MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague -

For the past five years, the Wisconsin Department of Justice's Training and Standards Bureau (T&S) has been offering annual instructor updates for instructors certified to teach law enforcement, jail, and secure juvenile detention training topics by the Law Enforcement Standards Board.

T&S works with the state technical colleges and employer-based academies (e.g., Fox Valley Technical College, Wisconsin State Patrol Academy, etc.), to offer 10 to 15 instructors updates annually around the state. T&S staff provides instruction at the instructor updates along with Master Instructor Trainers.

The instructor updates have been extremely well received. T&S staff sends out an evaluation survey following the conclusion of every instructor update session held. Some of the glowing responses from the evaluation surveys include: "Overall best instructor update ever attended"; "Well thought out and planned"; "The breakout session format was fantastic. Small group discussions and practical information from other instructors/trainers was beneficial."

For fall 2017/spring 2018, T&S has scheduled 12 instructor updates. Registration is open, and all Law Enforcement Standards Board certified instructors are required to complete one instructor update during their three-year certification period. Instructors may register to attend an instructor update via Wilenet, or click on one of the registration links below.

State of Wisconsin v. Lewis O. Floyd Jr. Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court, July 2017

*The Court of Appeals ruled on this case in July 2016 and its holding was discussed in a prior Legal Points. The case was appealed to the Wisconsin Supreme Court and this is a discussion of the supreme court holding.

Issue:

The court looked at whether there was proper reasonable suspicion to extend a traffic stop, whether there was consent for a search of the person, and whether asking a person for a frisk unlawfully extends a routine traffic stop. The court avoided a holding as to whether there was reasonable suspicion to extend the stop. Instead they held that asking for a frisk does not extend the stop and the defendant consented to the frisk.

Facts:

Around 6:45 pm the police stopped the defendant's vehicle because of suspended registration. Upon contact the defendant advised the police that he did not have a driver's license or insurance, but did have an identification card showing that he was from Kenosha. The officer observed that there were air fresheners in every vent of the vehicle as well as hanging off the rear view window. Because of the amount of air fresheners in the vehicle, the officer suspected drug activity. The officer also knew that the stop occurred in a high crime area where there had been a large degree of drug and gang activity, and further observed that the vehicle's windows were tinted.

After making all of these observations the officer returned to his squad to prepare three citations related to the suspended registration, lack of insurance and a

driver's license and contacted dispatch to request back up. The deputy returned to the defendant and asked him to exit the vehicle, to insure that the defendant would not drive away. As the defendant exited the vehicle the officer asked the defendant if he had any weapons to which the defendant said that he did not. The deputy then asked if he could be searched for safety and the defendant agreed. The search revealed drugs.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued the officer impermissibly extended his traffic stop and that he had not consented to the search of his person. The defendant also argued that the stop could not have been extended because the police did not have reasonable suspicion of drug activity and thus should have been limited to staying on the traffic stop mission.

The Court of Appeals Holding: Holding:

Calling it a close case, the court of appeals held there was sufficient reasonable suspicion to extend the traffic stop.

The Wisconsin Supreme Court Holding:

The high court chose not to decide this case on reasonable suspicion grounds. Instead the court held that asking a stopped subject about weapons is a routine inquiry that is part of a traffic stop, and not an extension of it. The court then held that the defendant consented to the frisk. So the bottom line holding is that a police officer can ask for a weapons check during a traffic stop as part of the traffic stop mission.

Note:

This case also reminds us that the police are entitled to have subjects exit the car in any traffic stop. And asking for consent to frisk does not extend a traffic stop. But the rule remains that in cases without reasonable suspicion the police cannot extend the traffic stop to accommodate a "fishing expedition".



Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2017

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January 1, 2017 through July 31, 2017.

There are no statistic totals for January 1, 2017-August 31, 2017 provided by the FBI.

Twenty-five law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions.

During same time period in 2016, 34 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the 25 officers slain in 2017 are as follows: 5 were killed in unprovoked attacks; 5 were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances; 4 were performing traffic pursuits or stops; 4 were answering disturbance calls (3 being domestic-related); 2 were involved in tactical situations; 1 was performing investigative activity; 1 was handling, transporting, custody of prisoner; 1 was responding to burglary in progress or pursuing burglary suspect(s); and 2 were attempting other arrests.

Fourteen of the 25 victim officers feloniously killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 5 in the Midwest, 3 in the West, 2 in the Northeast, and 1 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico.

Twenty-four of the 25 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (17 handguns, 5 rifles, 1 shotgun, and 1 firearm type has not been reported).

One victim officer was killed by subject using a knife. Eleven victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at time of incidents, 3 were confirmed to not be wearing body armor, and body armor usage has not been reported for 11 victim officers. There have been 25 separate incidents in which these 25 victim officers have been slain. All 25 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

Thirty-two law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed in the line of duty. During same time period in 2016, 26 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 32 officers accidentally killed in 2017 are as follows: 20 were fatally injured in automobile accidents, 5 were fatally struck by vehicles, 3 were fatally injured in motorcycle accidents, 2 victim officers drowned, 1 was fatally injured in boating accident, and 1 victim officer died from asphyxiation. Sixteen of the 32 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 7 in the Midwest, 5 in the West, and 4 in the Northeast.

Incident Summaries

Clinton Police Department, Missouri

Police officer, aged 37, with about 11 months of law enforcement experience with this agency, was fatally shot on 08/06/2017. At approximately 10:45 p.m., officer was on duty and had initiated traffic stop when he was shot by driver of vehicle who was armed with rifle. Victim officer was hit twice in chest, in which rifle rounds penetrated his ballistic vest. Victim officer was able to return fire before collapsing at scene. He was transported to local hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

Subject, who was later identified, fled scene of incident in his vehicle but crashed short distance away and ran from vehicle. Subject was arrested two days after incident and has been charged with first-degree murder and armed criminal action.

Kissimmee Police Department, Florida

It is with heavy heart that the Kissimmee Police Department announces the death of Sergeant Richard "Sam" Howard and Officer Matthew Baxter.

In the evening of August 18, 2017, Officer Matthew Baxter checked out with three males in the area of Cypress St. and Palmway St. Sergeant Sam Howard was in the area and responded to Baxter's call. Details of the exact exchange between Baxter, Howard and the suspect Everett Miller are still under investigation. Shortly after the exchange, a 9-1-1 call was received stating two officers were down. Officer Matthew Baxter succumbed to his injuries shortly after and Sgt. Sam Howard passed the following day.

Sgt. Sam Howard began his career with the city of Kissimmee Police Department January 22, 2007. Howard, 36-years old leaves behind his wife and one child.

Officer Matthew Baxter began his career with the City of Kissimmee Police Department July 7, 2014. Baxter, 27-years old leaves behind his wife, a detective with the City of Kissimmee Police Department and 4 young children.

"I am so proud of the sworn and civilian members of our department by acting quickly to identify the suspect and bring him to justice. We will mourn over the next few days. We will get through this and we love them for what they do," said Chief Jeff O'Dell.

The Kissimmee Police Department would like to thank every officer, dispatcher, and agency that came to our aid during this tragic event.
