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Executive Summary

This report provides statistical information on sexual assaults reported to law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin. This information is collected as part of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. Due to reporting changes in the UCR program, specifically the addition of Incident-Based Reporting (IBR), and an overall lack of staff resources, the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) has not been able to produce this report since 2005.

The assaults described and analyzed in this report are those that were reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies between January 1 and December 31, 2008. The data are submitted to OJA as part of the monthly UCR reports. As with any sensitive crime, actual number of offenses reported are not totally representative of all assaults committed. Assaults not reported to law enforcement agencies cannot be addressed in this report, even though they may be reported to other agencies such as social services or medical agencies.

This report will focus on six sexual assault offense types defined by the Wisconsin UCR program. These offense types are: Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, Assault with an Object, Forcible Fondling, Statutory Rape, and Ejaculate/Excrete upon Victim.

This report is organized into four separate sections related to different elements of sexual assaults: offenses, victim, relationships, and offenders. These sections are broken down into sub-sections which are accompanied by tables and charts highlighting the statistical analysis of these findings. In addition, detailed data tables are provided in the Appendix for further statistical information. Below are the major findings from the 2008 report on sexual assaults in Wisconsin.

- There were 4,650 sexual assaults reported in 2008, down from 5,181 in 2007.
- Forcible Fondling was the most reported sexual assault at 45%.
- The overall clearance rate for sexual assaults reported in 2008 was 58%.
- The most common location at which incidents occurred was the victim or offender residence.
- Sexual assaults were most often reported as having occurred on Fridays and Saturdays, in the months of July, August and January.
- Juveniles are nearly three times more likely than adults to be victims of sexual assault.
- The 16-20 year old age group represents the highest offending population.
- Domestic sexual assault reports have dropped steadily over the last five years.

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Overview

Report

Sexual Assaults in Wisconsin, prepared by the OJA's Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), is a collection of sexual assault data reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2008. It contains detailed information on sexual assault volume, trends, victims, relationships, and offenders.

Since the 1930's law enforcement agencies have been reporting on rape and attempted rape of females as part of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. The FBI limited its definition of rape to include "penis to vagina" penetration or attempted penetration of females. Therefore, any sex crimes that did not include vaginal penetration were excluded from the UCR program. In Wisconsin, however, the SAC began collecting data on all sexual assaults, including those previously excluded by the FBI, in January 1984 through its UCR program. A copy of the data collection form can be found in **Appendix B**.

This report will focus on six sexual assault offense types defined by the Wisconsin UCR program. These offense types are: Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, Assault with an Object, Forcible Fondling, Statutory Rape, and Ejaculate/Excrete upon Victim. These offenses are defined in **Appendix A**.

This report is organized into four separate sections related to different elements of sexual assault incidents: offenses, victim, relationships, and offenders. Each section entails a further breakdown of related aspects and demographics which are accompanied by tables and charts outlining the statistical analysis of these findings. The offense section encompasses the volumes and trends of specific sexual assaults, clearance rates, location type, weapons, unfounded cases, and information on assault and report dates. The victim section includes specific demographic information and trends of juvenile and adult victim rates. The relationship section is comprised of victim-offender relationships and domestic versus non-domestic offense analyses, while the offender section includes general offender demographics and information on juvenile versus adult offenders. In addition, detailed data tables are provided in the Appendix for further statistical information.

Overview

Data

The assaults described and analyzed in this report are those reported to law enforcement agencies for the period of January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008. The data are submitted to the SAC as part of the monthly UCR report of law enforcement agencies.

The data used for this report were extracted from two separate UCR data systems. The first system, the Wisconsin Summary-Based Reporting system (SBR), collects data through the Wisconsin Sexual Assault Reporting Form, which is reproduced in **Appendix B**. The second, the Wisconsin Incident-Based Reporting system (IBR), collects data electronically through monthly incident reports submitted by law enforcement. Although two separate UCR data systems are used, both SBR and IBR are similar in the way sexual assault data are collected.

In this report an incident is defined as one assault against one victim. A series of assaults against one person which constitutes one “clear and distinct criminal operation” is counted as one offense. An example of an ongoing incident is where an assault situation is repeated over several months or years against the same victim.

As with any sensitive crime, actual reports of offenses to law enforcement agencies are not totally representative of all assaults committed. Assaults not reported to law enforcement agencies cannot be addressed in this report, even though they may be reported to other agencies such as social services or medical agencies.

The data contained in the report focus on all reported cases, regardless of the eventual disposition of the cases by the law enforcement agency or the court. The factual accuracy of these reported assaults and the circumstances surrounding them have, in a legal sense, not been substantiated.

