## MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

*Dear Law Enforcement Colleague,*

### ***New Interfaces***

*The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and the Department of Justice (DOJ) recently completed a project to update the TIME System interface between our two agencies. The TIME System interface to the DNR is a valuable tool for law enforcement by providing access to; DNR registration data (i.e. boat, snowmobile and ATV), DNR citation data and DNR licensing data. The new interface utilizes Internet technology, i.e. web services and extensible markup language (XML), to request and transfer this data in response to your TIME System inquiries.*

*Through this new interface law enforcement has access to more current DNR citation data and responses that consolidates much more DNR data in one response to a single request. The use of XML has allowed us to add access to the DNR database to DOJ's eTIME Browser application that provides TIME System access to the Wisconsin criminal justice community using a standard web browser application via the Internet. All done timely and securely, meeting the FBI security requirements. To prevent any loss in service to our legacy TIME System users, DOJ converts the XML response from the DNR to a standard text response that can be received and displayed by our existing TIME System applications. This ensures TIME System users can continue to send inquiries to the DNR as you have done in the past with no interruption in service.*

*The Department of Corrections (DOC) and the Department of Justice have begun a similar project to replace the current probation, parole and sex offender processes for the CIB Hotfiles. A new TIME System interface to the DOC will provide real time access to probation, parole and sex offender information. Your TIME System inquiry will be routed to the DOC for searching and DOC will return real time results rather than searching a copy of limited date within CIB Hotfiles. This new interface provides us an opportunity to also pursue transfer of additional offender information including probation conditions and photos. We look forward to this opportunity to provide you with this additional information to assist you in performing your duties.*

### **State v. Lonkoski Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court- April 9, 2013**

#### **Issues:**

Whether the defendant was in custody for Miranda purposes when he expressed a wish for a lawyer, thereby triggering Arizona v. Edwards's protections. Ultimately the court held that the defendant was not in custody and therefore his request for an attorney did not prevent the police to continue ongoing questioning.

#### **Facts:**

The defendant's ten month old daughter was found unresponsive by her parents. Medical personnel and law enforcement officers arrived at the scene and pronounced the baby girl dead. An autopsy showed that the little girl's blood and urine contained deadly amounts of morphine and hydromorphone.

After reviewing the autopsy results the police requested that the baby's mother come to the police department for an interview. The defendant drove the mother to the sheriff's department. The officers spoke with the mother while the defendant waited in the lobby. After a while an officer went to the lobby and asked if the defendant would come into the interview room. The defendant was advised that he was not under arrest and was free to go and that they were going to shut the door for no other reason than for privacy.

After about twenty minutes of questioning the police began to focus on the autopsy results and at this point the defendant said "I want a lawyer". At this point the police advised the defendant that he was under arrest, and the defendant said

he changed his mind and wanted to talk and after being Mirandized the defendant made incriminating responses.

#### **The Defendant's Argument:**

The defendant argued that he was in custody and demanded an attorney. Therefore under Arizona v. Edwards the defendant argued that the police should have ceased questioning. Accordingly, the defendant argued that all of his incriminating statements should be suppressed.

#### **The State's Argument:**

The state argued that the defendant was not in custody when he asked for an attorney and after being placed in custody the defendant was dutifully read his rights and the defendant waived his rights. Therefore, the state argued that the defendant's statements were admissible.

#### **The Supreme Court Holding:**

In a unanimous decision the Wisconsin Supreme Court agreed with the state and found that the defendant's statements were admissible. The court reasoned that initially the defendant was not in custody, because he voluntarily drove to the sheriff's department and was told that he was not under arrest and was free to go. Also the defendant was not restrained in any way during the questioning and was provided with a cigarette break and a bathroom break. Since the defendant was not in custody when he asked for a lawyer there was no constitutional requirement for the police to stop their questioning. Once they arrested the defendant the police properly read him his Miranda warning and he waived his rights.

**Note:** This case reminds us that if a subject is in custody and requests an attorney, the police must immediately stop the interrogation. However, if a person who is not in custody requests a lawyer the police are allowed to continue to engage the defendant, although if the person keeps insisting on a lawyer and the police ignore him there may develop a voluntariness issue.



## FBI OFFICERS KILLED

### Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2013

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January through March 2013.

Nine law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2012, twelve (12) officers were slain. Circumstances involving the nine (9) Officers slain in 2013 are as follows: three (3) officers were ambushed, two (2) were performing traffic pursuits/stops, one (1) was answering disturbance call, one (1) was responding to burglary in progress/pursuing burglary suspect(s), one (1) was killed while investigating suspicious persons/circumstances, and one (1) officer was killed during tactical situation. Five (5) deaths occurred in the west, three (3) in the south, and one (1) death occurred in the northeast. All nine (9) victim officers were killed with firearms, five (5) handguns, one (1) rifle, one (1) shotgun, and two (2) firearm types not reported.

It has been confirmed that one (1) of the nine (9) officers was wearing protective body armor at the time of incident. There have been eight (8) separate incidents in which these nine (9) officers have been slain. All eight (8) incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Four (4) law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During same time period in 2012, four (4) officers were accidentally killed. Two (2) officers were killed in automobile accidents and two (2) officers were fatally struck by vehicles. Three (3) deaths occurred in the South and one (1) in the Midwest.

### Law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty Summary Report- 2012

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January through December 2012:

Forty-seven (47) law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During same time period in 2011, 72 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the forty-seven (47) officers slain in 2012 are as follows: 12 were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, 8 were performing traffic pursuits/stops, 5 were ambushed, 5 were involved in tactical situations, 4 were answering disturbance calls (2 being domestic-related), 3 officers were killed while handling prisoner(s), 2 were attempting other arrests, 2 were killed during drug-related matters, 2 were involved in investigative activities, 2 were responding to robbery in progress/ pursuing robbery suspect (s), 1 was responding to burglary in progress/pursuing burglary suspect(s), and 1 officer was killed while handling person with mental illness. Twenty-two deaths occurred in the South, 8 in the west, 6 in the Northeast, 5 in the Midwest, 5 in the US Territory of Puerto Rico, and 1 in the US Virgin Islands. Of the 47 killings, 43 were killed with firearms (30 handguns, 6 rifles, 3 shotguns, and 4 firearm types not reported), 2 officers were slain by subjects using vehicles as weapon, 1 officer was killed with knife/other cutting instrument, and 1 was killed with personal weapons (hands, fists, feet). It has been confirmed that 19 of the 47 officers were wearing protective body armor at time of incident. There have been 44 separate incidents in which these 47 officers have been slain. 42 of the 44 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Forty-five law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed.

During same time period in 2011, 53 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 45 officers accidentally killed in 2012 are as follows: 22 were killed in automobile accidents, 10 officers were fatally struck by vehicles, 6 were killed in motorcycle accidents, 3 were killed in aircraft accidents, 2 were accidentally shot, 1 in ATV accident, and 1 officer fell to his death. Twenty - seven deaths occurred in the South, 8 in the Northeast, 7 in the West, and 3 in the Midwest.

- Replacement batteries
- Laptop, card reader, cabling, etc. (optional)
