Scott v. Harris **Decided by the United States Supreme Court** **April 30, 2007**

Issue:

This case involved a high speed pursuit and whether the police used excessive force when the subject being chased eventually crashed and suffered serious injuries. The United States Supreme Court held that the police conduct was reasonable as the fleeing driver was placing innocent bystanders in imminent danger.

Facts:

In March of 2001 a deputy clocked Harris's vehicle traveling at 73 miles per hour on a road with a 55 mile per hour speed limit. The deputy then attempted to stop Harris's vehicle but instead of stopping Harris sped away, causing a chase down a two-lane road at speeds exceeding 85 miles per hour. The deputy radioed dispatch as to the ongoing chase. Deputy Scott heard the radio communication and joined the pursuit along with other officers. In the midst of the chase, Harris pulled into a parking lot of a shopping center and was nearly boxed in by the police but somehow he evaded them by making a sharp turn, colliding with Scott's squad and then speeding off again down the two-lane highway.

Scott took over as the lead pursuit vehicle and six minutes and ten miles after the chase had begun Scott decided to employ a "Precision Intervention Technique" (PIT) maneuver. Deputy Scott applied his push bumper to the rear of Harris's vehicle and Harris lost control of his vehicle, which left the roadway, ran down an embankment, overturned and crashed. Harris was badly injured and was rendered a quadriplegic. There was a videotape capturing the events in question.

Harris's Argument:

Harris filed suit against Deputy Scott and several others arguing that the police violated his constitutional rights by using excessive force in violation of the Fourth Amendment. Specifically Harris argued that the landmark case of *Tennessee v. Garner* required three elements to be present before the police could engage in deadly force. These elements are 1) The suspect must have posed an immediate threat of serious physical harm to the officers or others; 2) deadly force must have been necessary to prevent escape, and 3) where feasible the police must give the suspect some warning. Harris argued that these three elements were not present in this case. The defendant reasoned that there was no warning and no real need to prevent the escape in this case as he had only committed a minor traffic offense.

Deputy Scott's Argument:

Scott argued that his conduct was reasonable because Harris's reckless driving endangered innocent people.

The United States Supreme Court Holding:

The United States Supreme Court held that under the facts of this case Deputy Scott's conduct was reasonable. A key for the court was the videotape which showed Harris's vehicle racing down narrow two-lane roads in the dead of night at speeds that were "shockingly fast". The videotape showed Harris's vehicle cross the center line, force other vehicles to their respective shoulders to avoid being hit, and run several red lights. Ultimately the Supreme Court concluded that Harris placed officers and innocent bystanders at great risk of serious injury.

The Court dealt with the issue of whether it would have been more prudent for the police to diffuse the situation by abandoning the pursuit. The Court felt that this was wrong on two counts. 1) It would be difficult to communicate to Harris that they were giving up the chase as even if he saw them slow down he might have thought that were either going to try a new shortcut to cut him off or employ another strategy to catch him and 2) the Court was wary of rewarding people who flee from legitimate police contact at high speeds by essentially compelling the police to back off in such a circumstance. So, the Court held that Harris caused the high speed chase that posed a substantial and immediate risk of serious physical injury to others and that Deputy Scott's attempt to terminate the chase by forcing Harris off the road was reasonable.

Caution:

A key to this case was the videotape, which clearly showed Harris operating his vehicle in a highly reckless and dangerous manner. Under different circumstances, even if he tried to elude the police the Court may have reached a different result. Also a police department, through its policies constantly balances the need to pursue and capture a particular subject with overall safety considerations and should not try to seek to change any existing policies merely because of this case. The result of this police chase was a devastating injury and even though a Court

might ultimately find the refusal to abandon the pursuit reasonable department policies should still clearly express when you want a pursuit to be initiated and when it should be terminated. Also, in Wisconsin department policy should control under what circumstances, if any, a "PIT" maneuver should be employed.

I highlight this case because it has received a lot of attention in the police community nationally but I do not seek to endorse it as a carte blanc for the police to engage in high speed pursuits in all instances.

FBI OFFICERS KILLED

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI, January through July 2007: Thirty-three law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2006, 26 officers were slain. Nineteen deaths occurred in the south, seven in the midwest, four in the northeast, and three in the west. Circumstances involving the 33 slain officers are as follows: ten were performing traffic pursuits/stops, six were ambushed, five were answering disturbance calls (two being domestic disturbance calls), four were responding to robbery calls, two were attempting other arrests, two officers were involved in tactical situations, one was answering burglary call, one officer was handling/transporting prisoner, one was investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, and one officer was slain during investigative activity. Firearms were used in the killings (23 handguns, eight rifles, one shotgun, and one firearm not reported). Fourteen officers were wearing protective vests. There have been 30 separate incidents in which these 33 officers have been slain. All incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means. Forty-six law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2006, 35 officers were accidentally killed. Twenty-six deaths occurred in the south, 11 in the west, six in the northeast, and three in the midwest. Twenty-eight officers were killed in automobile accidents, six were struck by vehicles, three were accidentally shot, two were in motorcycle accidents, two in aircraft accidents, one officer drowned, one in an ATV accident, one was exposed to poisonous gas, one officer's patrol unit was struck by a tornado, and one officer was killed when a tree fell on his patrol unit.

