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MESSAGE FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Dear Law Enforcement Colleague,

The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Firearms Unit interacts regularly with local law enforcement in the process of performing its statutory duties. One reason for this interaction is to advise law enforcement that an individual has been denied the purchase of a handgun pursuant to Wisconsin Statute 941.29(1). WI Statute 175.35(2k)(g) authorizes the DOJ to disseminate this information to law enforcement.


*In the event that a handgun purchase has been denied, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute 941.29(1), the department will send an administrative message via the TIME System, notifying law enforcement agencies of the denial. The administrative message will include the date and location of the attempted purchase, the seller's contact information, and the reason for the denial. The Department will include the following language in the message: **"Please forward to the officer-in-charge for potential enforcement action under State Statute 941.29"**. There are several offenses that disqualify an individual from purchasing a handgun. It is recommended that law enforcement agencies familiarize themselves with this statute.*

The Department also relays information to law enforcement agencies with regard to Concealed Carry Weapons (CCW) licensing issues. Upon the Department's suspension or revocation of an individual's CCW license for statutory cause, the individual is notified via Certified Mail of the revocation or suspension. Wisconsin Statute 175.60(14)(b)3 requires that the individual return the license to the Department, either in person or via Certified Mail, within seven days of receiving the notice of suspension or revocation. Should the individual fail to return the CCW license within the specified time period, the Department is authorized to provide information to law enforcement agencies for the purpose of investigating whether the individual has complied with the state statute. A formal report containing pertinent documentation will be prepared by the Department, which will be made available upon request to local law enforcement agencies should an agency make the decision to refer the matter to their county's district attorney for prosecution.

Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §922(g)(3), firearm possession is prohibited for individuals who are current users of, or addicted to, a controlled substance. Law enforcement agencies can notify the Department of an individual's drug use via dissemination of incident reports containing evidence

of drug use, possession of controlled substances and/or the individual's self-admission of drug use. It is important to note that this evidence and knowledge is documented in an official report from the agency. Personal knowledge of the officer will not suffice. The Department then may use this information to revoke an existing CCW license. State v. Carlos Cummings Decided by the Wisconsin Supreme Court 7/24/14

Issue:

Whether or not Cummings invoked his Miranda right to silence during a custodial interrogation? The Wisconsin Supreme Court opined that Cummings did not assert his right to silence and the police were free to continue with their questioning.

Facts:

The police responded to a reported shooting and upon arriving at the scene found the victim conscious and responsive, despite having been shot a number of times in the head and upper body. The victim told the police that he had been shot by a woman named Linda. The victim further explained that Linda had called him and asked him to meet her at the park. Linda further told the victim that she wanted to repay the 600\$ she had previously borrowed from him. Linda also advised that she had video evidence of an affair between the victim's wife and a man named Carlos.

The victim went to the park to meet up with Linda. Linda was there and handed the victim the videotape, and then pulled out a .22 caliber pistol, and shot him. Before fleeing the scene Linda told the victim that she was sorry for shooting him but that it was his wife's fault.

As part of their investigation of the shooting the police interviewed Carlos Cummings on the afternoon of the shooting. During the interview Cummings denied any knowledge

of involvement in the shooting. Cummings was not in custody during this interview and was subsequently released.

Later the police arrested Linda, the alleged shooter. Linda admitted to shooting the victim but said it was Cummings idea to meet the victim at the park. Linda advised that Cummings had driven her to and from the shooting and that she had left a backpack containing the pistol used in the shooting in Cummings's vehicle. The police also obtained surveillance footage of a vehicle similar to Cummings's dropping Linda off at a gas station near her apartment after the shooting.

The police returned to Cummings's home and asked whether he would be willing to go to the police station for further questioning. Cummings agreed. At the police station, Cummings was advised of his Miranda rights and Cummings waived his rights and agreed to speak with the police. The police then questioned Cummings and told him that Linda had contradicted a lot of what he had told the police earlier. Cummings asked what Linda had told the police and they said they weren't going to tell him. Cummings, frustrated, then said "Well then take me back to my cell. Why waste your time." Cummings and the police continued to spar and eventually things settled down and the interrogation continued and ultimately Cummings admitted to his involvement in taking Linda to and from the shooting. The police conducted a search of Cummings home and uncovered a case and a magazine for a .22 caliber Smith and Wesson pistol, and a subsequent search of the garage revealed the .22 caliber Smith and Wesson pistol used by Linda to shoot the victim.

The Defendant's Argument:

Cummings sought to suppress everything he said to the police after saying "Well then take me to my cell-Why waste your time?" Cummings argued that his statements were a clear indication that he no longer wanted to

talk and that he was asserting his Miranda right to silence.

The State's Argument:

The state argued that Cummings remarks were merely part of a back and forth dialogue with the police and not a clear invocation of his Miranda rights.

