubt always frisk. The worst that can happen is that the evidence is suppressed but at least you are safe. However if you want to conduct a frisk that holds up in court it will be based on the totality of the circumstances including among other things the nature of the underlying offense, the time of day, the defendant's behavior, and the neighborhood.

FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through March 2007: Twelve law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2006, 12 officers were slain. Nine deaths occurred in the south, one in the northeast, one in the midwest, and one in the west. Circumstances involving the 12 slain officers are as follows: four were performing traffic pursuits/stops, two were answering disturbance calls (one being domestic disturbance call), two were ambushed, one was investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, one was answering burglary call, one was involved in drug-related matter, and one officer was attempting other arrest. Firearms were used in the killings (ten handguns and two rifles). Four officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 11 separate incidents in which these 12 officers have been slain. Ten of the 11 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Twelve law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2006, 18 officers were accidentally killed. Seven deaths occurred in the south, two in the northeast, two in the west, and one in the midwest. Eleven officers were killed in automobile accidents, and one was struck by a vehicle.

Incident Summaries

Fort Smith Police Department, Arkansas, Patrol Officer, aged 33, with eight months law enforcement experience with agency and additional experience with other law enforcement agencies was fatally shot on 03/23/2007. At approximately 9:42 p.m., Officer responded to provide protection for individual picking up her baby from house. Earlier that day, individual had been involved in disturbance at residence with subject's brother. Officer and individual were met by subject at residence and individual said that she was there to get her child. Subject told her to wait a moment and shut door. When subject returned back to door, he shot victim officer in back of head with handgun and then shot woman three times in back, shoulder, and elbow as she attempted to flee area. Victim officer was rushed to medical center where he succumbed to injuries one hour later. Woman with serious injuries was taken to hospital and later flown to medical school. At about 10:15 p.m., subject stopped his car in center of road while being followed by Oklahoma Highway Patrol (OHP) near Spiro, Oklahoma. Before OHP trooper had chance to activate patrol unit's lights or receive backup, subject committed suicide by shooting himself in head.

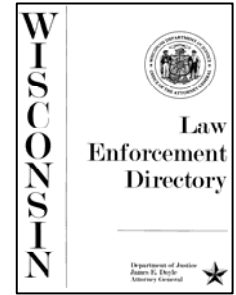
Moncks Corner Police Department, South Carolina, Private First Class (PFC), aged 40, with over two years law enforcement experience with agency and Corporal, aged 26, with over one year law enforcement experience with agency were fatally shot. On 03/25/2007 at approximately 3:45 p.m., caller phoned 911 to report domestic dispute and possible abduction of individual that took place at Laundromat. Investigation led officers to mobile home of subject. As two officers approached residence, subject emerged with shotgun utilizing buckshot rounds and opened fire. Victim PFC was fatally wounded at scene and victim Corporal was transported to medical center where he succumbed next morning. After shooting officers, subject fled scene in police unit. After locating subject, Berkeley County Sheriff's deputies made pursuit until subject crashed into fence of school. During pursuit, several shots were fired by deputy and it is unclear if subject died of deputy's gunfire or self-inflicted wound. Ongoing investigation is being conducted by South Carolina Law Enforcement Division in cause of subject's death.

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department (CMPD), North Carolina, Two of their Police Officers were fatally shot. (One Officer a six-year veteran, aged 35, and one Officer, aged 34, with one year law enforcement experience.) On 03/31/2007 at approximately 11:15 p.m., Officers responded to disturbance call at local apartment complex. While struggling with subject in parking lot of apartment complex, officers were shot by subject using .32 caliber revolver. Both officers succumbed to injuries on 04/01/2007. CMPD requested assistance from FBI. Approximately 14 special agents and task force officers responded to assist with neighborhood canvass and interviews. On 04/01/2007, at approximately 8 p.m., state murder warrants were signed against subject who is now in custody and has been charged with two counts of first degree murder.

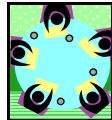
