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## MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

*Dear Law Enforcement Official:*

*Today, Wisconsin's TIME System consists of 8,400 terminals serving over 800 criminal justice agencies across the state. These terminals are a mix of mobile devices, terminals utilizing Enforcer 4.0 software and interface workstations accessing through custom software. These devices access criminal history information, driver, vehicle, wanted person, status and property files both statewide and across the United States and Canada via NLETS and NCIC. In 2004, over 98 million transactions were processed by the TIME System.*

*Since its inception, eTIME, the web-based version of the TIME System, has processed over 1.5 million transactions serving more than 3,000 users in over 800 criminal justice agencies. This alternative access expands the availability of TIME System information to those agencies without access to BadgerNet. The only requirements are an Internet connection, web browser, user ID, password and completion of required training.*

*Currently approximately 22,000 criminal justice personnel in Wisconsin hold some level of TIME System certification, whether eTIME, mobile terminal, query or entry. These users come from all ends of the criminal justice community; law enforcement, prosecutors, courts and corrections. Changes in technology have made access to the TIME System available in every squad car, desktop and handheld device.*

*The coming months will usher in more changes for the TIME System. Security concerns require any portion of a public network carrying TIME System traffic to be encrypted. This requirement affects not only BadgerNet, but local agency networks that are not proprietary or are shared. Over the next few months, BadgerNet will be upgraded and encrypted. However, fees for access to the state network will actually decrease significantly in 2006 for the first time in recent history.*

*And work continues on the redesign of the TIME System. XML, web services and directory services will all be incorporated into the new TIME System. System access will be based on the agency, user and level of TIME System certification. The focus on security will change from where the device resides to user identification through advanced authentication. The replacement for the existing Enforcer 4.0 software will store transaction forms on the web server, meaning everyone will have immediate access to the newest transactions.*

*This continuing upgrade of the state's backbone for the sharing of criminal justice information improves safety for Wisconsin law enforcement officers and citizens. By improving how information is shared, local and state law enforcement effectiveness is enhanced, benefiting every community across Wisconsin.*

### **State v. Jones**

**2005 WI 1App 26**

**Decided by the Wisconsin Court of Appeals,  
February 24, 2005**

#### **Introduction:**

This case deals with the issue of consent to search a vehicle incident to a traffic stop. The court ultimately ruled that the best practice is to let the defendant know that he/she is free to go before asking for consent to search a vehicle, absent reasonable suspicion or probable cause.

#### **Facts:**

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding and asked both the driver and the passenger for identification which they readily produced. The subjects advised the officer that they were headed to Green Bay to visit friends. The officer then went to his squad to run checks on the identifications that he had received.

The checks did not reveal anything suspicious. The officer then wrote a warning citation for the speeding but also called for backup assistance as something about the mannerisms of the subjects gave him a hunch that something illegal might be in the vehicle. The officer asked the driver to get out of the car to give him his warning and he gave the driver the citation along with the driver license he had earlier procured. The officer asked the subject if there was anything illegal in the vehicle and the subject denied having anything illegal and then the officer asked if he could search the vehicle and permission was granted.

The search uncovered a semi-automatic handgun under the front passenger seat and cocaine under the hood of the vehicle.

#### **Defendant's Position:**

The defendant argued that the search was illegal as the request for consent to search constituted a second seizure of his person and was illegal as after the speeding stop was over there was no longer any legal justification for further police conduct.

#### **The State's Position:**

The state argued that the police are allowed to ask for consent after a traffic stop and that they only need a separate justification if the defendant refuses consent and the police wish to detain the subject further.

#### **The Court Holding:**

First the court noted that there was no problem with the initial stop and further noted that defendant agreed to the search right away. However the court was troubled that the defendant was not told that he was free to go prior to the police asking for consent to search. The police and the state had reasonably argued that returning the license and issuing the warning should have been sufficient to put the defendant on notice that the traffic stop was over and that they could leave if they wanted to but the court was not convinced.

Ultimately the court felt that it is necessary for an officer to tell a subject that they are free to go, or words to that effect, prior to asking for consent and after the traffic stop matter has been concluded. In that way the request for consent is no longer a part of the original traffic stop but rather a second voluntary encounter, which does not require a legal justification like reasonable suspicion or probable cause.

#### **Note:**

Naturally if an officer develops a reasonable suspicion about drug activity during a traffic stop they do not have to tell the defendant they are free to go before asking for consent as they can lawfully detain the subject for a reasonable period of time while investigating the situation. So, this case sets out the prudent course for those circumstances where all you have is a hunch of illegal activity. Give the subject the ticket, warning, ect. tell them they are free to go or words to that effect and then after they start to leave seek to ask permission for a consent search.

## NEW IMPLIED CONSENT REQUEST FORMS IN ALCOHOL KITS

Beginning August 8, 2005 implied consent collection kits from the Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene (WSLH), Kit 45-Blood, Kit 46-Urine, contain new request forms. **The WSLH requests that law enforcement officers substitute new request forms for the ones in kits that have expiration dates prior to May 2007. New forms can be obtained by calling the laboratory's kit order number at (608) 224-6257.** These forms were designed in conjunction with a Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) project to streamline data collection and automate driver's license suspensions for OWI-PAC violations. The new forms include check boxes for statutes. It is important that submitting officers provide as much of the requested information as possible. An example of the new form is shown in Figure 1. Please use an original form supplied by the WSLH, do not make copies of the new forms.