Incident Summaries

Indiana State Police, Peru, Indiana, Veteran Master Trooper Investigator, with 18 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 07/05/2007. At approximately 4:15 p.m., Investigator stopped to offer assistance to individual believed to be stranded motorist. As Investigator approached vehicle, subject fired shotgun rounds through window and fatally shot victim Investigator in chest. Subject then reloaded shotgun and fatally shot himself. Victim Investigator was pronounced dead at scene of incident.

Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office, Louisiana, Deputy Sheriff, with one year of law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 07/05/2007. At approximately 7 p.m., deputy sheriff, first to respond to domestic disturbance call, was shot in upper right chest area as he approached house. Bullet entered through arm opening of bullet proof vest. Responding officers placed their units between house and wounded deputy in order to remove him. Victim deputy was transported to local hospital where he succumbed to gunshot wound shortly before 9 p.m. Subject appeared to have fired at deputy from garage and then barricaded himself in house for approximately four hours. Subject with self-inflicted gunshot wound was removed from house and later succumbed to wound.

Grand Rapids Police Department, Michigan, Veteran Patrol Officer, with seven years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 07/08/2007. At approximately 1:40 a.m., agency received 911 call in reference to person with gun. Caller advised that his father was inside residence with shotgun and was threatening family members. Several marked police units were dispatched to address for investigation. Officer was walking to rear of residence to establish perimeter when subject fired shotgun through garage door window, striking victim officer in

left side of face. Garage is an unattached structure located within about ten feet of house. Unknown to officers on scene, subject had exited house upon their arrival and was hiding inside garage. One officer returned fire as subject fled back into residence. After fleeing into house, unharmed subject immediately surrendered to police. Injured officer was rushed to local hospital where he was pronounced dead. Subject was charged with felony homicide.

New York Police Department (NYPD), New York, Police Officer line of duty death on 07/14/2007. On 07/09/2007 at approximately 2:30 a.m., two NYPD officers initiated vehicle stop in Brooklyn. As officers approached vehicle, shots were fired from inside subject vehicle, striking both officers. Victim Officer, aged 23 with about one year law enforcement experience, was struck twice in head and was placed on life support until he succumbed to his injuries five days later. Other officer was struck once in arm and once in chest (his ballistic vest defeated round to chest); he survived his injuries. Upon investigation, three subjects were identified; one subject was located in Queens and two subjects were located in wooded area near Pennsylvania Turnpike. All three subjects have been arrested.

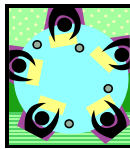
Douglas County Sheriff's Office, Illinois, Veteran Chief Deputy, aged 59, with over 28 years of law enforcement experience succumbed to injuries on 07/17/2007. On 06/21/2007, at approximately 10:44 a.m., chief deputy was engaged in search for two vehicles (minivan and pickup truck) that were stolen during home invasion of rural residence. Chief deputy observed stolen vehicles traveling on county road. Although investigation has yet to determine exact circumstances, preliminary examination indicates both stolen vehicles stopped and at least one subject approached chief deputy while he remained inside vehicle. Using handgun, subject shot chief deputy twice; once in face and once in chest. Following shooting, both subjects abandoned stolen pickup truck and fled scene of incident in stolen minivan. Victim chief deputy was able to radio to law enforcement personnel last know location of subjects. Subjects were subsequently located by members of Illinois State Police (ISP). Vehicle pursuit ensued with speeds reaching over 100 miles per hour as shots were fired at ISP. After minivan crashed, one subject was immediately captured by ISP while second subject ran

into local bank. Five occupants of bank were held hostage at gunpoint. Hostage negotiation personnel from FBI and ISP arrived and resulting negotiations led to release of all hostages unharmed and surrendering of subject.

Phoenix Police Department, Arizona, Office, aged 23, with over two years law enforcement experience was fatally shot on 07/27/2007. At approximately 8:30 p.m., officer responded to forgery in progress call at check cashing store. Upon arrival, officer encountered two subjects and was shot twice in head and chest with .40 caliber Smith & Wesson handgun. On 07/28/2007, both subjects were arrested and charged with first degree murder.

California Highway Patrol (CHP), California, Veteran Officer, aged 46, with 22 years law enforcement experience was fatally struck by vehicle on 07/31/2007. At approximately 11:30 a.m., employees of local business contacted Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) regarding what appeared to be unconscious person in vehicle parked in parking lot. Upon arrival of RCPD officers, subject fled in his vehicle and attempted to ram RCPD vehicle in process. RCPD officers pursued subject vehicle and were joined by law enforcement officers from other agencies. To disable subject vehicle, attempt was made by CHP officer to put out spike strip, however, subject vehicle swerved at officer preventing deployment of spiked. Subject vehicle continued fleeing, reaching speeds of 100 miles per hour. Another CHP officer deployed spike strip and remained on side of road. As subject vehicle approached spike strip, subject intentionally swerved his vehicle off roadway to hit CHP officer. Victim officer was struck at approximately 80 miles per hour. Pursuing CHP helicopter immediately landed, retrieved victim officer, and transported him to local medical center where he was pronounced dead. Subject was apprehended moments later after CHP officers and El Dorado County Sheriff's deputies rammed his vehicle.

COURSE DESCRIPTION