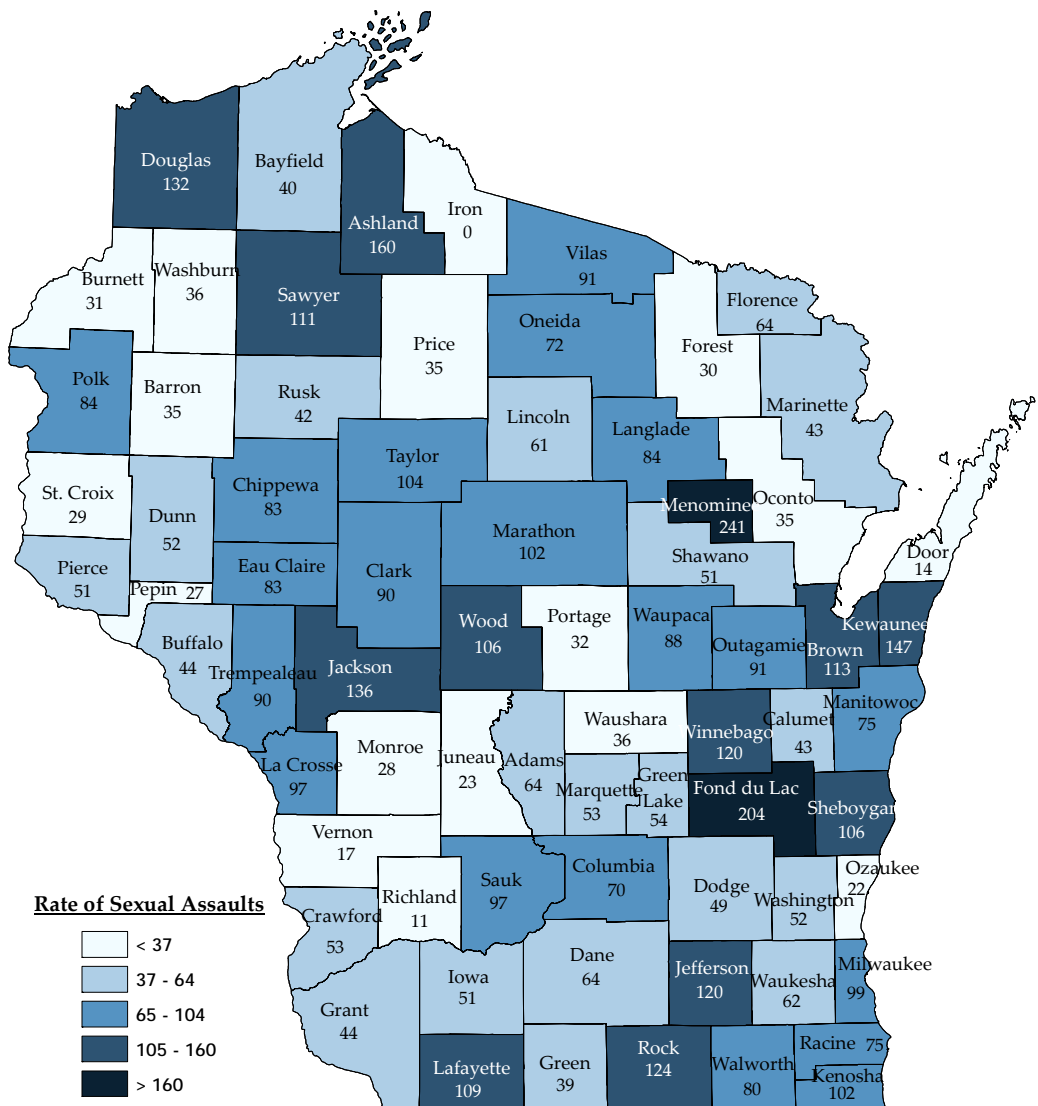

Major Findings

Offenses

- Nearly half of all sexual assaults reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2008 were Forcible Fondling incidents.
- 10% of sexual assaults were deemed unfounded by law enforcement agencies.
- Weapons were used in less than 5% of sexual assault incidents in 2008.
- Roughly half of all sexual assaults committed were reported within one day of the incident.
- Often, the month and day that the sexual assault had taken place were reported as “unknown”.

Victims

- A five year trend shows juveniles had been the highest victimized age group; juveniles under the age of 15 represented nearly half of all victims in 2008.
- The vast majority of sexual assault victims sustained no physical injury.
- Females represented nearly 90% of sexual assault victims.

Relationships

- In over half of all reported sexual assaults, the offender was a non-family member who was known by the victim.
- There has been a steady decrease in reported domestic sexual assaults from 2004 through 2008.
- The most common offense in domestic cases was Forcible Fondling.

Offenders

- Over two-thirds of sexual assault offenders were between the ages of 11 and 30 years old.
- Adults consistently commit the most sexual assaults, while the rate of juvenile offenders had dropped since 2004.
- More than 90% of sexual assailants in Wisconsin were male.
- In the vast majority of sexual assaults, offenders and victims were of the same race.