Supreme Court Holding:

The Wisconsin Supreme Court agreed with the state and held that Cummings's remarks were not a clear invocation of his Miranda right to silence. The court reasoned that in the context of the statements, Cummings's remarks could be interpreted in a least two different ways. One way could be that Cummings no longer wanted to talk to the police; another possibility is that his statement was merely a rhetorical device intended to elicit additional information from the police. The court opined that the statements seemed like an invitation for the officer to end the interview if he didn't give Cummings some insights on what Linda had told the police. In any event the court held that the statements were not a clear invocation of Cummings Miranda right to silence, but rather just part of a back and forth exchange between the police and Cummings.

Key Point:

It is important to note that Cummings's comments were post-waiver, and in a post waiver context the burden is on the defendant to show that his/her invocation is clear and unambiguous. Also, in the post waiver context there is no obligation for the police to seek clarification of an ambiguous statement, which could be, or just as easily could be not an assertion of a Miranda right.



FBI REPORT ON OFFICERS KILLED

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty Summary Report – 2014

These statistics represent preliminary information received by the FBI during January 2014 through August 31, 2014.

32 law enforcement officers have been killed due to criminal actions. During the same time period in 2013, 18 officers were slain. Circumstances involving the 32 officers slain in 2014 are as follows: 6 were answering disturbance calls (1 domestic related), 5 were making traffic stops, 4 were ambushed, 4 were attempting other arrests, 3 officers were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, 3 were performing investigative activity, 2 were handling person(s) with mental illness, 2 were drug-related matters, 1 was investigating burglary in progress/pursuing burglary suspect(s), 1 was investigating robbery in progress/pursuing robbery suspect(s), and 1 officer was involved in tactical situation.

Eleven of the 32 victim officers feloniously killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 10 in the West, 4 in the Northeast, 4 in the Northeast, 4 in the Midwest, and 3 in the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico. 28 of the 32 victim officers were killed by subjects using firearms (16 handguns, 6 rifles, and 6 firearm types not reported). 4 victim officers were intentionally killed by subjects using motor vehicles as other weapons.

17 victim officers were confirmed to be wearing body armor at time of incident. Body armor usage has not yet been reported for 12 victim officers. There have been 30 separate incidents in which these 32 victim officers have been slain. All 30 incidents have been cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

21 law enforcement officers have been accidentally killed. During the same time period in 2013, 31 officers were accidentally killed. Circumstances involving the 21 officers accidentally killed in 2014 are as follows: 13 were involved in automobile accidents, 3 victim officers were fatally struck by a vehicle, 3 were involved in motorcycle accidents, 1 was accidentally shot and 1 died from smoke inhalation. 8 of the 21 victim officers accidentally killed were employed by law enforcement agencies in the South, 8 in the West, 3 in the Northeast and 2 in the Midwest.

Incident Summaries

Cascade County Sheriff's Office (CCSO), Montana

Deputy Sheriff, Aged 33, with over 2 years law enforcement experience with agency, was fatally struck by vehicle on 08/14/2014 at 3:30 p.m. Deputy was deploying stop sticks in response to call for assistance from Montana Highway Patrol (MHP) Officers, who were engaged in high speed pursuit of subject. High speed pursuit precipitated when subject fled from MHP officer who was attempting traffic stop on subject. As deputy was deploying stop sticks, subject arrived at location, swerved, and struck victim deputy with his vehicle at an estimated speed exceeding 110 mph.

Subject was later taken into custody by Great Falls Police Department Officers. Charges against subject are pending; however, CCSO indicates subject would likely be charged with deliberate homicide, among other related charges.

Puerto Rico, Humacao

Veteran Agent, Aged 35, with nearly 16 years law enforcement experience, was shot on 08/19/2014. At approximately 2:50 p.m., two agents and sergeant were conducting confidential drug investigation at housing project. Agents were working undercover operation to identify drug points and conduct crime prevention investigations within housing projects. Upon agents arrival, subject shot and injured agents with .40 caliber handgun. Both victim agents were transported to medical center; one sustaining non-life threatening injuries while second victim agents injuries required him to be placed on life support. On 08/25/2014, agent was removed from life support and succumbed to his injuries. On 08/20/2014, initial charges were filed against subject; however, after agents death, additional charges were placed against subject.

Elmendorf Police Department (EPD), Texas

Chief of Police, Aged 64, with approximately 43 years law enforcement experience, was fatally shot on 08/23/2014. Chief conducted traffic stop after observing subject, who had outstanding warrant, operating motor vehicle. Subject had outstanding warrant stemming from spray-painting graffiti on two trucks belonging to City of Elmendorf. During traffic stop, Chief and subject got into confrontation during which Chief was shot twice in upper body. Chief was transported via helicopter to hospital where he succumbed to injuries. Subject was arrested by responding Bexar County Sheriff's Office and EPD Officers. He has been charged with capital murder of police officer and graffiti.