### New WSLH Alcohol Reports

In the past WSLH alcohol results were typed onto the form included in the kits. With the distribution of new forms reports are now generated from our laboratory information system. A copy of the request form from the submitter will be included with the report of the results. This copy will either be scanned onto the back of the report, or will be provided as a separate attachment with the report. It is important that only original request forms be submitted with the specimen, as copied forms will decrease our ability to accurately scan them. An example of an alcohol report is shown in Figure 2.

### Reminders

The collection kits contain mailing labels for the WSLH. If the specimens are to be sent to another laboratory, simply replace the WSLH mailing label.

The WSLH provides alcohol and other drug testing free of charge for all traffic-related offenses and investigations. Specimens for non-traffic felony offenses (sexual assault, firearms, felony probation violations, etc.) should be sent to the appropriate Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory. Specimens related to non-traffic, non-felony violations may be analyzed by the WSLH for a fee- please call the lab.

## FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through July 2005: Thirty-four law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2004, 36 officers were slain. In 2005, 17 officers were slain in the south, nine in the midwest, seven in the west, and one in the northeast. Of the 34 officers slain, eight were performing traffic stops, seven were ambushed, four were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, four were answering robbery calls, three were answering disturbance calls (one being domestic disturbance call), three were involved in investigative activities, two were attempting other arrests, two were involved in tactical situations, and one was handling prisoner(s). Firearms were used in 31 of the killings (25 handguns, four shotguns, and two rifles) and three vehicles. Thirteen officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 34 separate incidents in which these 34 officers have been slain. Thirty-three of the 34 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Twenty-six law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2004, 52 officers were accidentally killed. In 2005, 15 officers were killed in automobile accidents, three were struck by vehicles, two were accidentally shot, two were killed in aircraft accidents, two officers drowned, one was killed in motorcycle accident, and one was fatally injured due to a fall. Nine deaths occurred in the south, nine in the midwest, three in the northeast, three in the west, and two in Puerto Rico.

### Incident Summaries

**Kirkwood Police Department, Missouri,** Veteran Sergeant, aged 43, with over 19 years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 07/05/2005 at approximately 7:45 p.m. Sergeant was responding to fireworks disturbance call when he was shot twice in face during unprovoked attack. After shooting victim sergeant, subject crossed street and fatally shot 13-year-old boy. Subject is know to local police and several individuals witnessed attack on victims. Victim sergeant's .40 caliber service revolver was stolen after shooting. Subject remains at large.

**San Leandro Police Department, California,** Police Officer, aged 42, with over three years law enforcement experience with agency was fatally shot on 07/25/2005 at approximately 11 p.m. While responding to gang-related disturbance call, officer was reviewing identification of subject. During this time, subject allegedly pulled out 10 millimeter handgun and shot victim officer several times. Victim officer was dead on arrival at local hospital. Subject fled, however, his abandoned vehicle was found near scene of incident. On 07/26/2005, subject was located in Daly City and arrested without incident by local authorities.

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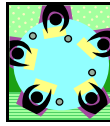

## **# 7596 – THEFT OF OXYCODONE – Viroqua Police Department, WI**

On Saturday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>, a lone masked female entered the Langhus Pharmacy, Viroqua, through the back door and demanded Oxycodone. The female was wearing a gray hooded sweat shirt with pockets, wrap around sunglasses, red bandana around face, and faded blue jeans. As the suspect entered the work area she crouched down and demanded the Oxycodone. The pharmacist refused and grabbed the suspect by the hood in an attempt to remove her. The suspect was wearing a brown glove on the left hand and had her right hand in the pocket and claimed to have a gun, as an object or finger was pointing outward against the fabric. The suspect tried to disguise her voice, by talking lower. As the pharmacist grabbed the hood the suspect reached out with her ungloved right hand and grabbed (4) bottles of oxycodone/5mg and fled out the back door. As the pharmacist and another gave chase the suspect held the door shut and said not to come outside as someone else was out there who had a gun.

The suspect is described as a white female, 5'6"-5'8", approx 135 lbs, and having light-colored hair. Suspect seemed to know exactly what bottles to take as she did not fumble around with any others on the same shelf.

Police are seeking a dark blue mini van that was reported to be parked at the end of the alley along Jefferson Street. A witness has reported seeing a white female who matches the description of the suspect leaving the alley in a hurry around the time of the robbery. The female suspect removed the gray sweat shirt as she was leaving and the witness reports seeing a dark blue sleeveless shirt. The suspect is reported to have crossed Jefferson Street and walked around the back of a dark blue mini type van, getting into the passenger front seat. The witness believes that the van was on the line of a Chrysler product, or Ford Astro that was in very good condition. The van did not have a sliding door on drivers side. The windows also had a slight tint. The witness reports seeing a white or light skinned male driver with brownish hair. Witness also reports seeing two car seats directly behind the driver/passenger seat. The van was last seen traveling east on Jefferson Street.