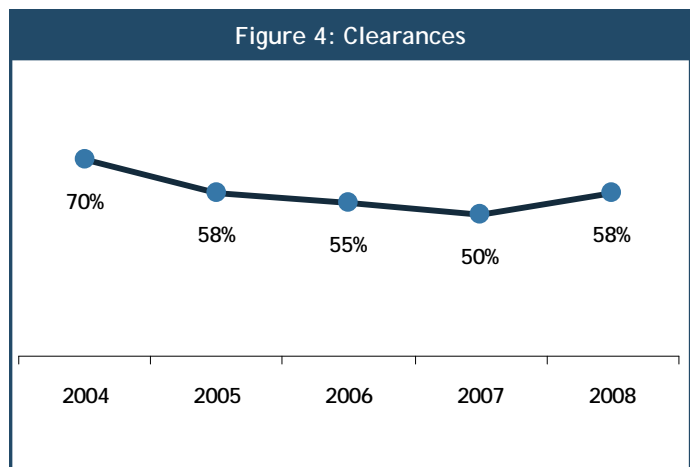
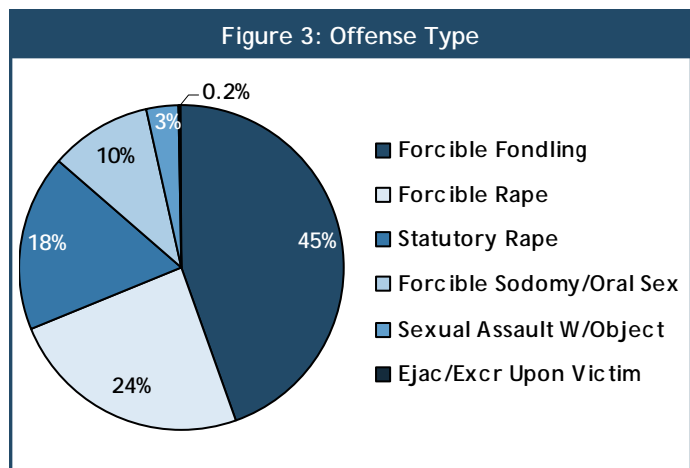
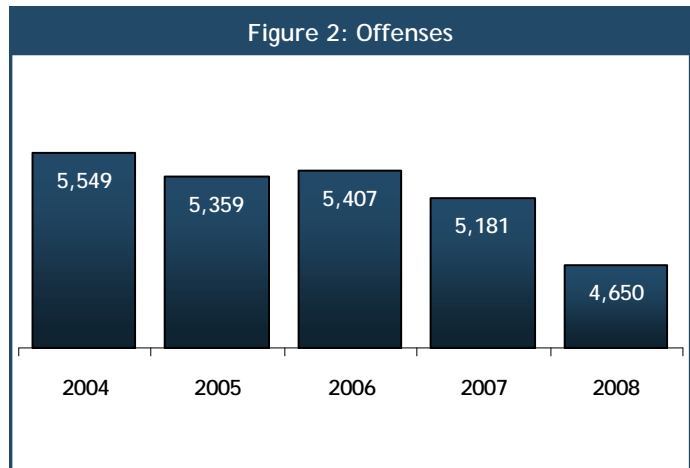
A five-year comparison of sexual assault trends in Wisconsin shows a dramatic reduction from 2004 to 2008 of nearly 900 fewer reported crimes (from 5,547 to 4,650, respectively). This reduction is consistent across all offense categories with the exception of Sexual Assault with an Object, which rose in 2007 (187) but fell again in 2008 (143), as seen in **Appendix C**. The rate of Forcible Fondling had steadily decreased throughout the last five years (by approximately 600 reports since 2004), while the rate of Forcible Rape spiked in 2006 (to 1,239) but dropped in 2008 (to 1,113).

Offense Types

Figure 3 reveals that the most often reported incident type was Forcible Fondling, which made up nearly half (45%) of all the reported sexual assaults in Wisconsin in 2008. The second highest reported sexual assault offense was Forcible Rape, followed by Statutory Rape and Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex (24%, 18% and 10%, respectively). The least often reported offenses were Sexual Assault with an Object (3%) and Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim (0.2%).

Clearances

The rate of sexual assault clearances by arrest had remained moderately consistent over the five-year period with the average clearance rate at 60%. The clearance rate for cases was highest in 2004 (70%), dropped by nearly 20% between 2005 and 2007, but rose back up to 58% in 2008. As seen in **Appendix C**, in 2008, Statutory Rape was the offense category with the highest clearance rate (63%), while Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim had the lowest (50%).



Offenses

Unfounded Cases

Ten percent of sexual assaults reported in Wisconsin were “unfounded”, which parallels the national average for unfounded cases. Those incidents most often determined to be unfounded were Forcible Fondling (235), followed by Forcible Rape (126). Statutory Rape and Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex cases were unfounded much less frequently (38 and 21 cases, respectively). Although the frequency of unfounded cases was highest for reports of Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim (20%), this was the least reported offense (10 reports).

Weapons

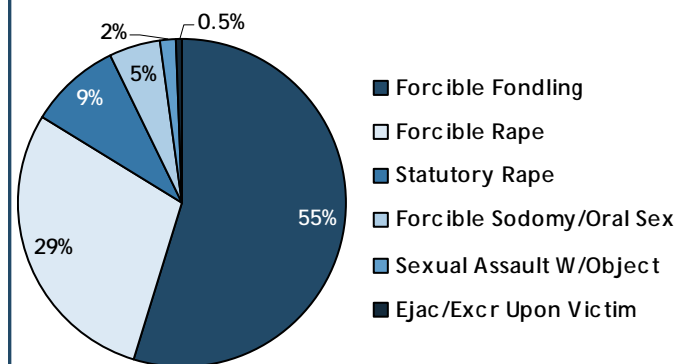


Figure 6: Weapons

Weapons were used in 952 of the 4,650 reported sexual assaults in 2008. As shown in Figure 6, the weapons most often reported were personal weapons such as hands/fists/feet (72%). The second largest weapon category, “other”, includes drugs, poison, blunt objects, and additional items. Seven percent of cases were cited as having an unknown weapon involved. Together, firearms and cutting instruments represent less than 10% of weapons used in these sexual assault cases.

Location

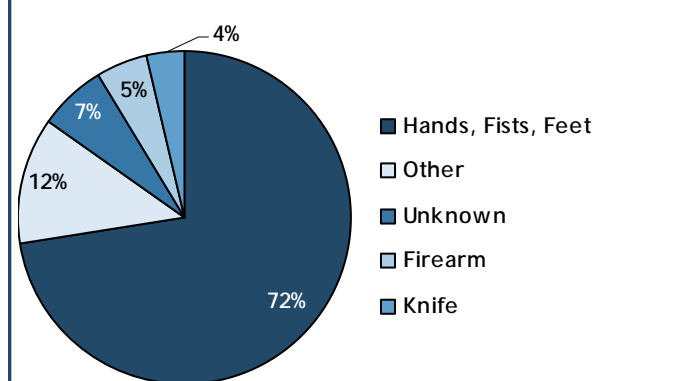
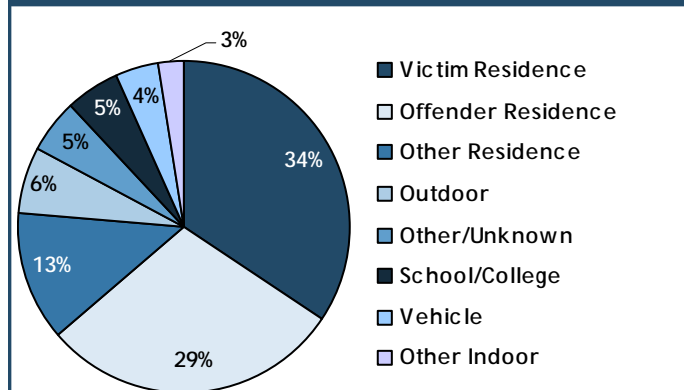


