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MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague –

Local communities across Wisconsin face significant criminal justice issues, such as the ongoing opioid epidemic and the rise in methamphetamine abuse, and addressing these issues creates resource challenges for law enforcement agencies around the state. To address these challenges, the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Trainings & Standards Bureau Justice Programs has placed a greater emphasis on seeking federal and state grant opportunities to provide additional resources to local law enforcement.

To assist local law enforcement in addressing both opioid and methamphetamine abuse, the Training & Standards Bureau has partnered with the Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) to apply for and receive funding under the COPS Anti-Heroine Task Force and Anti-Methamphetamine programs. Over the last three years, these programs have provided approximately \$3 million in funding for additional drug enforcement efforts for local drug enforcement task forces and law enforcement agencies statewide.

“Meth addiction is a big-time issue in the northern portion of the state, and its heart breaking for everyone involved,” said JFC member Rep. Mary Felzkowski of Irma. “I would like to thank Attorney General Schimel and the Department of Justice for their continued hard work on drug awareness, teaching the public how dangerous these drugs are and encouraging them to seek treatments for addiction. The only way to prevent addiction is to refrain from using in the first place, and it’s programs like these that prove to be beneficial by educating Wisconsinites on the risks and consequences involved.”

The bureau has also provided federal and state grant funding to pilot local law enforcement initiatives designed to provide treatment and other services designed to reduce recidivism. These efforts have included using federal Byrne JAG funds to initiate local Jail Reentry Pilot projects with sheriff’s departments. These programs are designed to develop a model of jail reentry to prevent recidivism, ensure individuals have a plan for housing, health care, employment and training, and benefits and/or other services as needed so they can successfully reintegrate and become part of the community upon release. The bureau has also recently provided state funding to local law enforcement agencies to pilot a pre-booking diversion program to address the underlying substance use needs of non-violent offenders, provide treatment, and reduce exposure to the justice system.

“The attorney general’s personal approach, in seeking input from local law enforcement agencies, will assist in establishing best practices to address current law enforcement issues,” said Langlade County Sheriff Mark Westen. “These practices will be essential in creating strategies for dealing with the most important aspects of public safety and the social wellbeing of our citizens. We have recognized the importance of not only narcotics enforcement, but also how it directly correlates with the mental health issues our communities are dealing with. And, due to an unsettling trend in our state, and nationwide, the attorney general has been an extraordinary advocate in recognizing the importance of officer wellness. We look forward to continuing a partnership with Attorney General Schimel to identify and address issues concerning public safety.”

The Training & Standards Bureau has also provided funding to local law enforcement to improve the timeliness, accuracy, and quality of criminal justice data reporting. Recent efforts have included providing federal funding to agencies to facilitate the implementation of the eReferral exchange between law enforcement RMS and the county district attorney’s PROTECT system. The outcome will be more efficient, accurate and timely filing of referrals for charging for law enforcement agencies. Consistent with pending federal requirements, the bureau has also provided funding to improve crime reporting through the implementation or improvement of the Incident-Based Reporting (IBR) system to collect and submit data in support of the FBI’s Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program.


This fall, the bureau will be offering a number of grant funding opportunities for law enforcement. These initiatives include:

When you Lose One of Your Own

Would you know where to turn if your agency were to ever experience the loss of an officer whether it be a line-of-duty death, suicide or medical emergency off duty? In the state of Wisconsin the Law Enforcement Death Response (LEDR) Team is a great resource available to all agencies. The LEDR Team is trained to assist with all details of a death of a law enforcement officer regardless of the circumstances. This includes:

- Death Notification
- Critical Incident Debriefings
- Peer Counseling
- Funeral Service Preparations
- PSOB – Public Safety Officer Death Benefits
- Family Support
- Media Coordination
- Agency logistics

Even when an officer dies off duty, within 24 hours of the end of a shift, there may be benefits and services that the LEDR team can assist with. The death of an officer off duty, which can be tied to their employment, is sometimes covered under the Hometown Heroes Survivors Act. If your agency ever experiences a circumstance like this please reach out to the team to see if the officer might qualify for these benefits.

LEDR also works in collaboration with Wisconsin Concerns of Police Survivors, Wisconsin Law Enforcement Memorial Board, Wisconsin Honor Guard Association, and others. LEDR is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. To reach the LEDR team during the time of an officer death call Wisconsin Department of Justice TSCC 608-266-7633. The best thing you can do for you and your agency is be prepared and hope that this is a resource you will never need to use. If the unimaginable happens please reach out to see if there is anything LEDR can do to assist your agency.





FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2018

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during 01/01/2018 through 08/31/2018:

Forty law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During same time period in 2017, 29 officers were slain. Circumstances encountered by the 40 victim officers upon their arrivals at the scenes of Incidents are as follows:

17 investigative/enforcement (6 tactical situations, 6 investigative activity, 3 wanted persons, 1 investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, and 1 Traffic violation stop); 9 were ambushed (entrapment/premeditation); 5 were involved in pursuits (3 foot and 2 vehicular); 2 were on administrative assignments; 2 were responding to crime in progress (1 person with firearm/no Shots fired and 1 burglary); 2 encountered arrest situations (attempted to restrain/control handcuffed offender); 1 encountered disorder/disturbance (domestic violence); 1 was assisting another law enforcement officer (foot pursuit); 1 unprovoked attack. Sixteen of the 40 victim officers were employed by law enforcement agencies in the south, 10 in the Midwest, 8 in the west, 5 in the northeast, and 1 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico. Thirty-eight of the 40 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (25 handguns, 7 rifles, 2 shotguns, and types of firearms have not been reported for 4 incidents). Two victim officers were killed by the offender(s) using a vehicle as a weapon. Twenty-six of the 40 victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at the times of the incidents. There have been 37 separate incidents in which these 40 victim officers have been slain. To date, 36 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

Thirty law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed in the line of duty. During same time period in 2017, 39 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 30 officers accidentally killed in 2018 are as follows: 20 were fatally injured in motor vehicle crashes while operating cars, trucks, or suvs (6 while on patrol, 3 during pursuit, 2 during training, 2 while assisting other law enforcement officers, 2 performing traffic control, 1 performing traffic enforcement, 1 during investigative/enforcement, 1 during rescue/recovery, 1 while responding to crime in progress, and 1 during other type of circumstance.); 7 were pedestrian officers struck by vehicles (2 while assisting a citizen(s), 2 while performing traffic enforcement, 1 while performing traffic control, 1 while in pursuit; and 1 handling disorder/disturbance); 2 were fatally injured in motorcycle crashes (1 during patrol and 1 performing traffic control); and 1 victim officer drowned while on patrol. Seventeen of the 30 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the south, 5 in the Midwest, 4 in the northeast, 3 in the west, and 1 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico. There have been 30 separate incidents in which these 30 victim officers have been accidentally killed.

Incident Summaries

Madison Police Department, WI

It is with great sadness that the town of Madison police department announces the unexpected death of sergeant Jessica Fischer, who was 43 years old. Sergeant Fischer died on August 9, 2018, while off duty, from an apparent suicide.

Sergeant Fischer has proudly served with our department as a Patrol Officer, Detective, and Patrol Sergeant, for the past thirteen years. Her service to the community was beyond reproach, and she will truly be missed.

State v. Mitchell Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court July, 2018

Issue:

This case involved a warrantless blood draw of an unconscious driver arrested for OWI. The Wisconsin Supreme Court found such a draw reasonable under the 4th Amendment.

Facts:

The police were dispatched in response to a complaint that a person had seen Mitchell, who appeared intoxicated, get into a grey van and drive away. The police made contact with Mitchell walking near a beach, shirtless, and covered in sand. Mitchell's speech was slurred and he demonstrated very poor balance.

Mitchell admitted to drinking, prior to driving, and that he had continued drinking at the beach. He stated that he had parked his vehicle because he felt that he was too drunk to drive. Nearby, the police found the grey van that Mitchell had been driving.

Mitchell appeared to be too intoxicated for the safe administration of field sobriety tests. Instead a PBT was performed, resulting in a .24 reading. Mitchell was then arrested for OWI. During the drive to the police station Mitchell's condition deteriorated and upon arrival at the station it became clear that a breath test would be unfeasible. The decision was made to transport Mitchell to the hospital for a blood test and he became unconscious during the trip. After Mitchell entered the hospital emergency room the officer read him the informing the

accused form but Mitchell was too incapacitated to answer. The officer, relying on the unconscious provision of the implied consent law then arranged for a warrantless draw of Mitchell's blood. This test resulted in a .222 BAC reading. Mitchell was charged with OWI 7th offense.

The Defendant's Argument:

The defendant argued that the unconscious driver provision of the implied consent law is unconstitutional because he was denied the opportunity to give valid consent, because he was unconscious.

The State's Argument

The State argued that Mitchell had given his implied consent to the blood draw when he decided to drive, and since he did not revoke that consent the blood draw was permissible.

The Courts Holding:

The Supreme Court did not decide the issue of the constitutionality of the unconscious provision of the implied consent law. Instead, it found the warrantless blood draw reasonable under the Fourth Amendment. In other words, the Wisconsin Supreme Court held that if a driver arrested for OWI is unconscious, a warrantless blood draw can be performed, regardless of the implied consent statute.

Key Point:

The constitutionality of the unconscious driver provision of the implied consent law is an unsettled issue. Therefore the safest course is to not go through the informing the accused form and rather to just take the blood as a permissible Fourth Amendment event. While a warrantless blood draw is permissible in the case of the unconscious driver, there is nothing wrong in seeking to get a search warrant, if that is what your DA prefers. But in any case do not bother to read the informing the accused form

to the unconscious driver who has been arrested for OWI.

Guidance:

So in a drunk driving arrest scenario here is the current state of the law.

1) In your regular case read the defendant the Informing the Accused form. If they submit, perform the test. If they refuse mark it as a

refusal and then get a search warrant for the blood.

2) If you have sufficient exigent circumstances and they refuse, then you arrange for a warrantless blood draw,

3) If they are unconscious, even if you do not have exigent circumstances, you may perform a warrantless blood draw, but without going through the implied consent law provisions.

4) Of course please consult with your DA for what they prefer you to do.
