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MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Official:

Keeping schools as safe as possible is a top priority for all of us. The Wisconsin Department of Justice is committed to taking a proactive approach to minimize the possibilities of school violence and to maximize the effectiveness of a response if a tragic incident occurs. As part of this approach the Wisconsin Department of Justice is pleased to announce the release of the newly revised "Safe Schools-Legal Resource Manual".

The Safe Schools Legal Resource Manual has been a valuable tool for law enforcement, school administrators, teachers, and child protective service professionals since it was first released by the Wisconsin Department of Justice in 1999. In order to keep this manual as a strong, accurate, and timely resource the Wisconsin Department of Justice has recently revised it to incorporate changes in search and seizure, questioning of juveniles, and confidentiality of records law as they pertain to schools. Also, the manual includes a new section on child abuse investigations in schools, responding to the dynamic nature of legal issues in this area and its importance in the overall safe school objective.

The newly revised Safe Schools Legal Resource Manual will be directly sent the last week of October to school officials, sheriff's and police departments, and district attorney offices, throughout the state. In addition, a limited number of copies can be obtained by contacting Diana Davison of our Law Enforcement Division at 608-266-5710, and the manual can be accessed from our WILENET web site.

The goal of keeping our schools safe is achievable when all of us work in partnership. This teamwork concept is most effective when everyone involved has an understanding of their roles and an appreciation of the duties of others. I hope the newly revised "Safe Schools Legal Resource Manual" will be a valuable resource as we all work together to protect our children and keep our schools safe.

State v. Ewers Decided by the Court of Appeals- October 10, 2007

Introduction:

This case deals with what the police are entitled to do when a license plate check reveals that the registered owner of the vehicle has a suspended or revoked license. The Wisconsin Court of Appeals held that this information is a sufficient basis to reasonably suspect that the driver of the vehicle is the registered owner, and thus a reasonable basis for a traffic stop.

Facts:

An officer was driving his squad car in the early morning hours when he noticed a vehicle traveling in the opposite direction. The officer activated his radar and noted that the vehicle was traveling twenty-eight miles per hour in a twenty five mile per hour zone. The officer also ran the license plate of the vehicle, which revealed that the registered owner was the defendant and that the defendant was revoked. The officer then stopped the vehicle, made contact with the defendant, who was the driver, and ultimately arrested the defendant for operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued that the stop was unlawful as even though the plate check revealed that the registered owner was revoked the officer had admitted that he did not know who was driving the vehicle and had not even gotten a gender match before making the stop. The trial court rejected the defendant's argument and held the police did not have reasonable suspicion that the defendant was the

person driving the vehicle at the time of the stop. The trial court also held that the alleged speeding was not a valid basis for the stop since the officer had testified that he did not stop the vehicle for this reason. The defendant then appealed the trial court's ruling to the Court of Appeals.

The State's Argument:

The state argued that it is a sufficient basis to stop a vehicle if the police know the registered owner of the vehicle is suspended or revoked.

The Court of Appeals Holding:

The Court of Appeals reversed the trial court and held that that state's position was correct. Specifically the appellate court held that it is reasonable to assume that the registered owner of a vehicle is the person driving that vehicle. The appellate court reasoned reasonable suspicion is not a requirement of absolute certainty. The court cautioned however, that if an officer before the stop comes upon information suggesting that the assumption that the registered owner is the driver is inaccurate, then the stop would be invalid.

Impact for Law Enforcement:

This seems to be an important case for law enforcement as it answers the question of whether knowing the registered owner is suspended or revoked is a valid basis for stopping a vehicle, even in those circumstances when the officer can not see the driver. The Court of Appeals clearly held that it is a sufficient basis for a stop. However, department policy is still in force and effect as to when a particular department wants officers to do license plate checks of vehicles they encounter on the road who are otherwise not violating any traffic laws.

Note: The issue about whether speeding three miles over the limit is a valid basis for a stop when the officer is using the mini-violation as a pretext was ignored by the court other than in a footnote where they stated that pretextual stops are valid if there is a legitimate reason for a stop. However that is not the key issue in this case as the opinion was based solely on the registered owner being revoked issue.

FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through September 2007: Forty-four law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2006, 36 officers were slain. Twenty-four deaths occurred in the south, eight in the midwest, six in the west, five in the northeast, and one in Puerto Rico. Circumstances involving the 44 slain officers are as follows: 11 were performing traffic pursuits/stops, eight were ambushed, six were answering disturbance calls (three being domestic disturbance calls), five were attempting other arrests, four were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, four were responding to robbery calls, two were involved in tactical situations, one was answering burglary call, one was handling/transporting prisoner, one was investigating drug-related matter, and one officer was slain during investigative activity. Firearms were used in the 42 of the 44 killings (32 handguns, six rifles, and four shotguns) and vehicles in two. Twenty-three officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 40 separate incidents in which these 44 officers have been slain. All 40 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Fifty-one law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2006, 47 officers were accidentally killed. Twenty-eight deaths occurred in the south, 12 in the west, six in the northeast, and five in the midwest. Thirty officers were killed in automobile accidents, six were struck by vehicles, four were in motorcycle accidents, three were accidentally shot, two were killed in aircraft accidents, one officer drowned, one was fatally injured in ATV accident, one was exposed to poisonous gas, one officer's patrol unit was struck by tornado, one officer was fatally injured when a tree fell on his patrol vehicle, and one officer had an allergic reaction to bee sting.

Incident Summaries

Odessa Police Department, Texas, Three Veteran Corporals (aged 29 with approximately ten years law enforcement experience; aged 32 with ten years law enforcement experience; and aged 48 with over 22 years law enforcement experience) were shot after responding to domestic disturbance call. On 09/08/2007 at about 6:30 p.m., corporal (aged 32) was dispatched to residence in reference to family disturbance. Upon arrival, corporal and assisting law enforcement officers contacted spouse and was advised subject was intoxicated, had assaulted his wife, and were told of possibility of firearms inside residence. Corporal attempted contact with subject at front door, but subject did not answer. Subject's wife gave corporal and assisting officers permission to enter rear door. Corporal entered rear door and was met with gunfire from 12-gauge shotgun. Victim corporal was struck in his front face (jaw area), but was able to return three rounds of fire (not striking

subject). Victim corporal then staggered out of rear door of residence. At this time another corporal (aged 48) attempted to gain cover against rear brick wall of residence, however, subject fired through window and struck victim corporal in left arm. When this victim corporal fell to ground, subject fired another round and fatally struck in head. Responding officers arrived at scene and were directed to rear of residence by first victim corporal who was still standing. Officers went to rear of residence and subject fired one round through open window, fatally striking third corporal (aged 29) in face. Assisting officers were also fired upon and returned fire. First victim corporal was transported by police vehicle to local medical center where he was later transported to another medical center. He succumbed to his injuries on 09/12/2007. Two other victim corporals died at scene of incident. Subject was taken into custody after four-hour standoff and has been charged with three counts of capital murder and three counts of attempted capital murder.

Phoenix Police Department, Arizona, Veteran Officer, aged 33, with eight years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 09/18/2007. At approximately 8:30 a.m., officers stopped three jaywalkers who were impeding traffic. Officers asked for identification from individuals. Subject gave false information, which led officers to believe he had a misdemeanor warrant. Unknown to officers at time, subject had felony warrants. Subject, an illegal alien, fatally shot victim officer multiple times in face. Victim officer's partner was injured. Subject fled by commandeering stopped car at gunpoint. About one hour later, Phoenix Police located commandeered vehicle. After confrontation, subject was fatally shot by Phoenix Police.

San Antonio Police Department (SAPD), Texas, Veteran Detective, aged 37, with over 11 years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 09/21/2007, at approximately 1:47 p.m. SAPD had received information that subject, wanted on outstanding aggravated assault warrant for shooting individual in leg on 09/20/2007, could be located at apartment complex. After arriving at location where subject was believed to be located, radio message received from detective indicated subject was exiting from another building of complex. As detectives approached subject, foot chase ensued with subject running back towards building. Detective continued foot chase even after other officers/detectives lost sight of both detective and subject. Officers/detectives heard one gunshot near stairwell in front of building. Officers reported seeing victim detective lying on ground in front of apartment bleeding from gunshot wound to head. Victim detective was transported to hospital where he was pronounced dead. After shooting, subject entered apartment but, subsequently, exited apartment with 12-gauge shotgun pointed towards officers at which time subject was fatally shot.

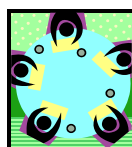