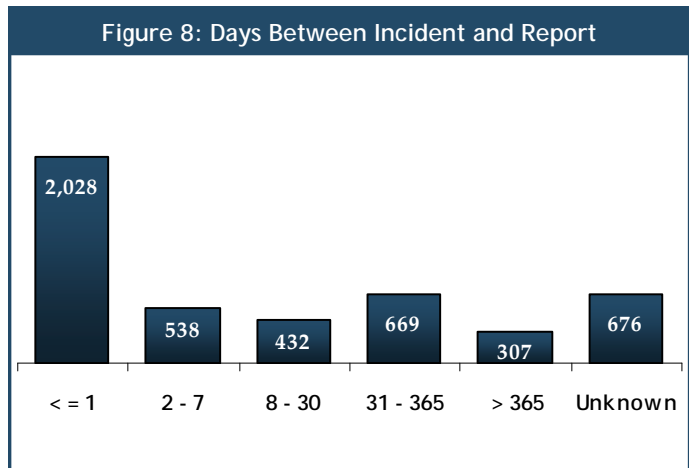
Figure 7: Location

Figure 7 provides a breakdown of sexual assault offenses by location type. The victim residence and the offender residence are overwhelmingly the most often identified location type, accounting for nearly two-thirds of the reported locations (34% and 29%, respectively). The least cited locations include school/college (5%), vehicle (4%) and “other” indoor (3%). Church/Synagogue/Temple was the least likely location to be the cite of a sexual assault. Additional information on location by offense type can be found in **Appendix C**.

Figure 5: Unfounded Cases

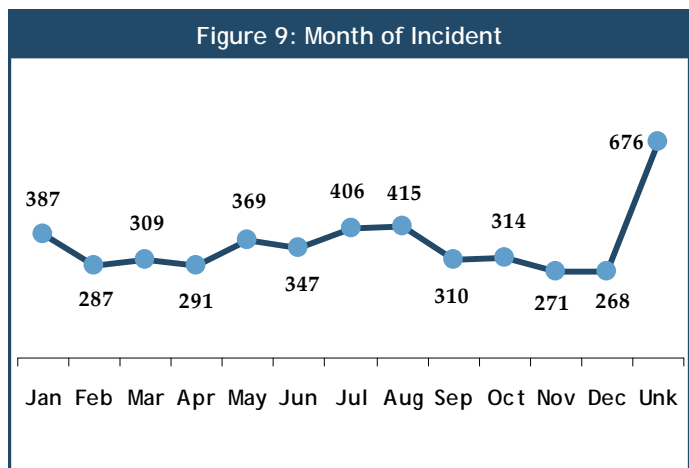
Time Between Incident and Report

Figure 8 displays the period of time between the date a sexual assault occurred and when it was reported to law enforcement. As shown, the vast majority of sexual assaults were reported within one day of the incident. Of those reported within one day of the incident, 58% were cleared by arrest. However, the highest clearance rate is represented by reports made between 8 and 30 days of the assault (63%). Although, this category only entails only 9% of reported cases. The lowest clearances rate is for cases reported over a year after the crime. For a more detailed look at the length of time between the incident date and the report date, and the clearance rate by arrest for these incidents see **Appendix C**.



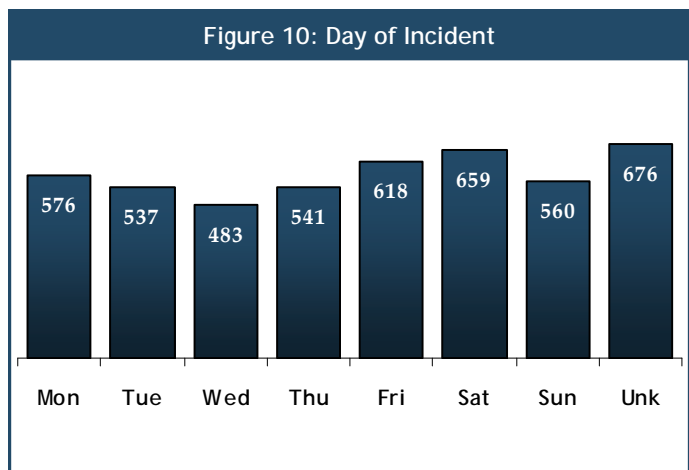
Month of Incident

Unfortunately, the month in which the greatest number of sexual assaults occurred was unknown (15%). Of those incidents in which a month was known, the trend shows that most occurred in the summertime. July and August had the highest rates of incidents (both at 9%), while December had the lowest.



Day of Incident

As with the reported month of incident, the day of the week that sexual assaults occurred was most often unknown (15%). Friday and Saturday had the highest report rates (13% and 14%, respectively), while Wednesday had the lowest rate (10%).



Victims

Adults vs. Juveniles

Figure 11 provides a five-year trend of victims by age category. Between 2004 and 2008, juveniles consistently represented the highest number of victims; nearly three-quarters. During this time period, the percentage of juvenile victims decreased slightly as the percentage of adult victims increased slightly.

