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MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague,

Summer has brought some exciting changes to the Department of Justice (DOJ). As part of the new biennial budget, we have welcomed several programs and staff from the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) to the Department. Now with the DOJ, the former OJA staff with whom you have worked through the years will continue to provide the programs and funding that the criminal justice community has come to depend upon.

In addition to carrying out the programs formerly with OJA, DOJ has created a program to fund multi-disciplinary approaches to curbing Wisconsin's growing heroin problem. The Green Bay Police Department was recently awarded \$25,000 from the DOJ as the first grant under this program. The grant will be used to fund a four-pillar response -- Prevention, Enforcement, Treatment and Harm Reduction – to reduce heroin abuse and overdose deaths.

As you know, heroin has become an epidemic across Wisconsin. This month, we'll be launching an anti-heroin public awareness campaign, designed to prevent future heroin abuse. We'll be offering more information soon about how you can use the campaign materials and partner with the DOJ, and others in your community, in this statewide effort. We want to give this important prevention message the greatest exposure possible, and we need your help to do so.

Additionally, the Training and Standards Bureau is moving forward with plans to improve and enhance law enforcement recruit training. The basic academy will be expanded with hours dedicated to fitness/wellness, long gun and active shooter training. The training will be divided into phases with training scenarios incorporated into each phase. This will give students more practice using the skills they have acquired before the final test scenarios. I would like to thank the numerous members of our training advisory committees for their input as we move through this process.

The Training and Standards Bureau also is purchasing new officer certification software. This program will allow us to better manage officer and instructor certification records and training. We have asked that the vendor include a module that local agencies can use to track their own officer training. Implementation of this software should simplify the annual recertification training reporting process.

I hope you have had a safe and enjoyable summer. With the start of school this month, let's remember to keep our children safe too.

State v. Kenneth House Decided by the Wisconsin Court of Appeals- 8/14/13

Issue:

This case involved a dog sniff subsequent to a traffic stop; the officer did not have a reasonable suspicion of drug activity, though he had a hunch. The court ruled that the sniff was impermissible as it was conducted after the traffic stop was completed.

Facts:

The police stopped the defendant for a suspended registration. When the officer ran the defendant's driver license he learned that the defendant was on probation for a drug offense. The officer decided to have his canine perform a sniff of the car. The officer issued a warning to the defendant and ended the traffic stop. Even though the stop was concluded the officer told the defendant to stand on the side of the road and then in a one minute time period the dog performed a sniff and alerted. Eventually, 281 grams of marijuana was found in the defendant's vehicle.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued that the dog sniff unlawfully extended his traffic stop and thus any evidence generated by the sniff should be suppressed.

The State's Argument:

The state argued that the sniff only took one minute and therefore did not unreasonably extend the traffic stop.

The Court's Holding:

The court sided with the defendant and suppressed the evidence. The key to the decision was not the time it took to perform the sniff but rather that it was performed after the traffic stop was concluded.

Key Point:

In ruling for the defendant the court did affirm the earlier Supreme Court ruling in *State v. Arias* where the high court held that 77 seconds was not an unreasonable extension of a traffic stop to run a dog sniff. However the sniff in *Arias* occurred during the traffic stop and the sniff in this case took place after the stop had been concluded. Accordingly, if you want to run a canine sniff, and you don't have reasonable suspicion of drug activity, you must do it during the stop, and the sniff must not unreasonably extend the stop. If you end the traffic stop first, then no amount of time to run a dog sniff will be considered reasonable, in the absence of reasonable suspicion of drug activity.

Hint:

The rules governing a dog sniff of a vehicle without reasonable suspicion are exactly the opposite of the rules governing a request for consent to search a car without reasonable suspicion. The dog sniff must be performed before the original traffic stop has been concluded. On the other hand, a request for consent must be performed after the traffic stop has been completed and the defendant has been told that he/she is free to go.



FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2013

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January through July 2013.

16 law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2012, 23 officers were slain.

Circumstances involving the 16 officers slain in 2013 are as follows: 6 officers were ambushed, 2 were answering disturbance calls, 2 were involved in traffic pursuits and stops, 1 was responding to burglary in progress/pursuing burglary suspect(s), 2 were investigating suspicious persons/circumstances, 1 was attempting other arrest, 2 were involved in tactical situation, and 1 officers was handling prisoner(s).

9 incidents occurred in the South, 5 in the West, and 2 in the Northeast. Of the sixteen killings, 15 officers were killed with firearms (9 handguns, 2 shotguns, 2 rifles, and 2 firearm types not reported). 1 officer was slain by subject using vehicle as a weapon.

4 of the sixteen victim officers were wearing body armor at time of incident, 3 were not wearing body armor, and body armor usage has not been reported for 9 officers. There have been 15 separate incidents in which these 16 officers have been slain. All 15 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

25 law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During same time period in 2012, 25 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 25 officers accidentally killed in 2012 are as follows: 7 were involved in automobile accidents, 7 were struck by vehicles, 3 were involved in motorcycle accidents, 2 officer's deaths resulted from falls, 2 downed, 2 deaths occurred during training exercises, 1 was in aircraft accident, and 1 officer's death was due to smoke inhalation. 17 incidents occurred in the South, 5 in the West, 2 in the Northeast, and 1 in the Midwest.

Length of Service: 7 years as a Correctional Officer and 1 year as a Road Deputy.

Success Story: Recently Deputy Olbinski was patrolling the NE sector of Dodge County when he noticed three suspicious vehicles at local community business. Deputy Olbinski made contact with the individuals and investigated further finding that



the three vehicles had been stolen from adjacent counties. The three suspects were arrested and brought to jail. After additional investigation one of the suspects confessed to approximately 30 other vehicle thefts from numerous counties. The investigation is ongoing but without Deputy Olbinski's active patrolling and great investigative skills these cases may never have been solved and the suspects could still be actively committing crimes.