Age of Victims

Victims below the age of 21 represented over 80% of sexual assault victims in 2008. Juveniles in the 11-15 year old category accounted for 41% of reported victims. The next most prevalent age groups were 16-20, followed by 6-10 (17% and 14%, respectively). The least often victimized age groups were 41-50 and over 50, which, combined, account for 4% of victims. Victims in the 16-20 age group had the highest rate of Forcible Rape. While victims in the 11-15 year age group were most often victim of Statutory Rape. For additional information on victim age by offense type please see **Appendix C**.

Sex of Victims

Over 85% of all sexual assault victims in reported incidents in 2008 were identified as female. Females were most often victims of Forcible Fondling and Forcible Rape (1,745 and 1,11, respectively). While Forcible Fondling and Forcible Sodomy/Oral Sex were the two highest offense types for male victims (327 and 191, respectively). For more information on this topic see **Appendix C**.

Figure 11: Adults vs. Juveniles

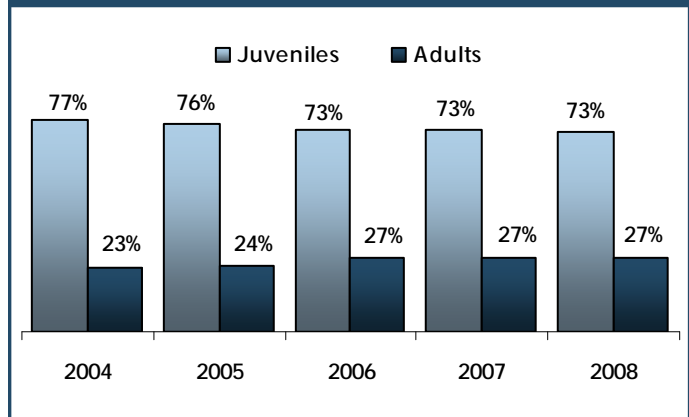


Figure 12: Age of Victims

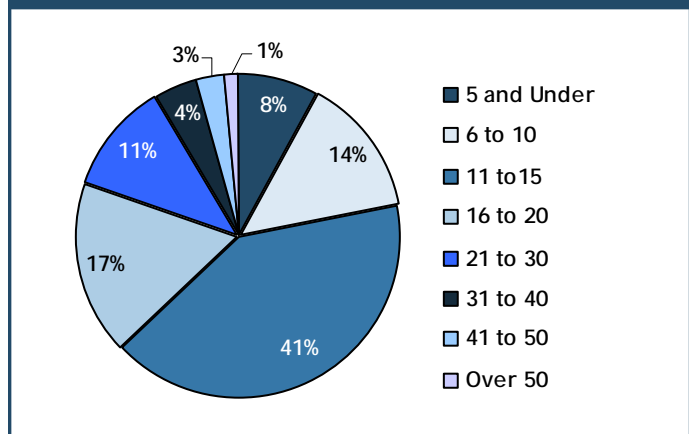
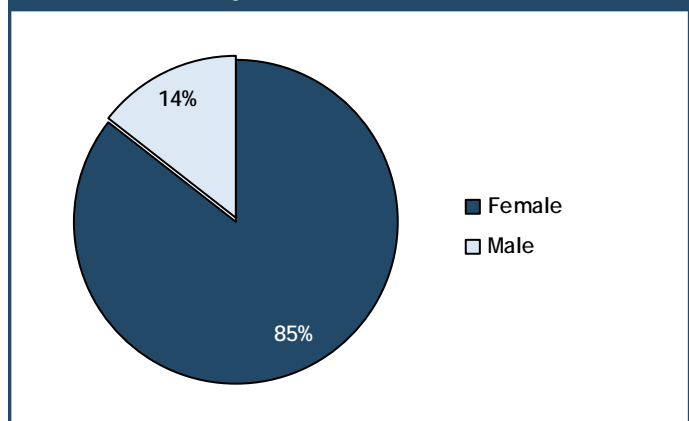


Figure 13: Sex of Victims



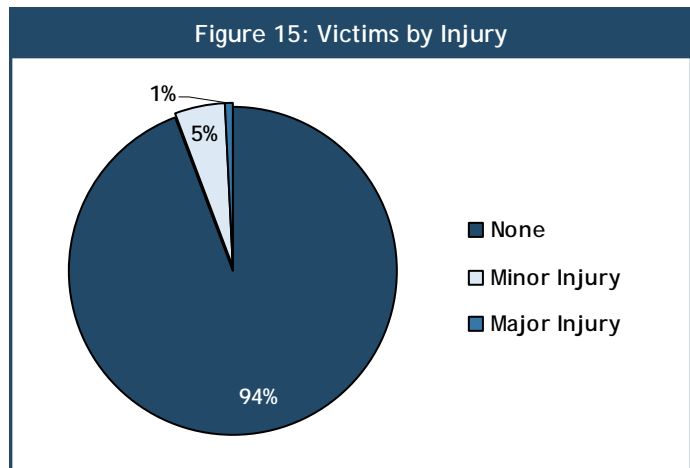
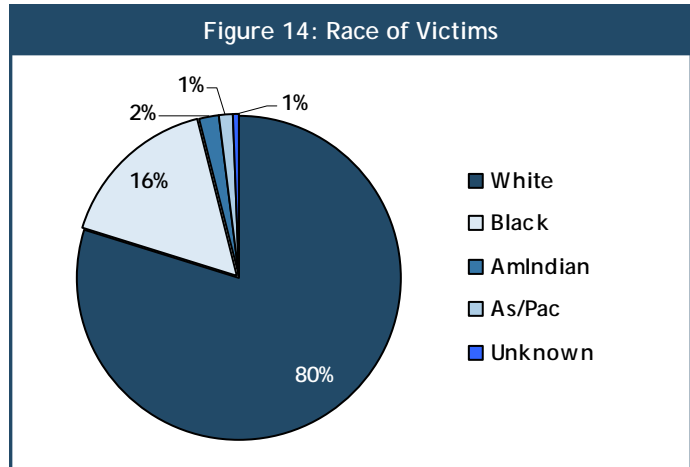
Victims

Race of Victims

Nearly 80% of victims were identified as White in the 2008 Wisconsin sexual assault reports. As Figure 14 shows, the next most victimized racial groups were Black and American Indian (16%, 2%, respectively). The racial group least often cited as victims of sexual assault was Asian/Pacific Islander (1%). One percent of all victims were racially identified as “unknown”.

Victims by Injury

The vast majority of sexual assault reports made to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2008 identified that victims had not sustained any physical injury (94%). Of the 4,650 incidents, 223 victims reported minor injuries (5%). The remaining 45 incidents (or 1%) resulted in major injuries, including apparent broken bones, possible internal injuries and severe laceration. The offense type that resulted in the most injuries was Forcible Rape (161), followed by Forcible Fondling (62). For a more detailed look at the victim injuries by offense type see **Appendix C**.

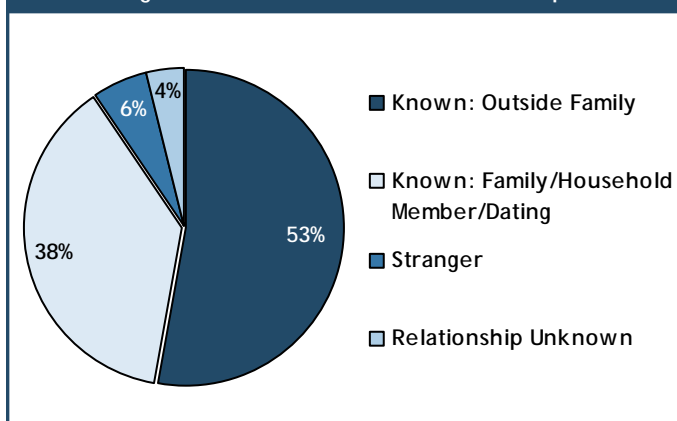


Relationships

Victim-Offender Relationships

Over 90% of sexual assaults in 2008 were committed by someone known to the offender (not including instances where the relationship was “unknown”). The most common victim-offender relationship was non-family, which includes victim acquaintances, friends, neighbors and babysitters among other relations. This group accounts for 53% of relationships. Family/household members/dating partners was the next highest offending relationship group, which accounted for 38%. Fewer than 6% of reported sexual assault incidents were committed by a stranger.

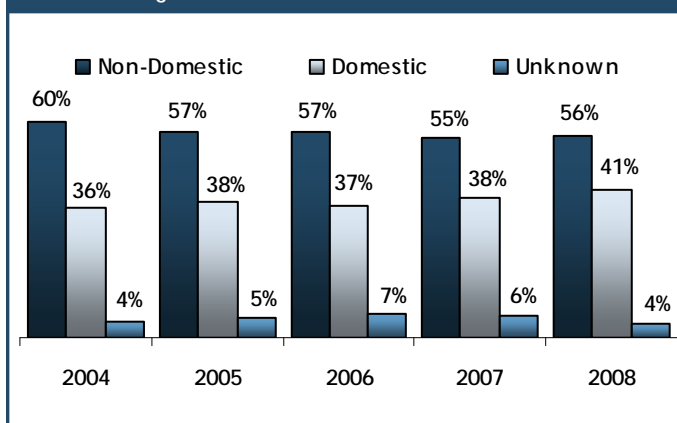
Figure 16: Victim Offender Relationships



Domestic vs. Non-Domestic

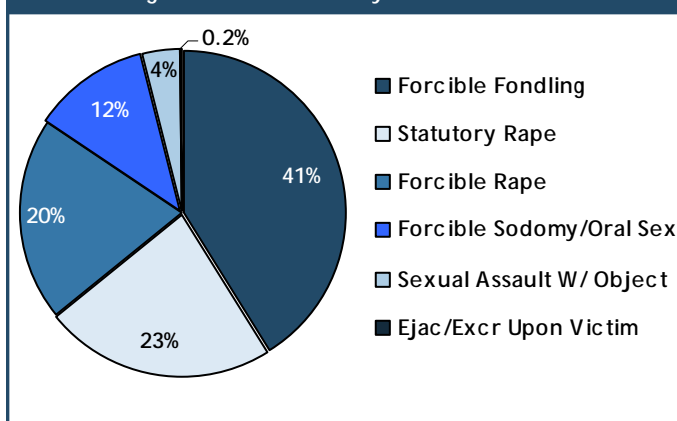
Figure 17: Domestic vs. Non-Domestic

Figure 17 shows a five-year trend in domestic versus non-domestic incidents. Overall, the trend remained fairly steady. The percentage of non-domestic incidents decreased slightly over the five year span, while the percentage of domestic incidents increased slightly. The majority of offenses during this time period were reported as non-domestic in nature. As shown in **Appendix C**, Boyfriend/Girlfriend is the highest offending Known Family/House Member/Dating subcategory, offending most often by statutory rape (366). While Acquaintances, included in the Known: Outside Family category, commit the most Forcible Rape and Forcible Fondling (376 and 573, respectively).

Domestic Offenses in 2008

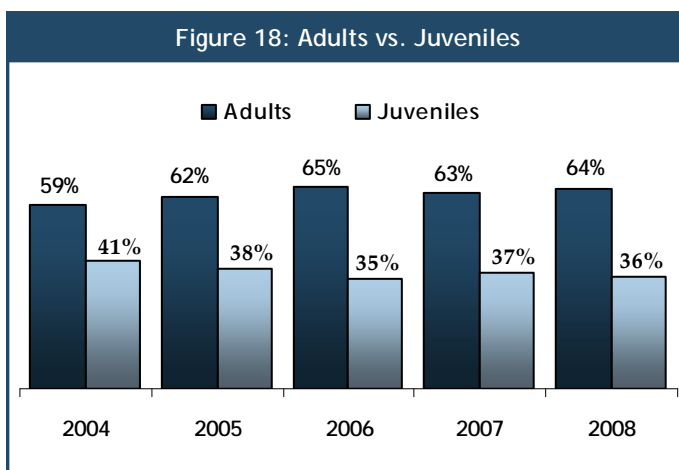
Figure 18: Domestic by Offense in 2008

Of all reported domestic sexual assaults in 2008, Forcible Fondling was the most reported offense (41%). In Figure 18, the least reported domestic sexual assault was Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim with a 0.2 % report rate. Forcible Rape made up 20% of domestic cases.

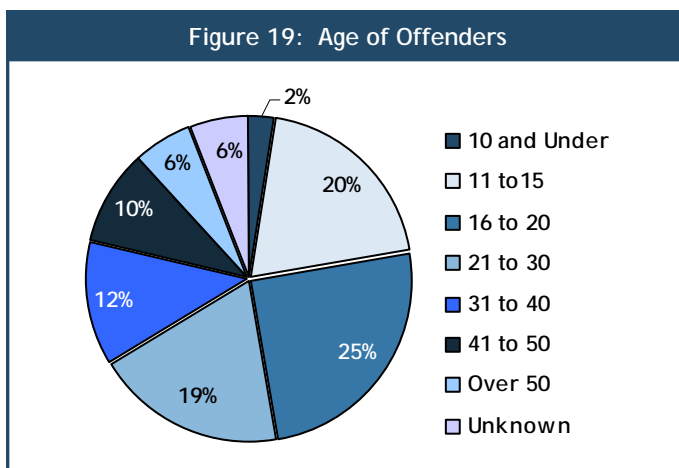
Offenders

Figure 18 shows that the population of adult and juvenile offenders has remained fairly consistent over the past five years. The juvenile offender population was highest in 2004 at 41%, then steadily dropped until 2007 when it increased slightly. The adult offender population was 59% in 2004 then increased over the next two years, eventually leveling out in 2007 and 2008.



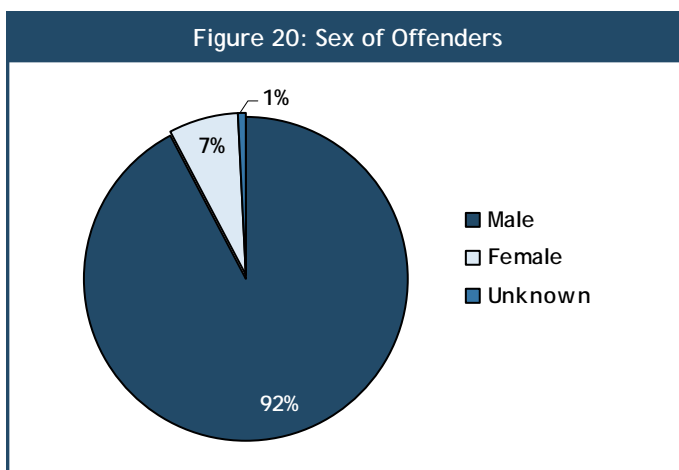
Age of Offenders

Nearly two-thirds of sexual assault offenders were between the ages of 11 and 30 years old. The age group with the highest rate of sexual assaults was adults 16-20 years, which represented 25% of reported offenders. Although the 10 and under age group made up 22% of victims, the group composed less than 3% of offenders. And while juveniles age 11-15 years represented the largest victimized group (41%), they offended at a much lower rate (20%). As shown in **Appendix C**, offenders aged 21-30 commit the highest rate of Forcible Rape (329), while Forcible Fondling is committed most often by the 11-15 year age group (518).



Sex of Offenders

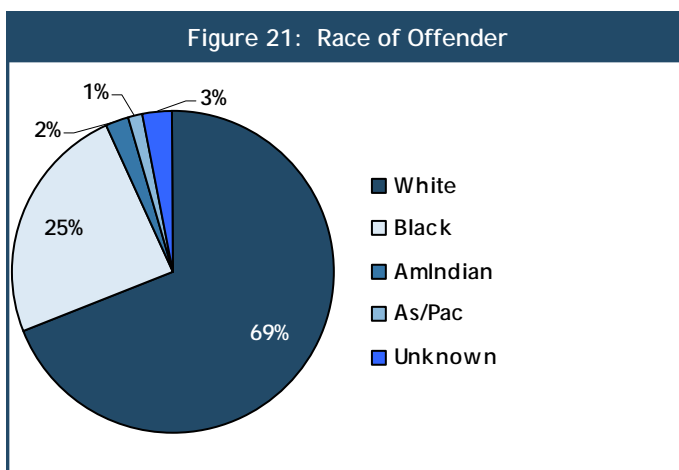
Just over 92 % of sexual assault offenders as reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2008 were identified as males. The chart in Figure 20 reveals that in 0.7 % of incidents the sex of the offender was “unknown”. As shown in **Appendix C**, Statutory Rape (153) and Forcible Fondling (150) are the highest reported offenses by female offenders. Male offenders most often commit Forcible Fondling and Forcible Rape (2,035 and 1,220, respectively).



Offenders

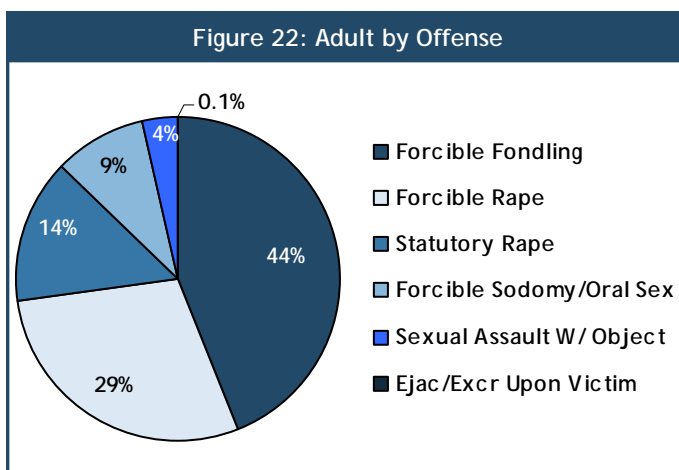
Race of Offenders

As shown in Figure 21, over two-thirds of reported sexual assaults were committed by White offenders (69%). The second most cited racial group of offenders was Black, followed distantly by “unknown” (25% and 3%, respectively). The racial category least reported as committing sexual assaults was Asian/Pacific Islanders, which represented 2% of all offenders in 2008. As shown in **Appendix C**, 3,309 White offenders committed acts against White victims, while 751 Black offenders committed sexual assaults against Black victims.



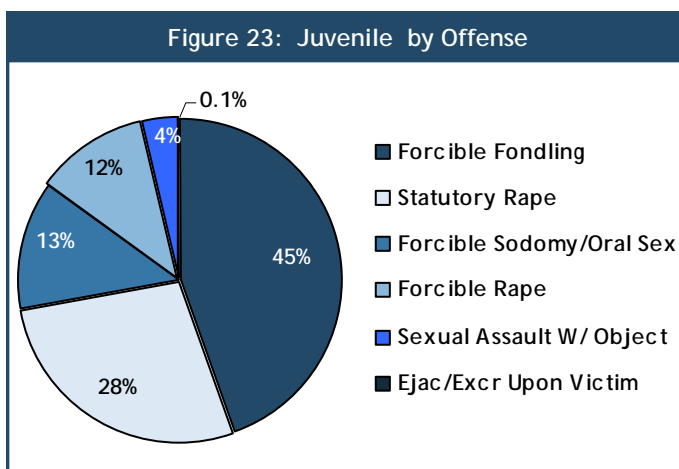
Adults by Offense Type

The most common sexual assault committed by known adult offenders, classified as age 18 years old and over, was Forcible Fondling (44%). The second most common type of sexual assault committed by know adult offenders was Forcible Rape (29%), followed by Statutory Rape (14%). The least common offense committed by adult sex offenders was Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim (0.1 %).



Juveniles by Offense Type

Juveniles (aged 0-17 years old) committed sexual assaults at a higher rate than adults in nearly all categories, with the exception of Forcible Rape and Sexual Assault with an Object. Of known juvenile offenders, 12% were reported as committing Forcible Rape. The most often cited sexual assaults for juveniles were Forcible Fondling (45%) and Statutory Rape (28%). The least often offense committed by known juvenile offenders was Ejaculation/Excretion upon Victim (0.2 %).





APPENDIX

Appendix A: Definitions

Sexual Assault Definitions

Sexual assaults encompass a wide range of incidents, from violent rapes to less physically injurious sexual contact. While the nature of victim impact connected to an assault is related to a number of factors, such as the extent of the victim's trauma, physical injuries, and so forth, these are not always easily measured. The nature of victim impact connected to the assault is also defined, to some degree, by the six offense categories utilized in the Uniform Crime Reporting - Incident-Based Reporting system, as defined below:

- **Forcible Rape:** The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Note: If force was used or threatened, the crime should be classified as Forcible Rape regardless of the age of the victim. If no force was used or threatened and the victim was under the statutory age of consent, the crime should be classified as Statutory Rape.

- **Forcible Sodomy:** Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
- **Sexual Assault with an Object:** The use of an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person forcibly and/or against that person's will, or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Note: An "object" or "instrument" is anything used by the offender other than the offender's genitalia. Examples include a finger, bottle, handgun, stick, etc.

- **Forcible Fondling:** The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that person's will, or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Note: Forcible Fondling includes "Indecent Liberties" and "Child Molesting." Although "force" may not have been used, offenses may fall into this category because the victim was incapable of giving consent, or did not give consent.

- **Statutory Rape:** Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent. In Wisconsin no unmarried juvenile can give consent to sexual intercourse. Only when the victim is under 16 years of age is intercourse defined as a sexual assault.

Note: Both parties would be offenders and victims in an assault if they are both under age 16.

- **Ejaculate/Excrete Upon Victim:** Intentional penile ejaculation or the emission of urine or feces by the offender upon any part of the body of the victim, for the purpose of sexually degrading or sexually humiliating the victim or for the purpose of sexually arousing or gratifying the offender.

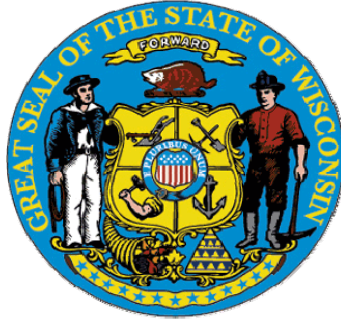
